## Minutes of the May 14, 2019 General Meeting

President Nancy Snow opened the meeting.

Secretary Sue Nelson reported she took 34 pillowcases to Turning Point.

Treasurer Wendy Bookhultz reported beginning balance \$8882.45; outgoing \$1,591.56; incoming \$479.25; ending balance \$7770.14.

Vice President Kathy Miller-absent. Nancy Weston reported 66 members and 2 guests, Nancy Schotz, who joined, and Margaret (?). The May prize winner was Stephanie Rupert-Oblas.

Quilt Show: Chairperson Betsy Lawrence led the vote for one of the 2 organizations she researched to receive the monetary donation from the show's profits, Cops and Kids or Lehigh Valley Military Affairs. Lehigh Valley Military Affairs was chosen. The show theme is "Join the Party - Quilting is Sew Much Fun!" The guild was shown the finished raffle quilt, "Salute to Feathered Stars," from a pattern by Carolyn Cullinan McCormick, is finished. It was made by Richele Voice and Bev Repash. There will be a contest to guess the number of pieces in the raffle quilt and a small prize will be awarded. There will be a 1-hour presentation at the quilt show. Quilt show raffle tickets will be sold at the June garage sale and at the Hersey Quilt Show. Jane Merkel will sell tickets at the Hersey Quilt Show. Volunteers are needed to help Jane. A volunteer is needed to chair the book nook committee for the quilt show. The challenge is "Polka Dot Party." Betsy Lawrence spoke about the possibility of the guild donating men's necessities to Victory House in Bethlehem in October. More information will be coming.

Community Service: Sue Truby presented the quilt show Polka Dot Challenge. She handed out requirement sheets. There is no size requirement; must be 30% polka dot fabric, provide written project information, and exhibit some sewing.

Programs and Saturday Sewcials: Beth Swain. The program schedule was reviewed. See schedule in the newsletter. June Garage Sale: there are 3 center tables at \$20.00 each /3 wall tables at \$15.00 each still available. Contact Cindy Fantasia or Beth Swain. Beth would like the guild to support the June meeting presentation and following workshop by Karen Eckmeier. So far the cost to cover Karen Eckmeier's workshop has not been met by the number of people signed up. Karen will not come to the June meeting unless she has the workshop. Contact Beth Swain if interested in attending.

Beth Swain reported that 69 cake mix blocks were returned. A date will be chosen to assemble the blocks. Kathy Lopez, Library: One new book was purchased. Nanci Blankowitsch won \$29.50 from the raffle. Fat Quarter Frenzy: Charlene Weiss asked the guild members if any changes should be made to how the fat quarters (@75 pieces when the bucket is full) should be awarded. The members decided to have a drawing when the bucket is 1/2 full so there are more opportunities to win. There will be a June drawing. Bus Trips: Boots Horwath reported a bus trip is scheduled for the Hersey Quilt Show, July 27, 2019. The cost is \$40.00 which includes the show ticket and bus. The bus will leave from the church at 8:30 A.M. Historian Bev Repsher: no report. She will review photo albums and Carol Moll will scan pictures. This is to reduce the amount of guild photo albums currently in storage.

Website: Carol Moll has updated the website. It is currently operational. Any concerns, contact Carol Moll. The guilt show pictures can now be viewed on the site.

Nancy Snow asked the guild to accept the nominations for president: Cindy Fantasia and secretary, Rayann Rohrer. They will be installed at the June 2019 meeting.

## **German Raw Apple Cake**

Recipe from Pat Roof

2 1/4 cups flour, 1/2 cup brown sugar, 1 cup white sugar, 2 tsp. Cinnamon, 1/2 tsp. Salt, 1/2 cup Crisco, 2 tsp baking soda, 1 cup sour milk

Beat above ingredients for 2 minutes. Add 2 eggs and beat 1 more minute. Fold in 2 cups raw apples sliced thin. Make a topping of 1/4 cup brown sugar, 1/4 cup white sugar and 1/2 tsp cinnamon. Put this topping on before baking. 13x9" pan, bake 45 minutes at 350.

#### Fabric - BRING PRE-CUT TO WORKSHOP!!!!

Cut a 6½" square and a 6½" x 2" rectangle from each of the ten colors

• 10 Colors\*\*\* (look for 'textures' or 'solid-like"/ NO large scale prints)

Dark Purple
 Lavender
 Park Blue
 Medium Blue
 Light Blue
 A Red
 Yellow
 Orange
 Deep Pink
 Light Blue
 Medium Green

\*\*\*OR TEN COLORS THAT YOU LOVE, AS LONG AS THERE IS A RANGE OF VALUES. STRIPES AND "SHINGLE" PRINT FABRICS ARE GREAT FOR ROOFTOPS

**PLEASE BRING EXTRA FABRICS TO INCLUDE OPTIONAL SKY, TREES, WATER, ETC...** (fabric requirements for a Seaside Village, a Fairytale Village, a Halloween Village, etc... are in the book "Happy Villages")

## **Supplies**

- Sewing Machine OPTIONAL for 6 hour workshop (for LATE afternoon with walking foot and/or freemotion foot and thread) If you want to work slowly leave your machine at home. If on the other hand you work quickly bring your machine to quilt your piece during the last 1-2 hours of class.) (Sewing Machine NOT NEEDED for the 3 hour workshop)
- Rotary Cutter and mat
- Rotary Cutter with wave/pinking/scallop blades (optional: but you'll love playing with these!)
- Ruler (6½" x 24" or long ruler to square piece)
- Roxanne's Glue-Baste-It™ or fabric/tacky glue with applicator tip
- Large and small fabric scissors
- Long Pins for basting (bring basting thread and needle if you will be finishing by hand)
- 16½" x 16½" square of 100% Cotton Batting (BRING PRE-CUT TO WORKSHOP!!!)
- Tweezers with a long handle
- Marking pencil or chalk
- ½ yard tulle (bring a couple different colors to 'audition'...black works surprisingly well!)
- ½ yard Backing Fabric OR 20" x 20" Black Felt
- 2 yards Multi-color Yarn (optional)
