# You are Part of a Bigger Purpose (The Church and You)

God's plan of redemption began with Israel. God made clear that He was going to bring people from every nation into a loving relationship with Himself, and chose a specific nation to be the vessel through whom He would fulfill that. When God launched that initiative, He gave that promise to Abraham (*Genesis 12:2-3; Genesis 18:18; 22:15,18; 26:4; 28:14*).

Israel would become that nation, but they were chosen to be a highway for God's blessing, not a dead end. Unfortunately, when God blesses people, the "dead end mentality" is a hard one to resist. That dead end mentality continued into the formation of the church.

### THE CHURCH IS A HIGHWAY, NOT A DEAD END

In Acts 15, the church leaders finally realized God meant what He said from the beginning—that He was committed to going global with this thing and that whoever didn't get on board would be left behind! (*Matthew 28:19, Acts 1:8*)

James concluded as he addressed the council: "It is my judgment, therefore, that we should not make it difficult for the Gentiles who are turning to God" (*Acts 15:19*). Thousands of years after the Bible was written, our job is not much different than the one God gave Abraham.

The Apostles were like us. Left to their own devices, they tended to make everything more difficult than it should be. So, before any further damage could be done, the Apostle Paul called them out.

Do our churches today suffer from that same dead end mentality? Do we show concern for the sense of hopelessness people all around us feel, or does our disinterest make it difficult for our neighbors and friends to see Jesus when they look at us?

## WHAT WILL EVENTUALLY HAPPEN TO THE OIKOS MOVEMENT? EVENTUALLY, WE HOPE TO:

- 1. **Begin New Groups.** New groups produce new growth. Regularly starting new groups increases our church's effectiveness in disciple making.
- 2. Start a New Church. Is a church really a New Testament church if it isn't planting churches? Being a New Testament church means believing and doing what the New Testament church did. The New Testament church was concerned with, engaged in, and successful at establishing new congregations. Church planting begins with the conviction that it is God's will that his church grow.
- **3. Reach across Cultures.** In the Great Commission Christ gave to us, the command in the original Greek is to disciple *panta ta ethne*, the ethnic units of humankind. A church concerned with responding to the Great Commission will not be able to overlook the vast numbers of people yet to be reached beyond the perimeters of its own small part of the world. Missions should be a priority of any church concerned with the Great Commission.

#### FINAL THOUGHTS

Can the Great Commission be fulfilled? We have come a long way since Christ left the apostles with such a seemingly impossible task. It is not a question of whether the Great Commission can be fulfilled. It is *being* fulfilled, because Christ promised to build His church and nothing can stop that. The question is whether you and GCF will be a part of it.

Will the Master return, as Christ illustrated in the Parable of the Talents, to find that you have hidden the treasure and have nothing to show? Or will he return to find the treasure left in your care to be multiplied through faithful investment, so He will then say to you, "Well done, good and faithful servant"? Remember this: the faithful will always be fruitful, but the fruitless will be judged ■

## DISCIPLE-MAKING GROUPS (DMG)

We introduce this year the ministry of our Disciple-Making Groups (DMG), which aims to make our Growth Groups and other small groups in the church intentional in disciple-making. We simply define "disciple-making" as the process of moving people from community to congregation and then to being consecrated, that they might repeat the entire process in others also (2 Timothy 2:2).

As headed by six pastoral staff, the DMG is subdivided into the following:

(1) Children; (2) ICS; (3) Youth; (4) Young Adults/Sports and Ortigas Center; (5) Mid-Adults, Connect, and Quezon City/San Juan; and (6) Men, Couples, Women and Seniors. In fulfilling their shepherding role to the flock, both the pastors and elders will work together in looking after the spiritual welfare of each of the Disciple-making Groups by feeding (teaching God's Word), leading (life-on-life mentoring), and caring (visiting and praying) for them, with the support of our deacons and deaconesses. The end-goal of this partnership among church leaders in the DMG is to improve more our member-care and produce more new church members, ministry servants, and small group leaders who will repeat the entire process in others also. Pray for it and participate!

# From life-on-life discipleship to compassionate leadership

I remember how I had one of my earliest glimpses of what it's like to be part of a spiritual community: I was just a kid attending Vacation Bible School (VBS), and it really struck me how "cool" it was that the church's youth ministry volunteered to serve kids.

That is one of the things that motivated me to get involved in the youth ministry. But I realized that more than these activities and programs, I was able to grow in my love for the Lord and His people because of the relationships and the community that I found there. I learned a lot not just because we were *taught*, but more importantly because lives were *shared* with us—lives of our kuyas and ates who spent time with us, listened to us, and genuinely loved us.

This genuine love showed all the more as I and some of my friends were encouraged to lead others also. I particularly remember how Ate Chette King shared her vision for us, that someday we, too, might be involved in mentoring and teaching others. I was insecure back then, but knowing that someone prays for me, trusts me, and is very much willing to help me in the process gave me confidence that such a task is something God wants me to do.

Now as a pastor, I try to pay forward the love and kindess shown to me by being a kuya ready to listen and love our young people who are embattled by a demanding world. It is incredibly difficult, but I draw strength from Christ who incredibly loved me, and who ultimately inspired my kuyas and ates to love me also ■

### God's Way to Heaven

#### THE GOSPEL

"Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."

(1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

#### THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD

**God is holy and righteous:** "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty, the whole earth is full of his glory" (*Isaiah 6:3*). **He requires holiness of us as well:** "Be holy, for I am holy" (*1 Peter 1:16*).

#### THE TRUTH ABOUT MAN

Man is sinful: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (*Romans 3:23*).

Sin demands a penalty: "For the wages of sin is death" (*Romans 6:23*).

#### THE TRUTH ABOUT CHRIST

Christ is the expression of God's love for us: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). Christ paid the penalty of our sins and died for sinners: "For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God" (1 Peter 3:18). Through Christ, God offers man

reconciliation: "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins against them" (2 Corinthians 5:18).

#### WHAT SHOULD WE DO?

Believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (*Romans 10:9*).

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. I believe that you died on the cross in my place, to save me from my sins, and I accept you as my Savior, and the Master of my life forever. Amen.
