Scripture Reading: Genesis 11:27-12:9

WORD

A Time for **Admonition**

Instruction to communicate one's investigation of the story (content), interpretation based on the setting (context), and integration of the two for the spiritual truth (concept) (50 minutes)

- 1. Genesis 12 marks a new division in the book. What is the significance of Genesis 12 (12:1-3)?
- 2. What was clear (i.e., specific) about God's command to Abram? What was unclear (i.e., not specific) about it (12:1)? Read Hebrews 11:8.
- 3. What are the promises of God contained in His covenant with Abram (12:1-3)?
- 4. In what forms has Abram's blessing come to the world? To Christians? Read John 8:56 and Galatians 3:7-9.

WALK

A Time for **Accountability**

Invitation to apply the implication of the Scripture (connect), implementation of a specific action (condúct), and intercession for the saints/seekers (concern) (about 35 minutes)

- 1. If God were to impress upon you that He is calling you to make a major transition in your life, how ready would you be to obey Him?
- 2. Why would knowing Who calls you matter more than where you are called to go?
- 3. Preachers of "prosperity gospel" take the promise of blessing in Genesis 12:1-3 out of context. They say that the promise is meant for all Christians to claim directly for themselves today. What is a healthy view of stewardship that avoids the error of the "prosperity gospel"?
- 4. How can the group pray for you? Share now your personal needs or concerns with your accountability and prayer partners. These may include attitudes that need to be changed and/or specific actions to be done in obedience to God's Word. As you intercede for each other, pray also for others outside the group who need to know Jesus.
