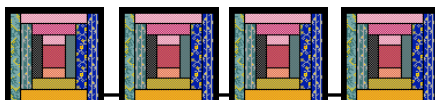

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Our guild is committed to community service and asks that each member supports that commitment in one of the following ways , annually:

- one children's oncology quilt (42" by 44" or 42" by 54") - donated to Lehigh Valley Hospital Muhlenberg
- two preemie quilts (18" by 25") - donated to Sacred Heart Hospital and St. Luke's Hospital
- two mastectomy pillows and bags - donated to Lehigh Valley Hospital Cedar Crest
- four teddy bears or cats - donated to St. Luke's Hospital Emergency Department
- one wounded soldier quilt (55" by 65" minimum donated to Quilts of Valor Foundation (<http://www.qov.org>))

Looking for a longarm quilter? Lois Walters, a member of Colonial Quilters, will provide the batting and quilt your Quilt of Valor on her longarm machine. Check the directory in the Member's Only section on our website.

- one Visiting Nurses Association (VNA) of St. Luke's Hospice quilt (63" x 93")
- two VNA of St. Luke's Hospice pillowcases
- one VNA of St. Luke's Hospice nightgown
- NICU covers for incubators (48" x 55" finished size)

NICU covers are easy to make -- one children's panel with a contrasting border to create the right size, or you can use 1-1/4 yard of a children's print and add borders to create the needed size. Please use a light color fabric for the back. Simple quilting -- can use diagonal quilting one or both ways. Add a binding and it is done!



From now on, please sew your own label on your Oncology Quilts - "Made and Donated by Colonial Quilters Guild 2012". You may also attach your own label to the Hospice and Wounded Soldiers quilts, using your name if desired. Thank you.

Did you know...1 in 3 women are now being diagnosed with Breast Cancer. That has changed from 1 in 8! Also the age groups are showing younger women between 40 and 50. The need for Mastectomy Bags has caused Rose and I to plan for a Community Service Day in the fall. We ask your help by donating good quality, cheerful fabric so we can prepare kits for you to sew.....1/2 yard each for the bag and lining and a little extra for the pillows. For the bags you need two pieces of fabric measuring 7 and 1/4 by 11 and 1/4. We will supply the stuffing.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

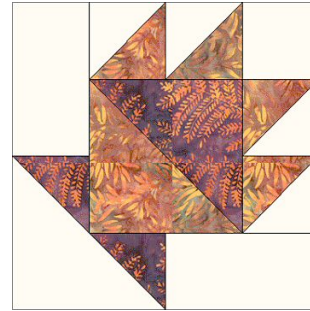

Thank you for all those who participated in the Block of the Month Challenge Block. We collected over 110 blocks. Be sure to come to the April meeting to see what original designs were made.

Lusty May Basket



May

Tips & Hints

The background is Bleached Muslin and the basket is at least two contrasting batiks. You may use more if you like.

Cutting directions:

Number Size Fabric

- 2 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Bleached Muslin
- 1 6 7/8" x 6 7/8" Bleached Muslin
- 2 4" x 4" Bleached Muslin
- 1 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" Bleached Muslin
- 1 3 7/8" x 3 7/8" Batik 1
- 1 7" x 7" Batik 1
- 2 4" x 4" Batik 2
- 1 7" x 7" Batik 2

Cut a batik 3 7/8" x 3 7/8" square in half diagonally to make two triangles. Sew each triangle to the end of each 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangle, reversing the placement for the second one. (See block graphic for correct placement.) Press toward the batik triangle or open if you prefer. Make four 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" half square triangles using your favorite method. Here's how I make mine. Place the 4" x 4" batik and Bleached Muslin squares together and draw a line diagonally from corner to corner on the Bleached Muslin square. (If your batik has an obvious right side, be sure it's facing the Bleached Muslin square.) Sew a scant quarter inch seam on each side of the line and cut on the line. Press each unit toward the batik triangle (or open if you prefer). Trim each unit to 3 1/2" x 3 1/2". The seam should run from corner to opposite corner. You will have four of these units for the block. Repeat these instructions using the two batik 7" x 7" squares. Trim to 6 1/2" x 6 1/2".

Sew two sets of two 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" half square triangle units together. The resulting units will have the points of the triangles going in the opposite directions. See block graphic above for correct placement. Sew a Bleached Muslin square to one side of one of the previous units. Press toward the Bleached Muslin square. Sew the set of two half square triangle units to one side of the upper triangle of the large batik half square triangle unit. Press toward the large batik unit. Sew the other set of half square triangle units (with the square) to the adjacent side of the large batik unit. Press toward the large batik units. See the block graphic for correct placement.

Sew a rectangle unit to each of the sides of the lower sides of the previous unit. Press toward the rectangle units. Cut the 6 7/8" x 6 7/8" square in half diagonally. There is one extra piece. Sew the remaining Bleached Muslin triangle to the bottom of the two batik triangles that form the base of the basket. Sew this seam carefully, as it is on the bias. Press toward the Bleached Muslin triangle.

A few notes to what was suggested about the Wounded Warriors Project and the Disabled American Vets, there is no local chapter for the Wounded Warriors Project. The Disabled American Veterans is handled by the county in which the veteran is residing. There will be additional discussion at the April meeting to answer any concerns before we vote in May.

Jenn's House: Emmaus & Fountain Hill locations <http://jennshouse.org/>

Jenn's House provides a special "home away from home" for families and patients who live in or travel to the Lehigh Valley area for medical, surgical, diagnostic, outpatient & emergency services or doctor's visits in any one of the hospitals or health care facilities in our area. We offer two convenient locations in the Lehigh Valley: one in Emmaus and the other in Fountain Hill (Bethlehem) Pennsylvania. Privately owned and operated through a Board of Directors, Jenn's House is furnished and operated through fundraising efforts, donations and grants. We are proud to say we are the first and only Hospital Hospitality House in the Lehigh Valley. Jenn's House is a 501 (C)(3) not for profit corporation and is a member of the National Association of Hospital Hospitality Houses Incorporated, "Homes That Help And Heal.

Animals in Distress: Coopersburg <http://www.animalsindistress-pa.org/>

Animals in Distress is a non-profit, tax deductible sanctuary for animals who have little or no hope elsewhere. Its programs are designed to prevent suffering and to save lives. We believe that there is a special home somewhere for every pet if there is enough time to find it. We keep every animal admitted, providing medical care, behavioral rehabilitation, good food, shelter, and, most important of all, love, until a suitable new home can be found. No animal is killed because it is unwanted, too old, or injured. All donations are used for animal care expenses, since no one is paid for administrative, fund raising, and other non-animal care duties that are performed by a dedicated group of unpaid volunteers.

Second Harvest Food Bank: Located in Allentown serves the entire LV. <http://www.shfbly.org>

Second Harvest Food Bank began its mission to end hunger in October of 1982 as the Lehigh Valley Food Bank, a program of the Community Action Committee of the Lehigh Valley, Inc. (CACLV). The Food Bank did not have a permanent location at the beginning. Initially, distributions were made from the back of a rented truck and then Bethlehem Steel Corporation donated warehouse space that was used for nearly four years. In 1986, thanks to the generosity of the local community, we were able to purchase a 7,600 square foot warehouse at 1138 North Godfrey Street in Allentown. The Food Bank remained there for seven years before moving to a new warehouse more than twice the size of the old one. That building, located at 2045 Harvest Way in Allentown, is where the Food Bank currently operates.
