INTRODUCTION

- Jesus had made two trips to Jerusalem (cf. John 2 and 7).
- It was on His second trip that the religious leaders tried to arrest Jesus and have him killed (*John 7*).
- The religious leaders were looking for an opportune time to arrest and kill Jesus, but were afraid to do so publicly because of the crowds (*Matthew 26:3-5*).
- In chapter 17, Jesus just finished meeting in the Upper Room. He identified Judas as a traitor and prayed for His disciples.

I. HE CHOSE THE PLACE

- A. Jesus chose the place of meeting (18:1-3)
 - 1. Jesus was orchestrating events to bring about His purpose.
 - The religious leaders were afraid of the crowds. Had Jesus remained in Jerusalem, he would not have been arrested.
 - 3. Jesus purposely went to the Garden of Gethsemane, which was outside Jerusalem.
 - 4. Jesus went to a place Judas knew (18:2).
 - 5. Judas gathered a squad of Roman soldiers, the officers of the chief priests and Pharisees.
 - 6. The force came fully armed with lanterns, torches, and weapons, expecting Jesus to resist arrest or attempt escape.
 - 7. The success of "trapping" Jesus was not due to planning or superiority in number, but because it was Jesus's hour. He was the one in control.
- B. <u>Life Application:</u> God's plans are not thwarted by the schemes of men.

II. HE CHOSE TO MEET HIS ENEMIES

- A. Jesus chose to confront His enemies (18:4-9)
 - 1. Verse 4 states that "Jesus knew everything that was going to happen to him."
 - 2. Instead of retreating in fear or trying to run, Jesus stepped forward and met them asking, "Who are you looking for?"
 - 3. When Jesus identified himself, "I am He," the men fell to the ground surprised by His commanding figure, boldness, and statement.
 - 4. Jesus requested that His disciples be set free, displaying His selfless love and fulfilling His prophecy.
- B. <u>Life Application:</u> God's plans are not thwarted even when evil appears to triumph.

III. HE CHOSE TO SUBMIT TO HIS ENEMIES

- A. Jesus chose to submit to His enemies (18:10-11)
 - 1. Jesus had just secured the release of His disciples, but Peter acted foolishly and struck the ear of the Temple servant, Malchus.
 - 2. Luke tells us that Jesus healed the ear of the Temple servant, which would have calmed down the mob instantly (*Luke 22:51*).
 - 3. Jesus informed Peter that He could call twelve legions of angels to deliver Him from His enemies (*Matthew 26:52-54*).
 - 4. The only reason the crowd could lead Jesus away was because Jesus chose to obey the will of the Father.
 - 5. Jesus submitted to the will of the Father even though it meant going to a place He did not want to go to.
- B. <u>Life Application</u>: Discipleship means complete submission to the will of the Father, even if that means going where we would not choose to go on our own.

CONCLUSION

Death on the cross was the path Jesus chose. He could, at numerous moments, have chosen another option. Instead, He chose the path of the cross for you and me ■

SOME USEFUL INFORMATION ABOUT SHARING YOUR FAITH

This helpful information is from the 9Marks Facebook Page (facebook. com/9Marks):

QUESTION: What content is necessary in order to share the gospel?

ANSWER: In order to share the gospel you must tell someone the truth about:

- 1. God. God is the creator of all things (Gen. 1:1). He is perfectly holy, worthy of all worship, and will punish sin (1 John 1:5, Rev. 4:11, Rom. 2:5-8).
- 2. Man. All people are sinful by nature (Gen. 1:26-28, Ps. 51:5, Rom. 3:23). By nature, all people are alienated from God, hostile to God, and subject to the wrath of God (Eph. 2:1-3).
- 3. Christ. Jesus Christ, who is fully God and fully man, lived a sinless life, died on the cross to bear God's wrath in the place of all who would believe in him, and rose from the grave in order to give his people eternal life (John 1:1, 1 Tim. 2:5, Heb. 7:26, Rom. 3:21-26, 2 Cor. 5:21, 1 Cor. 15:20-22).
- **4. Response.** God calls everyone everywhere to repent of their sins and trust in Christ in order to be saved (Mark 1:15, Acts 20:21, Rom. 10:9-10).

This does not mean that you must communicate all of these things in every encounter with a non-Christian. This does mean that you haven't shared a complete gospel unless you include these four things

We also lift the bread and the cup in union with Him in His resurrection and triumph over death and injustice that separates us from Him and from each other \blacksquare

THE GOSPEL

"Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."

(1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD

God is holy and righteous: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty, the whole earth is full of his glory" (*Isaiah 6:3*). **He requires holiness of us as well:** "Be holy, for I am holy" (*1 Peter 1:16*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT MAN

Man is sinful: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (*Romans 3:23*). Sin demands a penalty: "For the wages of sin is death" (*Romans 6:23*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT CHRIST

Christ is the expression of God's love for us: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). Christ paid the penalty of our sins and died for sinners: "For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God" (1 Peter 3:18). Through Christ, God offers man

3:18). Through Christ, God offers man reconciliation: "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins against them" (2 Corinthians 5:18).

WHAT SHOULD WE DO?

Believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (*Romans 10:9*).

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. I believe that you died on the cross in my place, to save me from my sins, and I accept you as my Savior, and the Master of my life forever. Amen.
