- one wounded soldier quilt (55" by 65"minimum donated to Quilts of Valor Foundation (http://www.qov.org)

- one VNA of St. Luke's Hospice nightgown
- NICU covers for incubators (48" x 55" finished size)

NICU covers are easy to make — one children's panel with a contrasting border to create the right size, or you can use 1-1/4 yard of a children's print and add borders to create the needed size. PLease use a light color fabric for the back. Simple quilting — can use diagonal quilting one or both ways. Add a binding and it is done!



From now on, please sew your own label on your Oncology Quilts - "Made and Donated by Colonial Quilters Guild 2012". You may also attach your own label to the Hospice and Wounded Soldiers quilts, using your name if desired. Thank you.

APPLE CRANBERRY COBBLER RECIPE

You can watch a video clip (which I did just now & not before making this).

Few items on how I made it that were different than the video: I mixed the sugars, spices & cornstarch together with a fork so the spices were evenly distributed before adding to the apples & cranberries. Same for the topping - I mixed the dry ingredients before adding the milk. Brown sugar is measured packed (recipe doesn't specify). This is the way I learned to bake -- mix the dry together thoroughly before adding to the wet.

Recipe called for a 9-inch pie dish & next time I would use a 9x9 dish instead (see the correction in the 2nd link - I used the recipe from the Parade Magazine). The topping did overflow & stick to the sides of my pie plate. I put the pie plate on a cookie sheet lined with aluminum foil to catch the drips.

I baked longer than 1 hour -- at that time, it didn't seem the crust was completely cooked (at 350). So I baked for another 30 mins. Next time I may raise the temp to 375. I put aluminum foil over the top, but it still got very brown & doesn't match the picture - but it didn't seem to hurt the taste!

It was pretty easy!

ASIAN SALAD RECIPE

Ramen noodles (1 pkg chicken flavor) - take out the flavor packet and save for the sugar, vinegar and oil mixture listed below. Follow directions for cooking noodles.

Asian Slaw (12-16 oz) - I use one bag of the prepackaged coleslaw

Heat the following till dissolved:
1/3 cup sugar
1/4 cup white vinegar
1/2 cup oil
Add noodle flavor packet from the ramen noodles

Pour the liquid over the noodles and slaw and then add:

Toasted Almond Slivers - 1/2 cup Sesame Seeds - 1 teaspoon

Mix well and serve cold or refrigerate over night

ROASTED BUTTERNUT SQUASH SALAD WITH WARM CIDER VINAIGRETTE

Ingredients

- 1 (1 1/2-pound) butternut squash, peeled and 3/4-inch) diced
- Good olive oil
- 1 tablespoon pure maple syrup
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 3 tablespoons dried cranberries
- 3/4 cup apple cider or apple juice
- 2 tablespoons cider vinegar
- 2 tablespoons minced shallots
- 2 teaspoons Dijon mustard
- 4 ounces baby arugula, washed and spun dry
- 1/2 cup walnuts halves, toasted
- 3/4 cup freshly grated Parmesan

Directions

Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F.

Place the butternut squash on a sheet pan. Add 2 tablespoons olive oil, the maple syrup, 1 teaspoon salt and 1/2 teaspoon pepper and toss. Roast the squash for 15 to 20 minutes, turning once, until tender. Add the cranberries to the pan for the last 5 minutes.

While the squash is roasting, combine the apple cider, vinegar, and shallots in a small saucepan and bring to a boil over medium-high heat. Cook for 6 to 8 minutes, until the cider is reduced to about 1/4 cup. Off the heat, whisk in the mustard, 1/2 cup olive oil, 1 teaspoon salt, and 1/2 teaspoon of pepper. Place the arugula in a large salad bowl and add the roasted squash mixture, the walnuts, and the grated Parmesan. Spoon just enough vinaigrette over the salad to moisten and toss well. Sprinkle with salt and pepper and serve immediately.

BROCCOLI RICE CASSEROLE RECIPE

2 C. minute rice uncooked

2 boxes frozen chopped broccoli (thawed and squeezed) OR

(I used fresh, cooked broccoli, one large head or more if you like)

½ stick melted butter

3/4C chopped celery

3/4C chopped onion

1 can cream of chicken soup(undiluted)

1 can cream of mushroom soup(undiluted)

Mix all ingredients together and place in a 9 x 12 greased baking dish. Dot the top with Cheeze Whiz.

Bake 350 for 45-50 minutes.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH



February Block of the Month



We are making this block in Red and white Valentine print, White and red Valentine print and White Bleached Muslin block for February.

Number	Size	Fabric
4	6 1/2" x 6 ½"	Bleached Muslin
6	4" x 4"	Bleached Muslin
2	4" x 4"	White and red Valentine Print
1	7 ¼ " x 7 1/4"	Red and white Valentine Print

Cut 4" blocks in half diagonally once creating half square triangles.

Cut Red and white Valentine Print ($7 \frac{1}{4}$ " square) in half diagonally twice creating 4 half- square triangles.

Following the diagrams combine the bleached muslin half squares with the white and red prints (4).

Using the Red and White Valentine Print, join a bleached muslin triangle on each end of the red print to form the flying geese block.

Row 1 and 3 are made with a half square block on either side of the flying geese block.

Row 2 has a flying geese block joined on either side of the center muslin square.
