Here are the totals for donations so far: teddy bears-95, premie quilts-52, pillow cases-26, pediatric oncology quilts-23, mastectomy pillows and totes-22, nightgowns-7, and wounded soldier quilts-4. Please plan on meeting your membership requirement by June 8, and contact Mary Lou Green if you have any questions. Also, please pay attention to the measurements of the items that you donate. Some premie quilts are coming in under-sized; they are to be at least 18" by 25".

Our guild is committed to community service and asks that each members support that commitment in one of the following ways annually:

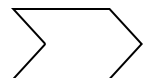
Community Service-Mary Lou Green: She announced that the premie quilts MUST be 18 by 25 inches, and to be SURE they are that size.

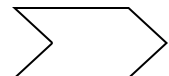

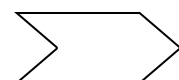

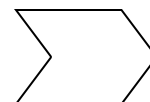

Show Demonstrations - Please consider doing a half hour demonstration at the show. They will start at 10:30 and the last one will be at 3:00. Suggestions but not limited to the following: hand appliqué; machine appliqué (satin stitch, blind hem stitch, and/or button hole stitch); several ways to do bias squares (quick quarter marker, triangles on a roll, Thangles); several ways to make flying geese units; any favorite tool; lump less seam binding; mitered corners for borders; scalloping the edge of a quilt using the scalloped edge tool or other method; correct way to put on continuous seam binding with a mitered corner; making French seam binding; how to make chenille; and any other quilting technique you would like to demonstrate. A sign up chart for all volunteers will be available at a future meeting. If you have any questions on demonstrations, please contact Sharon Rehrig at timelystitches@rcn.com or 610-759-3385.

Judging: Please consider having your special quilt judged. The judge will be Sandra L. Dorrbecker who addressed our guild in October. It is a pat on the back to find out what you do well. Quilts need to be registered - just check the "Judge" box at the top of the registration form if you want to have your quilt judged. Make sure you include \$5 for the judging fee. Appraisals at the Quilt Show: Dawn Heefner will be appraising at our quilt show this year. She is an AQS certified appraiser with 8 years experience. Written appraisal fees will be \$40 for your first quilt, and \$30 for each additional quilt. Verbal appraisals are \$25 each. Our guild will receive \$5 for each quilt which is appraised. Arrangements can be made to have a quilt which is hanging in the show appraised; a good idea, particularly if you ever insure your quilt for mailing. 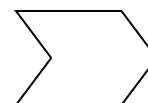
Quilt Show Speaker- Saturday June 5, at 1p.m.

The committee is looking for items, hand made by the guild members, to sell. No fabric donations will be accepted.

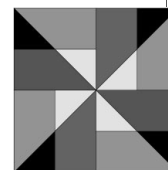

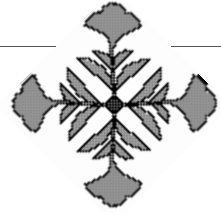

INSTRUCTIONS TO COMPLETE THE REGISTRATION FORM:

1st COLUMN is your vendor number followed by the item number. Please use a dash to separate the two numbers. Example: 65-1. If you have more than one of the same item, please list each item on a separate line. Example: Three of the same item --- listed as
65-1
65-2
65-3

2nd COLUMN is the description of the item. Example: Pieced table topper

3rd COLUMN is the price of the item. Price can be in .25 cent increments. Example: \$.50, 1.25, 3.50, 5.75 etc.

4th COLUMN is for the BOUTIQUE committee use ONLY.

REMEMBER:

1. Make a copy of your completed form for yourself before submission.
2. List any show displayed quilts that are for sale.
3. Please print clearly (black ink) on the form and tags.
4. Dollar signs \$\$\$ are not necessary on form or tags.
5. Use one sheet for all your items. If you have more than 25 items, print an additional sheet and use continuing numbers 25, 26, 27 etc. Please staple the sheets together.
6. The form is available on the website.
