Description of Requirement

The Government has obtained a loan from the International Fund for Agricultural Development to help finance the Fisheries and Agricultural Diversification Programme. The Programme strategy is to ensure access for poor and low income small producers and women to high value quality niche markets where premium prices can be earned. To achieve this, the Programme would establish value chain companies jointly with private sector partners. The companies would be managed by a professional manager, who would ensure producers receive proper information, are trained in applying high quality standards in production and processing, have access to the required loan resources for working capital and processing equipment and fulfil orders properly and in a timely manner. Each company would enter into long-term commercial contracts with customers in high-end quality markets, either domestically (e.g. resorts, supermarkets) or for exports. The value chain companies would develop and own specific brands which would meet quality and food safety standards, compatible with high end market positioning. Shares in the value chain companies would be held initially by the government and the commercial private partner. By the end of the Programme, the Government would divest 100% of its equity to the producers

Scope of Services

Subsequent to this Expression of Interest and establishment of a short list, shortlisted Private partner companies would be invited to draft a business plan and investment plan for the value chain company and the high value commodity or commodities for which they will ensure market access. The draft plan will need to be discussed and reviewed with potential small producers and will indicate the prospective location of production and the anticipated number of small producers. An ad hoc Technical Review Committee of the Programme would carry out an appraisal of the plan and recommend it for approval if it meets profitability, sustainability and environment, poverty reduction and gender criteria. Investment costs would be shared between the private company and the Programme. Implementation would be the responsibility of the Board of Directors of the value chain company with support from the professional manager, the Private partner and the Programme.

Definition of commodities or products of VCC

The choice of value chains to be supported by the programme is broad and includes fresh and processed commodities from crops, livestock and fish which can be produced with the involvement of small producers, fishers and farmers.

Estimated Scale of the Business

Each VCC should aim to target the following number of smallholder producers each year.

The ratio of Government, IFAD (loan) and Private Investor's investment in terms of capital would be decided after the evaluation of the papers submitted with the EOI, based on the proposals on investment plans submitted by the shortlisted companies.

Expression of Interest

In this connection the Government of the Maldives is requesting written ‘Expressions of Interest’ (EOI) from eligible private sector companies with relevant experience, know-how and access to high value markets and the required operational and financial capacity to collaborate with the Programme on the basis of a Memorandum of Understanding and an equity investment in the value chain company.

The EOI shall consist of the following:

- a) A brief profile of the applicant, including (if applicable) current experience in the management of similar production and direct purchase activities by the applicant;
- b) A brief concept paper on the selected high value commodity or commodities, of interest to the partner; the scope of the value chain to be developed, the main outline of a possible business strategy with an indication of the target markets and the proposed marketing modalities; the possible location of the production base and the scope of small producers involvement.

Composition of EOI The information required under the company profile will include:

- Letter of Application indicating: name, title, address and telephone number of the Principal who will serve as the Contact for this project.
- Details of the individual, firm, company or consortium, including company profile, expertise and resource capacity;
- Brief background of senior management personnel;
- Original copies of all ISO Certification or other official certifications ;
- Performance in projects of a similar nature and size for each of the last five years, if any,
- Documents providing proof of financial capacity to undertake partnership with the Programme, including profit and loss statements, balance sheets and unqualified auditor’s reports for the past three years;
- Evidence of adequacy of working capital and equity for the proposed Partnership (access to line(s) of credit and availability of other financial resources)

The structure of the concept paper can be determined by the applicant. It will include the elements indicated above and short elaborations of:

- Proposed approach

RULES

UNESCO/Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom Prize

Article 1 – Purpose

UNESCO established the World Press Freedom Prize in honour of Guillermo Cano, a Colombian journalist who died in the exercise of his profession. The purpose of the UNESCO/Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom Prize is to reward each year a person, organization or institution that has made a notable contribution to the defence and/or promotion of press freedom anywhere in the world, especially if risks have been involved. The objective of the Prize is in conformity with UNESCO's policies and is related to the programme of the Organization in the field of communication and information and, more specifically, to the priority given to promoting an enabling environment for freedom of expression and freedom of information.

Article 2 – Designation, amount and periodicity of the Prize

2.1 The Prize shall be entitled "UNESCO/Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom Prize".

2.2 The Prize shall be funded by the Cano Foundation, the Ottaway Foundation and JP/Politikens Hus and shall consist of recurrent payments of US \$5,000, US \$20,000 and US \$20,000 respectively, to be deposited in a special account opened for that purpose in accordance with the Financial Regulations of UNESCO, which may also receive voluntary contributions from public or private institutions, associations, foundations, corporate entities or persons. The value of the Prize shall be determined by the Director-General in consultation with the donors on the basis of the contributions received, the interest on the sum deposited in the special account in accordance with the Financial Regulations of UNESCO, and the charges to be borne by the account for the cost of administering the Prize.

The prize also consists of a certificate and an object symbolizing the award and granted to the prizewinner.

2.3 All funds received and the interest accrued thereon shall be kept in a special interest-bearing account for the Prize (see Financial Regulations in Annex II).

2.4 The full staff support and operating/management costs of the Prize, including all costs relating to the award ceremony and public information activities, estimated at US \$45,000 shall be fully covered by the Cano Foundation, the Ottaway Foundation and JP/Politikens Hus or other funding sources. To this end, the Director-General shall determine a mandatory overhead cost amount to be applied and charged against the funds in the Special Account, which is to be established under the Financial Regulations for the Prize.

2.5 The Prize shall be awarded yearly.

Article 3 – Conditions/qualifications of candidates

Candidates shall have made a significant contribution to press freedom anywhere in the world. Prizes may be conferred upon individuals, institutions, other entities or non-governmental organizations.

Article 4 – Designation/selection of the prizewinner(s)

The prizewinner shall be selected by the Director-General of UNESCO on the basis of the assessments and recommendations made to him/her by a jury.

Article 5 – Jury

5.1 The Jury shall consist of two independent members from each of the six regions as defined by UNESCO, in other words 12 persons appointed in their individual capacity by the Director-General of UNESCO for a period of three years, renewable once.

Representatives and alternates of Members of the Executive Board may not be appointed as jurors. Jurors involved in a real or potential conflict of interest shall recuse themselves from further deliberations or be requested by the Director-General to do so. The Director-General may replace members of the Jury on legitimate grounds.

5.2 The Director-General shall appoint the President of the Jury. Members shall receive no remuneration for their work, but will receive allowances for travel and accommodation, where required. A quorum of eight present will be required for jury deliberations to proceed. The working languages for the Jury's deliberations shall be English and French.

An *ad hoc* working group of three Jury members shall make a pre-selection to reduce the number of candidates to no more than twelve, if necessary. The working group should give priority to the candidates most frequently nominated. Any dispute over the pre-selection shall be settled by a simple majority vote of the members of the Jury present and voting, which may amend the final list of candidates accordingly.

5.3 The Jury shall conduct its business and deliberations in conformity with these Statutes and shall be assisted by a member of the UNESCO Secretariat designated by the Director-General. Decisions shall be taken by consensus to the possible extent, and otherwise by secret ballot until a simple majority is obtained.

5.4 The Jury shall deliberate every year by electronic means.

5.5 The Jury shall recommend only one prizewinner to the Director-General of UNESCO.

Article 6 – Nomination of candidates

6.1 When UNESCO has received the funding for the Prize, as indicated in Article 2 above, the Director-General of UNESCO shall officially invite the submission of nominations to the Secretariat of the Prize, by 15 February, from the governments of Member States, in consultation with their National Commissions, as well as from international and regional professional and non-governmental organizations active in the fields of journalism and freedom of expression. The Jury shall vote, by electronic means, around 15 March and shall notify the Director-General of its choice.

6.2 Nominations shall be submitted to the Director-General by the governments of Member States, in consultation with their National Commissions, and by international and regional professional and non-governmental organizations active in the field of journalism and freedom of expression. A self-nomination cannot be considered.

6.3 Each nomination shall be accompanied by a written recommendation, which shall include, in English or French, *inter alia*:

- (a) a description of the candidate's background and achievements;
- (b) the candidate's contributions of major importance to the promotion of freedom of the press, submitted to the Jury for consideration;
- (c) a definition of the candidate's contribution to the Prize's objectives.

Article 7 – Procedure for the awarding of the Prize

7.1 The Prize shall be awarded by the Director-General at an official ceremony held for that purpose on 3 May, on the occasion of World Press Freedom Day. UNESCO shall present to the prize winner a cheque for the amount of the Prize, together with a diploma and an object symbolizing the award. UNESCO shall officially announce the name(s) of the prizewinner.

7.2 The prizewinner, shall, if possible, give a lecture on a subject relevant to the work for which the Prize has been awarded. Such a lecture shall be organized during or in connection with the prize ceremony.

7.3 Work produced by a person since deceased shall not be considered for the Prize. If, however, a prizewinner dies before he or she has received the Prize, then the Prize may be presented posthumously.

7.4 Should a prizewinner decline the Prize, the Jury shall submit a new proposal to the Director-General.

Article 8 – Sunset clause – mandatory renewal of the Prize

8.1 After a period of six years, the Director-General of UNESCO together with the donors will undertake a review of all aspects of the Prize and decide about its continuation or termination. The Director-General will inform the Executive Board of UNESCO about the results of this review.

8.2 In case of termination of the Prize, the use of any unspent balance of funds shall be determined by the Director-General, in accordance with the Financial Regulations of the Prize.

Article 9 – Appeals

No appeals shall be allowed against the decision of UNESCO with regard to the award of the Prize. Proposals received for the award of the Prize may not be divulged.

Article 10 – Amendments to the Statutes of the Prize

Any amendment to the present Statutes shall be submitted to the Executive Board for approval.



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
