The meeting was then adjourned. Show and Tell followed. A hands-on project, English Paper Piecing was presented by the program committee and enjoyed by the members.



Road to the White House



February

Choose a time, two mediums, and two darks.



Easy block

Cutting Instructions

Layer Cut Right Sides Together

- (1) 5" x 10" first medium
- (1) 5" x 10" second medium





Layer Cut

(2) 4 1/2" second dark squares



(1) 2 1/2" x 18" strip light

(1) 2 1/2" x 18" strip first dark




Zut


Making Four



- 1. Draw on a 5" square line.
- 2. Draw on diagonal lines. Pin.



3. Sew a 1/4" seam on both sides of the diagonal lines. Press.



- 4. Cut apart on all lines.
- 5. Press the seams to the darker side.
- 6. Square to 4 1/2".

Making Three



- 1. Sew the strips together.
- 2. Press the seam to the dark side.
- 3. Cut into (2) 9" pieces.



- 4. Flip right sides together with the darks opposite each other.
- 5. Cut into (3) 2 1/2" sections.



6. Wiggle-match the center seam. Assembly-line sew.



7. Press and square to 4 1/2".





Sewing the Block Together

Variation: Notice that the quilt on the cover has a "light" road. Experiment with yours.

- 1. Lay out the pieces.
- 2. Sew the vertical rows
- 3. Sew the horizontal rows.

Why Have A Quilt Appraised?

Quilt Appraisals will be available at our Quilt Show in May this year.

When you have a quilt appraised, you learn it's value, which can be used for insurance purposes. It is also necessary to know value when you mail a quilt, or enter one in a quilt competition. You will be surprised at the value of your own work! There are a lot of other things you will learn through an appraisal, especially if you bring in an old quilt. You will learn about the pattern and the fabrics, and an approximate date for your quilt. We will discuss whether your quilt is unusual, or typical of a particular area or time period. We have even seen quilts or tops which were designed by a local artist, and have been able to make connections with other quilts made by the same person. It is always interesting to see how the story that accompanies a quilt is supported (or not) by the evidence of the fabric and the materials and workmanship of your quilt.

Another real benefit of a written appraisal is that you will have a written document which can be kept with your quilt, and will tell your family and future generations about the quilt so they can value it appropriately. For many collectors, this alone is worth the price of the appraisal.

Some people want appraisals because they want to know how to price a quilt for sale. It's important to remember that an appraisal generally gives you an insurance- or replacement- value. This is a retail price, what a dealer would sell it for, not what they would pay to purchase it. That being said, we do have some tips available if you are going to sell an old quilt, and you will have the advantage of being informed about the real value of your quilt in the process.
