Colonial Quilters Guild November 8, 2011 Minutes

Prior to the program, Barbara Weisman of the Easton Public Library spoke briefly on the historical flag dating back to July 8, 1776 and is housed at the library. They are requesting a cover for the flag to be quilted by any members who may be interested.

The program "Threads of the 30's" was presented by Madge Ziegler who has been quilting for 35 years and teaching for 33. Many beautiful quilts were shown illustrating quilts of the period.

President Mary Henning called the meeting to order at 8:25. A quilt made by Anna Mae Temos and quilted by Lois Walters was shown. It will be donated to Miracle League of Northampton County to be raffled off.

On a motion made by Barbara Smith and seconded by Nancy Blankowitz, the minutes of the October meeting were approved.

Treasurer - Linda Kleppinger - Beginning balance \$15,844.01, incoming funds, \$282.25, outgoing funds \$742.15 for an ending balance at the end of October of \$15,384.12. Subscriptions are still being taken for Fons and Porter. \$20 checks should be made out to the guild and of that amount \$5 will be donated to the guild.
