WHITE CHRISTMAS COOKIES - Sharon Enstrom (requested from the Christmas tea)

Makes 2 1/2 dozen

1/2 C butter or oleo 2/3 C granulated sugar 1 tsp vanilla

1 egg 1 C plus 2 Tbsp all- purpose flour 1/2 tsp baking soda

1 C flaked coconut 6 oz white chocolate chips powdered sugar

Beat butter & sugar together until creamy. Beat in vanilla & egg.

Combine the flour & baking soda. Beat into the butter mixture.

Stir in the coconut & white chocolate. Form a dough.

Refrigerate.

Drop by teaspoons onto a buttered cookie sheet.

Bake at 350 for 15 min. Cool a minute before removing to a rack to complete cooling.

Sift powdered sugar over cookies until covered with a "blizzard of snow".
