There are currently 12 nurses who provide home visits to approximately 250 clients in the area. The babies are from newborn through 2 years of age. The "Baby Bank" is a way for the nurses to help provide the most simple baby needs for a temporary solution. (for example: if a nurse visits a home & diapers are almost gone or already gone, that nurse will provide maybe 6 or 12)

Small items that are needed are wipes, ointment, diapers, sippee cups, baby socks, onesies, shampoo, baby wash .. If you prefer not to shop, there is a bank provided for a donation & I will do the shopping. The staff is always most grateful & appreciative for the items that are donated.

LET'S ALL MAKE A CHALLENGE QUILT!

Our 2012 quilt show is just a little over 8 months away, so now is the time to start working on your Challenge Quilt. This year's theme for the Challenge is "Pennsylvania German Style Quilts". Several months ago, Barbara Garrett gave a presentation about PA German quilts at our guild meeting. She had lots of pictures and quilts to show us. She spoke about the fact that the PA Germans like to combine colors that you wouldn't typically think of putting together.

(ie. orange, green and red or pink and green). They liked to use bold colors, double pinks, double blues, turkey red and spring green. The quilt designs varied.... traditional pieced patterns like the basket, star or Jacobs Ladder and appliquéd designs were all found in PA German quilts. Use the internet for ideas...copy an antique PA German quilt you may have seen...or just use your imagination. Let's have fun!

Quilt Appraisals

Dawn Heefner will be appraising at our quilt show again this year. She is an AQS certified appraiser with 10 years experience.

Written appraisal fees will be \$40 for your first quilt, and \$30 for each additional quilt. Verbal appraisals are \$25 each. Our guild will receive \$5 for each quilt which is appraised. Arrangements can be made to have a quilt which is hanging in the show appraised: a good idea, particularly if you insure your quilt for mailing. Betsy Golden will be scheduling appointments after the new year. Please contact her with any questions you have.

Quilt Show Registration consideration-

Most of us place our quilts in local Guild Shows that do not include monetary prizes and in most cases a pattern created by another individual is associated with them; having others see the completed quilt may help the sale of the patterns. But technically, we need written permission of the designer, or at the very least, give the copyright owner credit. Be sure to identify the name of the designer and the source of the pattern (book name, magazine name/date, etc.) in the description portion of your entry form. And if another person has hand or machine quilted your quilt, be sure to include that person's name on your form. Let us observe the copyrights of our talented designers/publishers and quilters.
