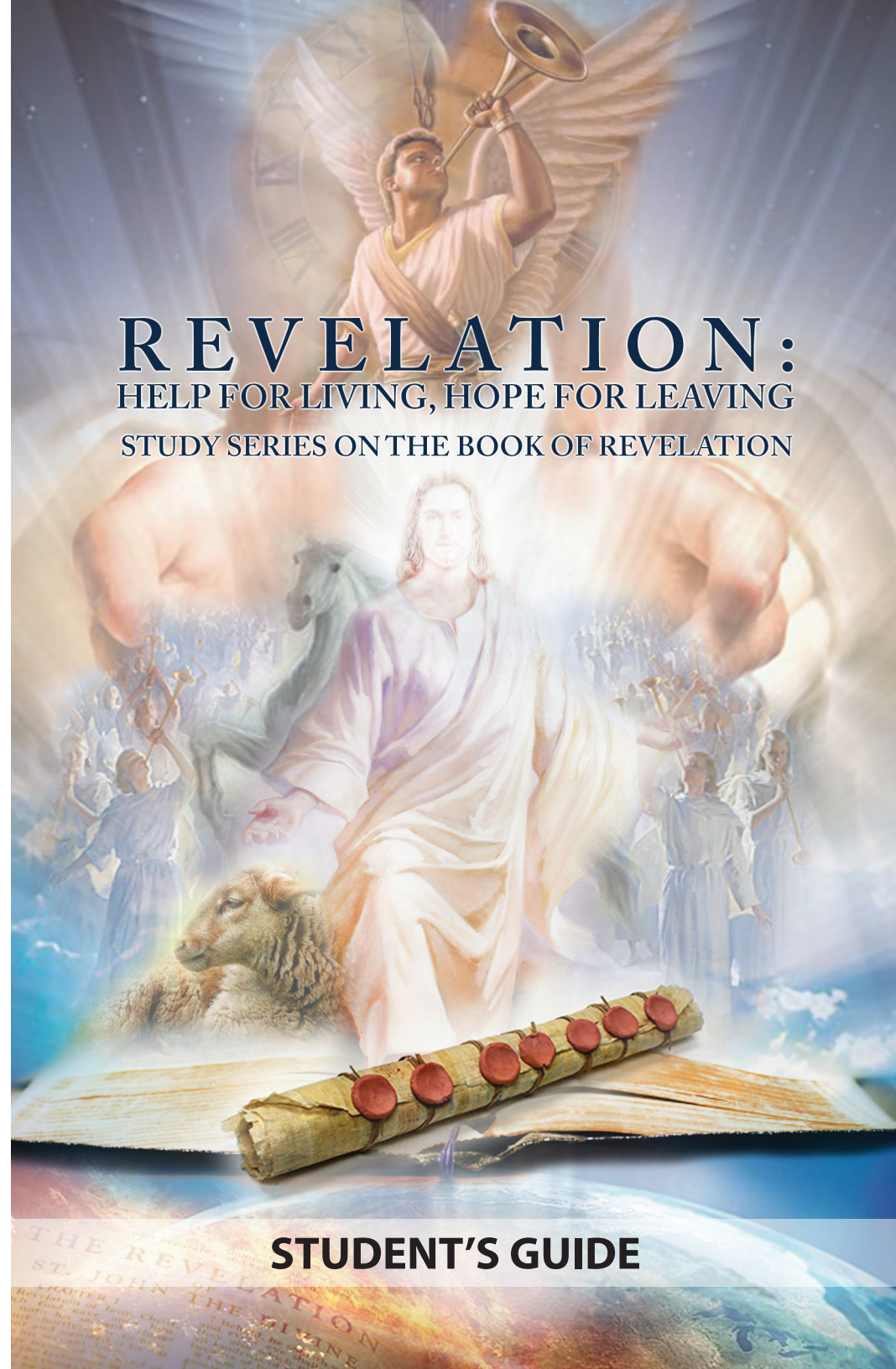

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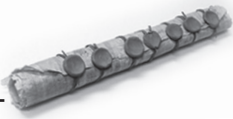

Lesson 9



“The Heavenly Throne”

Revelation 4:1-11



WELCOME

A Time for **Assembly**: *Introduction* to congregate through ice breaker.
(about 10 minutes)

For Starting Communication: *What is the most breath-taking sight you have ever seen in your life? Describe it.*



WORSHIP

A Time for **Adoration**: *Inspiration* to celebrate through the invocation, impartation of thanksgiving, invitation to worship and read the Scripture.
(about 25 minutes)

Suggested Songs :

“Worthy Is the Lamb,” “I Can Only Imagine,” “Indescribable”

Scripture Reading: Rev. 4:1-11



WORD

A Time for **Admonition**: *Instruction* to communicate one’s investigation of the story (content), interpretation based on the setting (context), and integration of the two for the spiritual truth (concept).
(about 50 minutes)

1. Who gave John a vision of heaven (v. 1, cf. Rev. 1:10)? Why (cf. Rev. 1:19, 22:6)?

2. Describe what John saw in heaven in verses 2-6a? What do these verses reveal about God?

3. Who is the one sitting on the throne? What does this mean?

4. Describe the four living creatures that John saw in the center, around the throne (vv. 6b-7)? What were they doing (vv. 8b-9)?



WALK

A Time for **Accountability**: *Invitation* to culminate in the implication of the Scripture (connect), implementation of a specific action (conduct), and intercession for the saints/seekers (concern).
(about 35 minutes)

1. How are you worshipping God and giving Him glory, honor and thanks? (cf. Romans 12:1-2; Colossians 3:16-17)

2. How does John's vision of heaven change the way you view God and worship Him?

3. What change/s must you make in the way you worship God so that He will be glorified and honored?

4. How can the group pray for you? *Share now your personal needs or concerns with your accountability and prayer partners which may include things that need to be changed and the specific action to be implemented in obedience to God's Word. As you intercede for each other ("saints"), pray also for others outside the group who need to know Jesus ("seekers").*
