



Chief Commissioner Job Description

Job Summary:

The Chief Commissioner is a key role which provides support and strategic insight to all sections within the Association. The Chief Commissioner is responsible for all the Scouting activities within the Association and the management of the affairs of the Association in accordance with its established policy. In addition, the Chief Commissioner is answerable to the National Scout Council.

Main Responsibilites:

The Chief Commissioner shall carry out the following duties and any other duties assigned by the Constitution (see attached), and the National Scout Council.

- Promote and coordinate the activities of all volunteer and professional staff, and ensure that work is properly planned, delegated and implemented for efficient management, general welfare, progress, and development of the Scout Movement in the Maldives.
- Build a quality team of national and regional commissioners to effectively lead the
 Association and ensure that support is provided to them in their recruitment, selection,
 approval, training, and review of suitable adults as leaders of youth, and in other supporting
 roles as adults in Scouting.
- Promote youth and adult volunteerism and activities within the Association co-opting teams to lead as necessary, and to enhance support for our adult members directly working with youth members.
- Ensure that the risks to youth and adult members are effectively managed, and that youth and adult members are safe from all forms of abuse and harm.
- Maintain close liaison with the President of the Association, particularly in regard to matters related to the policy.
- Ensure that successful plans are made and implemented for the development and growth of the Association.
- Organize the Annual General Meeting of the National Assembly in accordance with the Constitution and By-laws of the Association.
- Enforce the Policy, Organization and Rules of the Association, and other policies and rules established by the National Scout Council.
- Attend and participate, or arrange for participation by respective individuals, in the national Scout events, functions and activities; and provide leadership, encouragement and moral support; and represent the Association at regional and world Scout events.
- Promote the Scout Movement in the wider community by networking and making strategic alliances with the local communities, relevant authorities, and other community volunteer organisations.







Job Requirements

- Must be a Scout Leader with at least 3 years of appointment
- Have an intimate knowledge and passionate commitment to the purpose, objectives and philosophy of the Scout Movement, and have a clear understanding of the methods which make it distinctive from other youth organisations and movements
- Be an enthusiastic leader able to motivate, build and lead teams among both youth and adults
- Have the ability to communicate effectively with all levels in Scouting and with all forms of the media, and be an accomplished public speaker in the community
