We Needed a Savior, God Gave Himself

Today's Message (16/17 December 2017) / *Selected Bible Verses*

December 24 & 31 (Sun.) Christmas & New Year's Eve Two services only: 10 to 11:30 a.m. and 5 to 6:30 p.m. The last song that the choir just sang for us so beautifully kept repeating the same phrase, over and over: "We needed a Savior; God gave Himself." But what does that really mean?

1. WE NEEDED A SAVIOR, THAT'S WHY GOD PROMISED HE WOULD COME.

"For to us a Child is born, to us a Son is given, and the government will be on His shoulders. And He will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." — **Isaiah 9:6**

2. WE NEEDED A SAVIOR, THAT'S WHY GOD GAVE UP HIS PRIVILEGES AS GOD-KING TO BECOME LIKE ONE OF US.

"[Jesus], being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made Himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness." — **Philippians 2:6-7**

3. WE NEEDED A SAVIOR, THAT'S WHY GOD GAVE HIMSELF TO DIE FOR US ON THE CROSS.

"Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous man, though for a good man someone

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might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates His own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." — Romans 5:7-8

But why did Jesus have to die? Because we all have sinned, and are supposed to die for our sins: **"For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,"** (*Romans 3:23*) and **"The wages of sin is death"** (*Romans 6:23*)...

But Jesus died in our place instead: **"But God demonstrates His own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us"** (*Romans 5:8*).

SO WHAT MUST I DO TO BE FORGIVEN OF MY SINS AND HAVE ETERNAL LIFE?

Jesus went into Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God. "The time has come," He said. "The kingdom of God is near. **Repent and believe the good news!**" — Mark 1:14-15

We are not saved by saying certain words, like a magic formula, but by the attitude of our hearts, which God alone can see. But to help explain what "repent and believe" means, here is a sample prayer, which you can make your very own if you pray it with a sincere heart:

Lord Jesus, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. I believe you died for me on the cross, and I accept your sacrificial death for me, as my Savior. I surrender my life to you and ask that you be my Lord forever, Amen.

If you prayed something similar to the thoughts in this prayer and you meant every word, God heard it! And He now calls you His precious, forgiven, accepted child from this day on. Please let us know about this so we can help you

John announced: "And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth" (*John 1:14*).

For thousands of years, mankind have tried to relate to a God who is basically invisible, unseen in our physical world. But on that first Christmas eve we had God manifested as flesh for the first time—a baby, born of a virgin in a manger, in a little town called Bethlehem (in Israel). His name is Jesus, the Christ: "He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation" (*Colossians 1:15*).

God wants to be known to mankind. The infinite God, the almighty Creator of all, "came down" to dwell among finite humans. We today have this privilege of looking back in time and see how Jesus, Emmanuel ('God with us') had accomplished His mission on earth. Now we can celebrate the Gospel and enjoy its benefits—a right relationship with God and a position to grown in close fellowship with Him here and even beyond.

Those of us who have trusted Christ as God and Savior have all the more reason to celebrate this time of the year. Regardless of our circumstance, God is with us. Our present life journey is secure and may be marked by peace and deep joy despite the varying challenges we are in. His presence indeed is enough.

As you celebrate this year, make sure that aside from personally celebrating, do it with your small group in church or even outside of the GCF community. Make that light in your collective lives shine as Good News to those who have yet to discover it. Spend time with friends and the community to spread the gospel of Christmas.

I have been noticing that the Christmas season, even in our country, is getting shorter and shorter. We as Christians ought to keep the spirit of Christmas and the celebration alive. Perhaps beyond the traditional practices that often times keep people extra busy and financially weighed down, we can come up with alternative ways to preserve the celebration of the true significance of this season of the year.

In the remainder of the Christmas season this year, be sure to spend time with loved ones, friends, and the community, and celebrate the true essence of the season: Emmanuel, God with us, in the person of Christ. Jesus, when He came down as a man, has made God's perfect love understandable to finite creatures like us. Share Him and His good news with others this Christmas!
