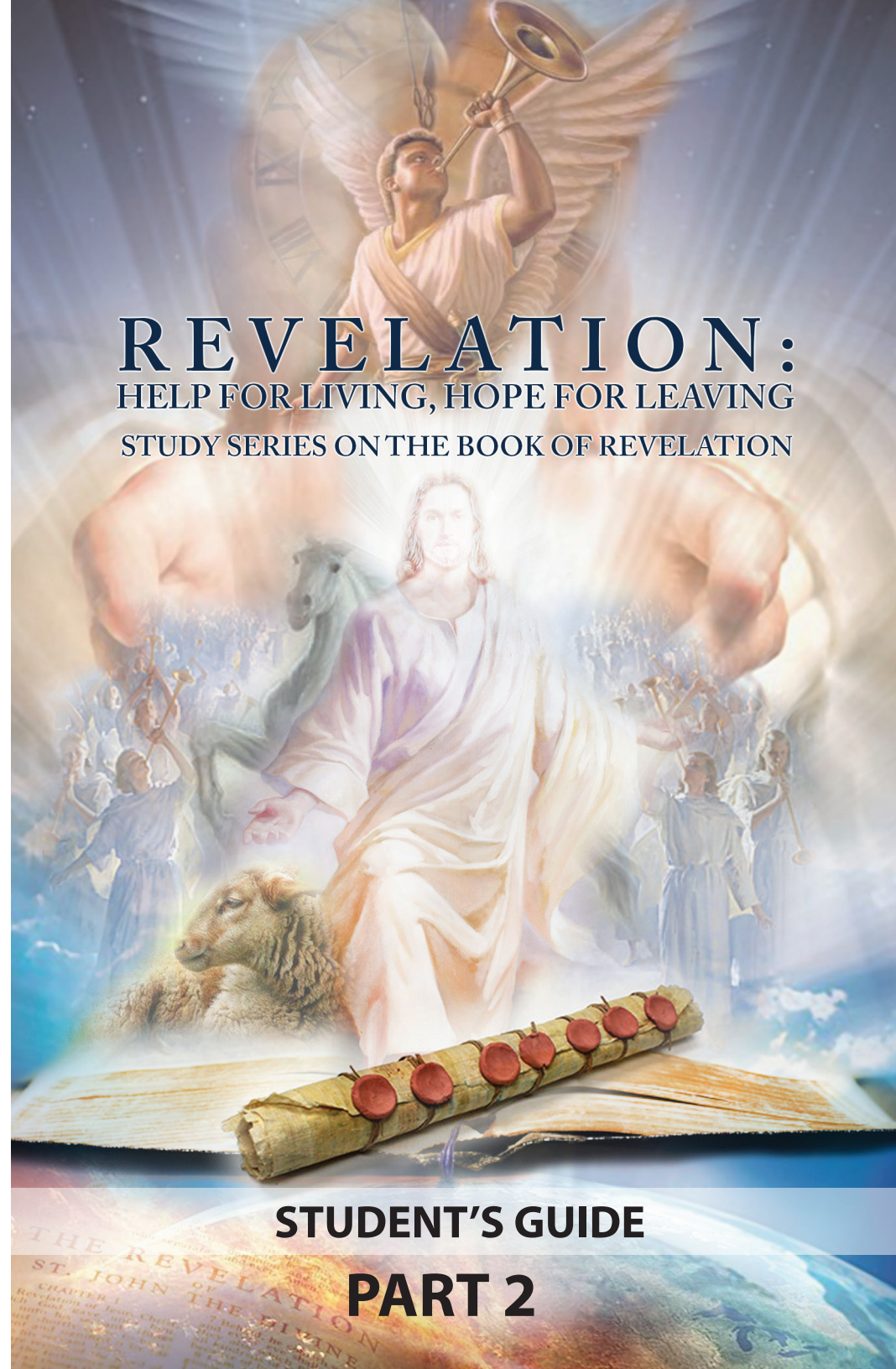

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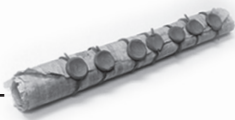
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# Lesson 20



## “An Overview of the Final Judgment of God on Human Society Represented by Babylon”

Revelation 14:1-20



### WELCOME

A Time for **Assembly**: *Introduction* to congregate through ice breaker.

(about 10 minutes)

For Starting Communication: *What are the things you desire most?*

*(People may desire success, material possessions, relationships, etc. In a consumerist society like ours today, what defines a person are the things that he/or she consumes. A person who buys expensive bags is defined as rich. A person wearing a Christian t-shirt is a Christian. A person who wears sports brands is athletic. We label people on which mall they frequently go, what coffee they drink, movies they watch, music they listen to, and t-shirts they wear. We are identified by the things we consume. God’s people are not called to be identified by what they buy, but by the One who bought them by His blood.)*



### WORSHIP

A Time for **Adoration**: *Inspiration* to celebrate through the invocation, impartation of thanksgiving, invitation to worship and read the Scripture.

(about 25 minutes)

Suggested Songs :

“In Christ Alone,” “How Great is Our God”

Scripture Reading: Rev. 14:1-20



### WORD

A Time for **Admonition**: *Instruction* to communicate one’s investigation of the story (content), interpretation based on the setting (context), and integration of the two for the spiritual truth (concept).

(about 50 minutes)

1. Observe how the 144,000 are described and their relationship to the Lamb (vv.1-5).

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2. What is the message of the angel and to whom is he proclaiming it (vv. 6-7)?

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3. What is the angel’s description of Babylon compared to the 144,000 in verse 4 (v. 8)?

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4. What are the angel’s warnings and encouragements (vv. 9-13)?

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5. Compare and contrast the two harvests in verses 14-16 and verses 17-20.

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**WALK**

A Time for **Accountability**: *Invitation* to culminate in the implication of the Scripture (connect), implementation of a specific action (conduct), and intercession for the saints/seekers (concern).  
*(about 35 minutes)*

1. How would you describe God as He is revealed in the passage?

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2. What are the ways we are adulterous/idolatrous with other "gods" today?"

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3. What happens if we worship anything other than Jesus?

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4. Read verses 6-7 and 12-13 again and discuss how God's people should live in an idolatrous world today.

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5. How can the group pray for you? *Share now your personal needs or concerns with your accountability and prayer partners which may include things that need to be changed and the specific action to be implemented in obedience to God's Word. As you intercede for each other ("saints"), pray also for others outside the group who need to know Jesus ("seekers").*
