Minutes of the April 9, 2019 Meeting

Sue Nelson, Secretary: No changes to the March general meeting minutes were reported. Sue reminded members about Turning Point donations and told them a thank-you letter was received from Turning Point.

Wendy Bookhultz, Treasurer: Beginning balance- \$10,237.84; Incoming- \$73.50; Outgoing- \$1,428.89; Ending balance- \$8882.45.

Kathy Miller, Vice-president: 74 members, 1 guest; Beth Swain won the door prize.

Committees:

Old Business: Nominating committee- Rayann Rohrer is the nomination for secretary. Nancy Snow asked for nominations for president from the floor. None were given.

Sue Truby, Community Service: Bring a friend, 10 yrs. or older, to the June 15 preemie charity sew day and receive a chance to win a jelly roll and a prize for the friend. Sue requested possible donations of child-themed fabric for the quilt backs, a large cutting mat, and gently used ironing boards. Lehigh Valley Health Network sent a thank-you note for all the community service projects they have received from the members.

Jane Merkel, Sunshine and Shadows: A card was sent to Meg Ferry upon the death of her husband. The guild will send a donation to the family's charity. The April birthday gift was presented to Annette Mihalow.

Kathy Lopez, Librarian: She purchased a book by Eleanor Burns. Eleanor Burns's sister, Pat Knoechel, will probably not be coming to the Lehigh Valley this Spring. Annette Millow won the \$29.25 raffle.

Charlene Weiss, Fat Quarter: Catherine Mouer won the fat-quarter bin. The membership decided to have the next drawing in the Fall.

Boots Horvath, Bus Trips: Ten more members are needed to fill the Lancaster shopping bus trip on April 27. Cost- \$30.00. The Hersey Quilt show bus trip is July 27, 2019; cost \$30.00 bus, \$10.00 ticket = \$40.00.

Beth Swain, Programs: See the monthly program list given in the newsletter. The Karen Eckmeier presentation will be open to the public if not enough guild members sign up. The garage sale is June 8, 2019. Tables cost \$25.00 for a wall spot and \$20.00 for the room's center. Currently only guild members can sign up for a table. Beth will check with the Chrin Center to possibly hold the presentation there due to quilters' interest.

The following organizations were suggested: No Kill LV, Angel 34, Wreaths Across America, local Wounded Warriors, Cops and Kids, Victory House-Bethlehem, and an organization to help veterans obtain food. Betsy and Bev will make a few selections and the guild will vote.

FROM THE PROGRAM COMMITTEE

Eve Vallorani will join us at the May meeting.

Eve Vallorani is a professional textile artist who resides in Bucks County. Born in London, England, Eve traveled extensively in her youth with her parents. Immigrating to America in the early seventies her family settled in Pennsylvania where she earned her BA in Textile Design at Tyler School of Art.

Eve continued her artistic interests in painting and stained glass after getting married and raising a family, but working with fabric has always been her favorite medium. She held positions in several fabric stores over the years while sewing clothing, home dec and crafts for her daughters, herself and others. Later on she taught dressmaking to children and adults. In 2012 she was introduced to quilting and she quickly recognized that this was a great way to incorporate all of her creative interests into one. Experimenting with this process she combined her knowledge of design, sewing and passion for making art on fabric.

Eve feels the quilted surface is best suited for her artistic needs and has already won awards for her work. Now employed at Pennington Quilt Works, she is constantly exposed to the latest fabrics which helps fuel her inspiration. She finds that being around other quilters is great for motivation, learning new techniques and feedback. She also teaches students to break out of the traditional quilt-making process and express themselves with personal designs using free-motion quilting and thread play. One of her goals is to banish people's ideas of quilting as just making bed blankets and see it as a true art form.

Explore the freedom of fabric collage! No seams to piece or match, no lines to trace... just free form cutting of step and window shapes. Step by step your little village will magically come to life. A layer of tulle and machine stitching will complete your fabric collage project. Finished size: 16½" square.

Fabric – BRING PRE-CUT TO WORKSHOP!!!!

Cut a 6½" square and a 6½" x 2" rectangle from each of the ten colors

- 10 Colors*** (look for 'textures' or 'solid-like' / NO large scale prints)

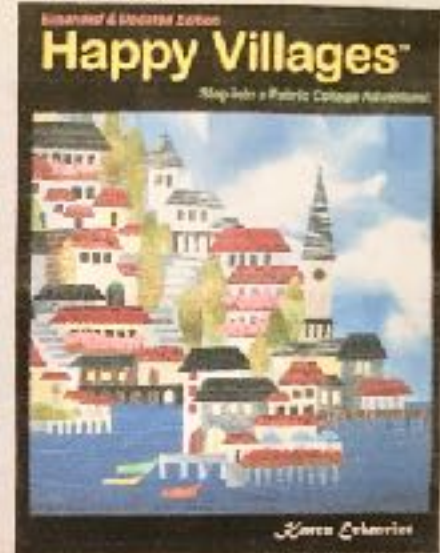
1. Dark Purple	6. Red
2. Lavender	7. Yellow
3. Dark Blue	8. Orange
4. Medium Blue	9. Deep Pink
5. Light Blue	10. Medium Green

***OR TEN COLORS THAT YOU LOVE, AS LONG AS THERE IS A RANGE OF VALUES STRIPES AND "SHINGLE" PRINT FABRICS ARE GREAT FOR ROOFTOPS

PLEASE BRING EXTRA FABRICS TO INCLUDE OPTIONAL SKY, TREES, WATER, ETC... (fabric requirements for a Seaside Village, a Fairytale Village, a Halloween Village, etc... are in the book "Happy Villages")

Supplies

- Sewing Machine OPTIONAL for 6 hour workshop (for LATE afternoon with walking foot and/or free-motion foot and thread) If you want to work slowly leave your machine at home. If on the other hand you work quickly bring your machine to quilt your piece during the last 1-2 hours of class. (Sewing Machine NOT NEEDED for the 3 hour workshop)
- Rotary Cutter and mat
- Rotary Cutter with wave/pinking/scalloped blades (optional: but you'll love playing with these!)
- Ruler (6½" x 24" or long ruler to square piece)
- Roxanne's Glue-Baste-It™ or fabric/tacky glue with applicator tip
- Large and small fabric scissors
- Long Pins for basting (bring basting thread and needle if you will be finishing by hand)
- 16½" x 16½" square of 100% Cotton Batting (BRING PRE-CUT TO WORKSHOP!!!)
- Tweezers with a long handle
- Marking pencil or chalk
- ½ yard tulle (bring a couple different colors to 'audition'... black works surprisingly well!)
- ½ yard Backing Fabric OR 20" x 20" Black Felt
- 2 yards Multi-color Yarn (optional)
- *Happy Villages: Expanded & Updated Edition* - \$22 (highly recommended – but not required)
