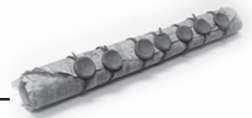
WALK

(about 35 minutes)

1. The Bible talks about the rapture that precedes the tribulation period. Read 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18. Discuss what takes place during the rapturing of the church.

2. The Bible promises that the bride of Christ, who is the church, of which we, as believers, are a part of is not to experience wrath referring to the tribulation period. This essentially talks of our being raptured. Knowing this, what are we to do? Read 1 Thessalonians 5:5-11.

3. How can the group pray for you? Share now your personal needs or concerns with your accountability and prayer partners which may include things that need to be changed and the specific action to be implemented in obedience to God's Word. As you intercede for each other ("saints"), pray also for others outside the group who need to know Jesus ("seekers").

2. Who is their king (v. 11)?

3. What was the purpose of the four angels (v.15)?

4. How many people died from the four angels (v. 18)?

5. How will people respond to these plagues/woes (vv. 20-21)?

6. Why does God allow disasters or oppression (v. 21)?
