Abram and Lot Separate

Today's Message (11/12 November 2017) / *Genesis 13*

JUST LIKE ABRAM,
OUR FAITH WILL BE
TESTED. CHOOSE
TO LIVE BY FAITH
AND NOT BY
SIGHT TO MAKE
YOU TRUST GOD
WHOLEHEARTEDLY
AND BELIEVE THAT
HE WILL PUT THE
PIECES TOGETHER
BEAUTIFULLY.

Abram's life is the story of a man whose faith was always tested. Someone once said that "faith that cannot be tested cannot be trusted." Up to this point, God was constantly testing his faith. Abram was very much like us: struggling daily whether to "trust God completely" or "lean on his own understanding." He failed in Egypt because he resorted to his own schemes instead of trusting God. In today's passage, we will see Abram slowly growing in his faith in God based on his response to another test that involved his nephew. We can learn a lot from this story by understanding the basis of their choices and the consequences.

1. **RECOMMITMENT** TO GOD

- **Return** to Bethel (v. 3, Genesis 12:8)
 - We're not expected to make the right choices all the time. When we fail, God gives us the opportunity to retrace our steps, recover and recommit ourselves to follow Him.

2. **REMEDIAL** TEST

Abram's faith was tested (again) through a situation that involves Lot.

- <u>Scheming</u> in Egypt. In Egypt, he succumbed to fear and attempted to represent Sarai as his sister in order to avoid potential trouble with the Pharaoh.
 - <u>Famine</u> forced Abram to go to Egypt (*Genesis 12:10*)
 - <u>Fear</u> pushed Abram to give away Sarai (*Genesis 12:11-13*)
- <u>Separation</u> from Lot

Abram and Lot Separate

Today's Message (11/12 November 2017) / *Genesis 13*

- Fights among herdsmen caused the separation (ν. 7)
- Faith made Abram give way to Lot (vv. 8, 9, 12)
- The **foundation** of their choices show their character
 - Lot's choice was based purely on <u>sight</u> (*v. 10*). It brought him closer to Sodom (*v. 12b*) who were "wicked, great sinners against the Lord."
 - · He was willing to forsake family for fortune
 - He chose to live near Sodom vs. separation from the world. He will suffer the consequences of this choice later.
 - Abram's choice was based purely on <u>faith</u> (*vv. 12, 14*). "He settled in the land of Canaan..." God blessed him for this: (*v. 15*) "all the land that you see I will give to you and to your offspring forever."

3. **REWARD** FROM GOD

Matthew Henry said, "The prospects seen by faith are more rich and beautiful than those we see around us."

- <u>Property</u>: The Promised Land. "Lift up your eyes and look from the place where you are."
 - No land of his own (future)
- Posterity: The People of Israel
 - No child of his own (future)

4. **RESPONSE** FROM ABRAM (V. 18)

Praise and worship: "...he built and altar to the Lord."

CONCLUSION

Just like Abram, our faith will be tested. Choose to live by faith and not by sight to make you

- Proverbs 3:5-6: Trust God wholeheartedly
- Romans 8:28: Believe that He will put the pieces together beautifully lacktriangle

Jesus replied, "I assure you: Unless someone is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." - John 3:3 (HCSB) Every time we witness a baptism, we celebrate someone's profession of faith. More so, we witness once again Christ's triumph over sin and death. Baptism is both a profession and a celebration of our union with Christ. It is a public witness to the reality of Christ's sacrifice for the ransom of many. We are born again, united in His life, death, and resurrection.

THE GREATEST COMMANDMENT

Three years ago, Tim Sosmeña started learning Japanese because of a desire to pursue a higher level of education in Japan and befriend Japanese people. It never occurred to him that he would be ministering to some Japanese people here.



God's work can certainly be mysterious most of the time, but His work never fails to amaze.

Today, Tim co-leads a ministry for international students, welcoming them to a community. They aim to extend God's love by accompanying them to worship services and fellowshipping with them. In the last few years, they were able to minister to four Japanese students who studied here and have since returned to their home countries. They are presently ministering to a young Japanese couple and two Korean students.

Tim praises God for how steadfast His love is. His grace is ever abounding both in how this ministry is sustained and in that more foreign students are led to them so that they can extend His love to these internationals

ON THE COVER: Portrait of a Bedouin man holding a lamb (pixabay.com). Bedouins ("desert dwellers") are a nomadic people who have been wandering around northern Africa, the Arabian peninsula, and the Levant for almost 2,000 years. Their way of life provides clues to the kind of life Abram and his kin probably lived when they sojourned in the same region 4,000 years ago. <u>Consider praying about this:</u> The Joshua Project estimates that at least 45 missions workers are needed to jumpstart evangelistic efforts among the Bedouins (pop.: 2.2 million), of whom only 0.17% are professing Christians.

God's Way to Heaven

THE GOSPEL

"Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."

(1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD

God is holy and righteous: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty, the whole earth is full of his glory" (*Isaiah 6:3*). **He requires holiness of us as well:** "Be holy, for I am holy" (*1 Peter 1:16*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT MAN

Man is sinful: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (*Romans 3:23*). Sin demands a penalty: "For the wages of sin is death" (*Romans 6:23*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT CHRIST

Christ is the expression of God's love for us: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (*Romans 5:8*). Christ paid the penalty of our sins and died for sinners: "For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God" (*1 Peter 3:18*). Through Christ, God offers man reconciliation: "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins

against them" (2 Corinthians 5:18). WHAT SHOULD WE DO?

Believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (Romans 10:9).

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. I believe that you died on the cross in my place, to save me from my sins, and I accept you as my Savior, and the Master of my life forever. Amen.
