1. The Government of Maldives has received financing from the International Fund for Agricultural Development ("the Fund" or "IFAD") towards the cost of Maldives Agribusiness Programme ("the client" or "procuring entity"), and intends to apply part of the proceeds for the recruitment of consulting services, for which this REOI is issued.

The use of any IFAD financing shall be subject to IFAD's approval, pursuant to the terms and conditions of the financing agreement, as well as IFAD's rules, policies and procedures. IFAD and its officials, agents and employees shall be held harmless from and against all suits, proceedings, claims, demands, losses and liability of any kind or nature brought by any party in connection with Maldives Agribusiness Programme.

- 2. The client now invites expressions of interest (EOIs) from legally constituted consulting firms (not individual consultants) ("consultants") to provide Consultancy Service for Strategic Direction and Policy Assessment of Agriculture Sector in the Maldives. More details on these consulting services are provided in the preliminary terms of reference (PTOR) attached as **Annex 1**. The consultant may sub-contract selected activities provided that said services do will not exceed 20% of the total consultancy work.
- 3. Before preparing its EOIs, the consultant is advised to review the preliminary terms of reference attached as **Annex 1**, which describe the assignment and **Annex 2** that details the evaluation of the technical qualifications.
- 4. The consultant shall not have any actual, potential or reasonably perceived conflict of interest. A consultant with an actual, potential or reasonably perceived conflict of interest shall be disqualified unless otherwise explicitly approved by the Fund. A consultant including their respective personnel and affiliates are considered to have a conflict of interest if they a) have a relationship that provides them with undue or undisclosed information about or influence over the selection process and the execution of the contract, b) participate in more than one EOI under this procurement action, c) have a business or family relationship with a member of the client's board of directors or its personnel, the Fund or its personnel, or any other individual that was, has been or might reasonably be directly or indirectly involved in any part of (i) the preparation of this expression of interest, (ii) the selection process for this procurement, or (iii) execution of the contract. 

an ongoing obligation to disclose any situation of actual, potential or reasonably perceived conflict of interest during preparation of the EOI, the selection process or the contract execution. Failure to properly disclose any of said situations may lead to appropriate actions, including the disqualification of the consultant, the termination of the contract and any other as appropriate under the IFAD Policy on Preventing Fraud and Corruption in its Projects and Operations².

- 5. All consultants are required to comply with the Revised IFAD Policy on Preventing Fraud and Corruption in its Activities and Operations (hereinafter, "IFAD's Anticorruption Policy") in competing for, or in executing, the contract.
 - a. If determined that a consultant or any of its personnel or agents, or its subconsultants, sub-contractors, service providers, suppliers, sub-suppliers and/or any of their personnel or agents, has, directly or indirectly, engaged in any of the prohibited practices defined in IFAD's Anticorruption Policy or integrity violations such as sexual harassment, exploitation and abuse as established in IFAD's Policy to Preventing and Responding to Sexual Harassment, Sexual Exploitation and Abuse³ in competing for, or in executing, the contract, the EOI may be rejected or the contract may be terminated by the client.
 - b. > reason, amount and currency of the commission or fee paid or to be paid. Failure to comply with these disclosure obligations may lead to rejection of the EOI or termination of the contract.

- e. Consultants are required to keep all records and documents, including electronic records, relating to this selection process available for a minimum of three (3) years after notification of completion of the process or, in case the consultant is awarded the contract, execution of the contract.
- 6. The Fund requires that all beneficiaries of IFAD funding or funds administered by IFAD, including the client, any consultants, implementing partners, service providers and suppliers, observe the highest standards of integrity during the procurement and execution of such contracts, and commit to combat money laundering and terrorism financing consistent with IFAD's Anti-Money Laundering and Countering the Financing of Terrorism Policy.4
- 7. Procedure: the selection process will be conducted using Quality Cost Based Selection as laid out in the IFAD Procurement Handbook that can be accessed via the IFAD website at www.ifad.org/project-procurement. The client will evaluate the EOIs using the criteria provided in **Annex 2**. The shortlisted consultant(s) will be provided with the detailed TORs and asked to submit a detailed technical and financial offer. The evaluation will include a review and verification of qualifications and past performance, including a reference check, prior to the contract award.
- 8. Consultants may associate with other firms to enhance their qualifications but should indicate clearly whether the association is in the form of a joint venture and/or a sub-consultancy. In the case of a joint venture, all the partners in the joint venture shall be jointly and severally liable for the entire contract, if selected.



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

1. Client

The client for this assignment is Project Implementation Unit (PIU) under the Ministry of Agriculture and Animal Welfare (MoAAW).

2. Background

The mission of the Ministry of Agriculture and Animal Welfare of the Maldives is to strengthen the Agriculture Sector through enhancing the capacities of crop and livestock farmers/enterprises and improving the value of agricultural produce / products by linking the farmers to market in order to achieve national food security and socio-economic development, whilst safeguarding the health and welfare of animals. Higher vision is to transform agriculture sector into a sustainably managed and market-oriented system that contributes to socio-economic growth and sustainable use of natural resources while maintaining the rights of animals The agriculture sector is a significant contributor to accelerating progress under SDG 1, 2 and 5. The Maldives SDG roadmap report published in February 2022 notes that while good progress has been made on international poverty targets (1.1), focused efforts are required to accelerate progress on small-scale food producers (target 2.3), malnutrition (target 2.2) and sustainable agriculture (target 2.4).

Even though Agriculture is crucial to economic growth of the country, contribution of the agriculture sector to the GDP is low compared to other sectors such as Tourism. There are several challenges and issues before the sector including food security, nutrition, livelihoods, animal health, climate change, and environmental degradation and biodiversity. Policy interventions are important to address these issues and make a positive impact on the lives of the communities and people working in the agriculture sector.

3. Background of the assignment

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The first National Fisheries and Agricultural Policy (NFAP), was formulated in 2019 by the Ministry of Fisheries, Marine Resources and Agriculture (MoFMRA) of the Republic of Maldives with the help of Food and Agriculture organization of the United Nations.

The 10-year national plan focused on developing the fisheries sector (i.e., oceanic fisheries, reef fisheries, aquaculture and post-harvest sub-sectors) as well as all crop and animal production systems encompassing the agriculture sector. The plan was formulated at that time to address current and potential future challenges in both fisheries and agriculture sector.

The current NFAP lacks some key responsibilities that are in the new mandate. In this regard Ministry wishes to hire a consultant to identify these gaps in the agriculture and animal welfare sector and identify areas for new policy interventions.

4. Overall objectives

The Programme goal is to elevate the importance of agriculture sector through increasing its contribution to the economy and by bringing positive changes to the livelihoods of those working in the agriculture and animal welfare sector.

The development objective is to bring positive changes to the agriculture sector through policy interventions. This objective will be achieved through setting a new strategic direction and improvements in the existing policies, development of new laws and regulations to strengthen the institution and the services, to enhance food security and nutrition, to promote sustained uptake and investment in climate-resilient agricultural technologies, develop animal welfare and animal husbandry, increase access to financing and markets, and ensure agricultural transformation is environmentally sustainable and biodiversity friendly.

5. Objectives of the assignment

The PIU wishes to contract a consultant to work in close consultation with Ministry of Agriculture and Animal Welfare (MoAAW), relevant ministries and stakeholders to develop a Strategic Direction and Policy Assessment of Agriculture Sector for the next 10 years.

The consultant should identify current gaps in policy and regulatory framework and needs for main policy interventions for the agriculture and animal welfare sector to ensure climate-smart, sustainable, nutrition-sensitive and profitable good agricultural practices. Hence, the ministry wishes to hire a consultant to address these changes in the new mandates and reflect them in the NFAP document. The Consultant is expected to review the National Fisheries and Agricultural Policy 2019 – 2029, other sectoral documents and the new mandate of the Ministry of Agriculture and Animal Welfare to identify the policy gaps and recommend additional/revised policies to address these gaps. The Consultant should have a final validation workshop to present their findings/recommendations to key stakeholders.

6. Scope of work

The main purpose of this assignment is to update the current 'National Fisheries and Agricultural Policy 2019 – 2029 (NFAP) to incorporate the new revisions to the mandate of MoAAW. As such:

- 6.1. In close coordination with the PIU and MoAAW, the consultant will prepare a detailed action plan for the assignment. Plan should include consultants understanding of the consultancy and associated tasks; Inception report with methodologies; key stakeholder lists, workshops, deliverables with timelines and reporting mechanism.
- 6.2. Undertake desk review/literature review on related subject matter.
- 6.3. Review the existing policy instruments (relating to Agriculture and Animal Welfare sectors, but also Land use, Environment, Climate change, Food security, Nutrition and health, Tourism⁶) to identify gaps that needs to be addressed to promote/incorporate the new mandate. The purpose of reviewing policy instruments relating to other Departments and Ministries is to ensure that the NFAP is well-aligned with other key policy frameworks, and comprehensively addresses the challenges facing the country's agricultural sector through recognition of linkages and plausible trade-offs in choice of transformation pathways.
- 6.4. Conduct consultations with key stakeholders to identify main challenges and policy gaps.
- 6.5. Based on the need assessment and stakeholder consultations the consultant should propose a new strategic direction for agriculture & animal welfare and propose new/revised policies, recommendations on new laws and regulations needed for the development of the agricultural and Animal Welfare sector and any other sectors that may impact the agricultural sector.
- 6.6. Present findings from the need assessment and stakeholder consultations and collect comments and recommendations
 - 6.6.1. Submit draft final report review on existing legislation and recommendation on policies needed for the agriculture sector to the relevant stakeholders.
 - 6.6.2. Stakeholder consultation meeting, where the results of need assessment and recommendation will be presented and comments and adjustments made.
 - 6.6.3. Organize consultative workshop with stakeholders to validate

- 6.6.4. Consultant needs to prepare stakeholder meeting report including all comments and recommendations from meeting participants.
- 6.7. Final report should have
 - 6.7.1. Proposed new laws and regulations in relation to agriculture and Animal Welfare sector and any other sectors that may impact the agricultural sector.
 - 6.7.2. Propose changes/additions to the vision, mission, guiding principles, focus areas in the NFAP document
 - 6.7.3. Propose new Pillars and identify objectives and key results to pursue those pillars
 - 6.7.4. Results Framework with year wise targets for results to be achieved and corresponding activities that would be taken up to achieve those results.
 - 6.7.5. Based on the Pillars and objectives new policy statements should be proposed.


