What do you do when God's promises and their fulfillment seem a distant reality?

Abram's defeat of the eastern kings had left him no better off. Despite the promises, he did not as yet own any of the land nor had any children been born to him. His nephew Lot, whom he may have hoped to succeed him, was living in depraved Sodom, outside the land of promise. His most likely heir seemed to be his servant Eliezer. God, therefore, addressed Abram's disappointment directly.

1. THE A	OF
A P	(VV. 1-6)
a. The P	of Fatherhood

- Despite God assuring Abram that He was his protector and greatest treasure, Abram wanted more (*vv. 1-2*). How often do we do that to God? The Giver presents Himself, but we ask for His presents instead.
- Yet God is unfazed by Abram's query and assures him lovingly that for God, a promise made is a promise kept (vv. 4-5). In fairness, Abram was perhaps more impatient than faithless (*Hebrews 11:11-12*). He was now 85 years old, and for 10 years he had been waiting for his promised son.

### b. The P of Faith

- Genesis 15:6 is one of the most important verses in the Old Testament in view of its usage in the New Testament (*Romans 4:3-25, Galatians 3:6-14*).
- Faith counts for (instead of) righteousness. Faith
  is the response of believing obedience to the
  word of God that is counted for righteousness,
  instead of righteous deeds. It is therefore right
  for the New Testament to use this verse in
  describing how salvation is available in Christ.

01. Paul stressed that faith for Abram meant believing in God's promise of a child, an
attitude to God that preceded his acts of obedience (Romans 4). While Genesis
implies that the sons of Abram must be men of faith, Paul turns the words around
and explains "it is men of faith who are the sons of Abram" (Galatians 3:7).

- 02. Romans 4:5 says, "To the man who does not work but trusts God who justifies the wicked, his faith is credited as righteousness." *God, who justifies the wicked.* It is in this way that we need to see Abram. We need to look at him as the Bible shows him to be in order to explain his failures and sins. Yet it is in his failures that we can find comfort. For our failures and our sins are just as real as his were. Like Abram, we need to turn away from our own works to rely on God alone. This is why "He [God] credited it to him [Abram] as righteousness."
- So how was Abram saved? Not by keeping the Ten Commandments, for they had not yet been given. He was saved by faith in God and His Word.

2. THE A	OF A P	(VV. 7-21
a. The P	of a Captivity	

• Abram was given a vision of his descendants' destiny. God put him in deep sleep and he saw a smoking firepot and a blazing torch that symbolized the glory of God (i.e., the pillars of fire and cloud in Exodus 14:24) that would accompany Israel in the exodus. This is confirmed by vv. 13-16, which predict captivity in Egypt and the exodus. God's timescale for His promises was a long one. Abram was losing patience that little had happened in ten years (*Genesis 12:4, 16:16*) since the promise, but God was thinking in terms of 400 years! (v. 13)

a.	The P	of a Covenant

### FINAL THOUGHTS

So what do you do when God's promises and their fulfillment seem a distant reality? You remember Abram. Abram could have cried out "I can't!" and he would have been right. Instead, Abram believed "God can!" and again, he was right. This perspective, which sees God as the touchstone of reality, is to characterize our faith. Faith understands that physical and other limitations do not apply to God, because God is the underlying reality. Whatever the circumstances, God can bring to pass what He promises.

As we learn to live by Abram's kind of faith, facing each test and trial with our eyes on God and His trustworthiness, God works to produce actual righteousness in us. The Holy Spirit produces in our lives the fruit of righteousness (*Galatians 5:18–23*) and creates in us the very holiness God promised will be ours

### THE GOSPEL

"Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."

(1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

### THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD
