

Creative Kindness

Have you heard of an organization or cause that is using quilts or quilting as a charitable cause? You are welcome to share brief information here, in case any of CQG members would be interested in participating. No member is required to participate in any of the items, and all shared information must be for charitable purposes only.

My mom sews many quilts for the Quilts for Kids organization. She found that Downy fabric softener will send the fabrics for you to sew a quilt and mail it back to them for distribution. It is free except for return postage and batting. Please go to the web site www.Downy.com. Click on Helping Kids-How to Help then Make a Quilt. Click the yellow words to get a kit sent to you. You will also see several different patterns to turn these fabrics into a beautiful quilt. I also spoke with Linda from Quilts for Kids, and if we send a list of names and addresses, she will send a box full of kits to save postage. She also invited us to send a group down to Yardley and tour the center and we could put the kits together ourselves if we'd like to donate our time to save postage altogether. She also said something about a workshop coming up next weekend. Lots of stuff going on with her! *Margie Kiefer*

Shirley Chiles thought that there might be interest on the part of those members who love animals and might want to help in aiding local dog shelters by making dog comforters.

Shirley shared with me three websites that offer information on making bed comforters for pets in shelters.

We would like to share this with you. Good directions and sizes can be found at www.shelterbeds.blogspot.com, or www.snugglesproject.org, or www.pleasebekind.com/cagecomforters. There are 4 groups that accept dog bed comforters. L.V. Humane Society in Allentown,

Happpy Dog Rescue, Nazareth, Animals in Distress in Coopersburg, and Peaceable Kingdom in Allentown

Hospice House of St. Luke's can use your help again. It has been three years since the Hospice opened and you have generously donated many quilts over these three years. Unfortunately, because of heavy usage, they can use more quilts. The size preferred is 63" wide by 93" long. They ask that the width be no more than 63" to avoid problems dealing with the beds. They can also use more pillowcases and more nightgowns. I have used the following instructions but you can make any variations:

Pillowcases:

1. Cut body of pillowcase 26" x 40" & border 10" x 40".

2. Fold border in half lengthwise with wrong sides together & press.

3. Sew border to right side of pillowcase with 1/2" seam allowance.

4. With right sides together, sew pillowcase-down side & across bottom.

5. Turn right sides out & press. Please note: bright colors are preferred!!!

Nightgowns:

1. Any variety of sizes are welcomed.

2. Cut down the middle of the back of the gown.

3. Prepare (2) 1/4" tie strings for top of gown-20" long

4. Use single binding or heavyweight muslin to sew a strip from top to bottom of gown-leave 1/4" at both ends & make sure to sew tie string into binding at top of gown.

5. Fold over binding to inside of gown & topstitch edge.

6. Fold in top & bottom edge of binding before sewing other side of binding from top to bottom of gown.

7. Repeat on other side of gown.

8. Sew any size pocket on front of gown....preferably a quilt-type square.

We held our first Quilt -A-Thon on October 24 & 25, 2003 from 6 pm Friday till 3 pm Saturday led by Janice Baker and Carolyn Meinhart.

Tested by Eleanor (Latorraca) removing quilt marks and yellow stains "Remove pencil lines from quilt by applying a mixture of 3 oz. water, 1 oz. rubbing alcohol, and 2-3 drops dishwash detergent (nit dishwasher detergent). Use soft toothbrush or cloth.

Tested by Eleanor (Latorraca) removing quilt marks and yellow stains "Biz carefully applied to pencil marks is also a good way to remove yellow stains on quilts"
