WELCOME

A Time for **Assembly**: *Introduction* to congregate through ice breaker. (*about 10 minutes*)

For Starting Communication: Have you experienced injustice before? Were you able to find justice? Relate your experience to the group (Sometimes it seems like God allows injustice to thrive and it seems like the bad guys can just get away with it and not get caught. Even King Solomon during his time felt the same, which he recorded in Ecclesiastes 3:16. However, if you read the verse, you can see his conclusion on the matter. Do you agree with him? Our passage today proves that his conclusion is indeed true.)

WORSHIP

A Time for **Adoration**: *Inspiration* to celebrate through the invocation, impartation of thanksgiving, invitation to worship and read the Scripture. *(about 25 minutes)*

3. How can the group pray for you? WALK

A Time for **Accountability**: Invitation to culminate in the implication of the Scripture (connect), implementation of a specific action (condúct), and intercession for the saints/seekers (concern).

(about 35 minutes)

- 1. There are times when you may get depressed while reading the news and seeing so many injustices happening. It's even more heart-breaking when you read about how deeply ingrained and widespread corruption has become in our society. Sometimes you may even wonder if God is just allowing it to happen and will not do anything about it. How can our passage today assure you that God will ultimately bring about justice in His own time?
- 2. The great city of Babylon prided herself with her excessive wealth. She was so rich, she placed her security and trust upon her wealth instead of God. In her pride, she thought that she didn't need God. This is one of the reasons why God judged her. What are some things in your life where you have a tendency of trusting or depending upon them instead of God? What kind of adjustments would be needed in order to guard yourself from doing so?
