6. Minimum Multitude of Exposure/Tours (Can propose others relating to context):

- Visits to Tourist Attractions/Theme Parks
- Visits to Hotel/Accommodation facilities (3 to 5 stars)
- Local cuisines, food & beverage (All must be Halal)
- Transportation means/facilities
- Entertainment (Cinema/Shopping/etc.)
- Visits to renown Hospitality & Tourism Universities
- Academic/Educational activities

7. Minimum Package Requirements (Per Adult):

- Return Air Ticket (Shortest outbound/inbound duration & lowest number of stops)
- Meals (Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner) for each day during abroad
- Any required fees (such as entrance fees for tourist attractions/facilities, or any other)
- Accommodation (students could be bunked max 3 per room gender separated; however, staff needs to be 1 per room)
- Tour guide charges/fees (Must be a proper English speaking guide)
- Transportation charges/fees (Bus, Train, Ferries, etc.)
- Insurance
- Taxes (GST) and surcharges
- Any others charges/fees

8. Important Notes:

- The package quotation must clearly state the total Package Price Per Adult in USD and equivalent MVR, along with any other charges/fees and their details which may NOT be covered in the package.
