September 14, 2010

She then turned the meeting over to the program committee who presented a program of Quilting Tips and Hints. They demonstrated helpful tips on quilting, and presented each member with a booklet of them.

The business meeting was then presented. Minutes from June's meeting were approved.

Treasurer-Linda Kleppinger-Gave the treasurer's report for June, July, and August. The balance at the end of August was \$9643.01. She also announced the Fons and Porter subscription deal, and is keeping an eye out for people without name tags.

Vice-President-Shirley Chiles-There were 94 members present, and 1 new member, Marilyn Hansen. The door prize winner was Darlene Repash.

Program-Betsy Lawarence and Suzie Metz- Gave an overview of the programs for the coming year.
