Adam and Eve's Family Outside the Garden

Genesis 4:1–26



A Time for **Assembly**: *Introduction* to gather together through ice breaker.
(about 10 minutes)

For Starting Communication:

Share how you and your siblings would fight when you were young kids.



A Time for **Adoration**: *Inspiration* to worship God through invocation, thanksgiving, and reading Scripture.
(about 25 minutes)

Scripture Reading: Genesis 4:1-26th

WORD

A Time for **Admonition**: *Instruction* to communicate one's investigation of the story (content), interpretation based on the setting (context), and integration of the two for the spiritual truth (concept).
(about 50 minutes)

1. Why did God accept Abel's offering and reject Cain's offering (vv.1-5)?
2. How did God warn Cain about committing a sin (vv.6-7)?
3. How did Cain respond to God who made him accountable for Abel's death? How did the Lord respond (vv.8-9)?
4. What was God's curse upon Cain? What is the mark of Cain (vv.1-15)?
5. Why did God allow brothers marrying their sisters (vv.16-17)? Read Leviticus 18:9, 18:11, 20:17.
6. How does the fall affect the kingdom of God?

WALK

A Time for **Accountability**: *Invitation* to apply the implication of the Scripture (connect), implementation of a specific action (conduct), and intercession for the saints/seekers (concern).

(about 35 minutes)

1. What are some important principles we can learn for how we offer “sacrifices” to God?
2. Why do we offer tithes and offerings? Do we have motives behind it?
3. How do we react when God convicts us of our sin?
4. What will you offer to God this week as your expression of worship and obedience?
5. How did the fall affect the harmony of relationships that existed from creation?
6. How does the grace of God show itself alongside of his judgment?
7. How can the group pray for you? Share now your personal needs or concerns with your accountability and prayer partners. These may include attitudes that need to be changed and specific actions to be done in obedience to God’s Word. As you intercede for each other (“saints”), pray also for others outside the group who need to know Jesus (“seekers”).
