Scripture Reading: Genesis 1:3-31

📖 **WORD**

A Time for **Admonition**: *Instruction* to communicate one’s investigation of the story (content), interpretation based on the setting (context), and integration of the two for the spiritual truth (concept).
(50 minutes)

1. What was God’s act of creation on the first day (v.3)? Was it a literal 24-day (vv.3-5)?
2. What did God do on the second day of creation (vv.6-8)? On the third day (9-13)?
3. What did God do on the fourth day of creation (vv.14-19)? On the fifth day (vv.20-23)?
4. What did God create on the sixth day (vv.24-25)? How was man created?
5. What does God mean when He final declares creation of be “very good”?
6. In verses 28-31, what had God mandated man to do with God’s creation?
7. How may we describe the kingdom of God as it has been revealed up to this point in Scripture?

⇒ WALK

A Time for **Accountability**: *Invitation* to apply the implication of the Scripture (connect), implementation of a specific action (conduct), and intercession for the saints/seekers (concern).

(about 35 minutes)

1. What are the words repeated throughout the passage? Why do you think these are important?
2. How does the story of creation affect your view of it? What are the implications in today's society?
3. God repeatedly declared His creation good. What does that mean? And what are "the good" that you see in our society today? In our Philippine culture?
4. God created by his word. He spoke to man before man spoke to him or understood himself. How does this help us to understand the authority of God's Word for us today?
5. Knowing that God created you in His image, how would you regard yourself? How would you regard other persons whether male and female? Rich and poor? Criminals and drug addicts?
