16 oz. cream cheese softened

1{.4oz] envelope ranch salad dressing mix

1/2 cup minced red bell pepper

1/2 cup sliced green onions

1/4 cup sliced stuffed olives

3 to 4 [10in.] flour tortillas

Combine the cream cheese and salad dressing mix and beat until smooth. Add peppers, green onions and olives and mix well. Spread about 3/4 cup of mixture on each tortilla and roll up tightly, as a jelly roll. Wrap the rolls in plastic wrap. Refrigerate for 2 hours or longer. Cut roll ups into 1/2in. slices. 

Block of the MONTH- October's Meeting was a great start for our BOM. We hope everyone realizes what a common background material can do for a project. It really does make a visual statement and helps different blocks complement each other. We had 95 members present and had 17 blocks done. That's a good percentage.

Winning the blocks like Marge Fray did this month gives a member a great start on a project or at this time of the year—a potential Christmas gift. If more members participate we can have two winners.

The block for December is called "CAT'S' CRADLE". The fabrics you will need are a burgundy print fabric and a burgundy checked fabric to add to your muslin fabric. Take the challenge and make a block!!! Your block heads, Jean & Mary

CAT'S CRADLE



CUTTING OUT THE PIECES

From cream print fabric:

- Cut 3 large squares 41/2" x 41/2".
- Cut 3 squares 47/s" x 47/s". Cut squares once diagonally to make 6 large triangles.

From burgundy print fabric:

Cut 3 small squares 27/8" x 27/8".

From burgundy checked fabric:


- Cut 3 small squares 27/8" x 27/8".
- Cut 6 squares 2⁷/s" x 2⁷/s". Cut squares once diagonally to make 12 small triangles.

Block for December Meeting

Colonial Quilters Guild November 2010 BOM

Use 1/4" seam allowances throughout.

Draw diagonal line (corner to corner) on wrong side of each burgundy print small square. With right sides together, place 1 burgundy print small square on top of 1 burgundy checked small square. Stitch seam 1/4" from each side of drawn line (Fig. 1).



Sew 1 triangle-square and 2 small triangles together to make Unit 1. Make 6 Unit 1's.

- Sew 1 Unit 1 and 1 large triangle together to make Unit 2. Make 6 Unit 2's.
 - Sew 2 Unit 2's and 1 large square together to make Unit 3. Make 2 Unit 3's.
 - Sew 2 Unit 2's and 1 large square together to make Unit 4.
 - Sew 2 Unit 3's and Unit 4 together as shown in Block Assembly to complete Block.
