I hope you will think about going on the bus trip to the Lancaster Quilt Show on March 16<sup>th</sup>. Sign up with Boots at the February Meeting!


I am still looking for two people to chair our quilt show for 2013-1014.

- two preemie quilts (18" by 25") donated to Sacred Heart Hospital and St. Luke's Hospital
- two mastectomy pillows and bags donated to Lehigh Valley Hospital Cedar Crest
- four teddy bears or cats donated to St. Luke's Hospital Emergency Department
- one wounded soldier quilt (55" by 65"minimum donated to Quilts of Valor Foundation (http://www.qov.org)

Looking for a longarm quilter? Lois Walters, a member of Colonial Quilters, will provide the batting and quilt your Quilt of Valor on her longarm machine. Check the directory in the Member's Only section on our website.

- one Visiting Nurses Association (VNA) of St. Luke's Hospice quilt (63" x 93")
- two VNA of St. Luke's Hospice pillowcases
- one VNA of St. Luke's Hospice nightgown
- NICU covers for incubators (48" x 55" finished size)

NICU covers are easy to make -- one children's panel with a contrasting border to create the right size, or you can use 1-1/4 yard of a children's print and add borders to create the needed size. PLease use a light color fabric for the back. Simple quilting -- can use diagonal quilting one or both ways. Add a binding and it is done!


# BLOCK OF THE MONTH

**Block of the Month Challenge** Construct a 14" block from 1-1/2", 2" or 2-1/2" strips of random fabrics. # **Irish Eyes**

# **Tips & Hints**

Our March friendship block with an Irish Chain feel. We are using dark and light green print fabrics.


Number	Size	Fabric
1	4 1/2" x 4 1/2"	Bleached Muslin
16	2 1/2" x 2 1/2"	Bleached Muslin
6	2 1/2" x 2 1/2"	Light Green Print
10	2 1/2" x 2 1/2"	Dark Green Print

You may do this block by sewing little squares of Bleached Muslin and green together or by cutting 2 1/2" strips of Bleached Muslin and green print and sewing the strips together, pressing toward the green and then sub-cutting into 2 1/2" units.

Once you have your sets of Bleached Muslin and green, sew a light green and muslin unit to another one, like a checkerboard. Press the seam to one side, or open, whichever you prefer. Make one more for the first block. Using the dark green and Bleached Muslin units, sew two together, like a checkerboard. Make another three for the block. Sew a dark green and Bleached Muslin unit to a light green and Bleached Muslin unit, as before.

Lay your small four-patch units from the previous step in rows, matching the block graphic above. Sew a light green and Bleached Muslin unit on the left side of a dark green and Bleached Muslin unit and a dark green-light green Bleached Muslin unit to the right side. This is the first row. For the second row, sew a dark green and Bleached Muslin unit to the sides of the Bleached Muslin 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" square. Press toward the square. For the third row repeat the instructions for the first row, but you will rotate it so the light green square is in the lower left corner. See block graphic above for correct placement. Sew the three rows together.
