# **Abraham and Abimelech**

**Today's Message** (7/8 April 2018) / Genesis 20

BY PROTECTING SARAH. WE SEE THAT GOD'S SOVEREIGN PLAN REGARDING THE SON OF PROMISE COULD NOT BE DFRAILED EVEN BY THE FAILURES OF HIS PEOPLE. SIMILARLY, WITH ALL OUR FOLLIES AND FOIBLES. YOUR FUTURE AS A BELIEVER IS GUARANTEED BY THE SOVEREIGN GRACE OF GOD.

Like he did in Egypt (see Genesis 12:10-20), Abraham lied to King Abimelech of Gerar about Sarah to save himself, using again the half-truth that Sarah was his sister. This foolish decision not only damaged his testimony, but endangered Abimelech, the king of Gerar, as well as Sarah herself and the future "son of promise."

We must realize that our sins often have roots in the past, yet do their damage in the present—but praise God, His sovereign grace secures our future (*Romans* 8:28).

In all of these, we must not forget that even as believers our failings hurt those who are not yet God's people, as we see from this narrative that God cares for them, too:

# 1. THE <u>RECURRENCE</u> OF A <u>DECEPTION</u>: ABRAHAM'S LIE AND GOD'S PRESERVATION OF SARAH (VV. 1-7)

- Habits of sin are hard to break. Abraham makes the same mistake he once did, and for the same reason—fear. Despite this, we see God divinely protecting Sarah from Abimelech.
- By protecting Sarah, we see that God's sovereign plan regarding the son of promise could not be derailed even by the failures of his people. Similarly, with all our follies and foibles, your future as a believer is guaranteed by the sovereign grace of God (*Romans* 8:28-30).

### 2. THE <u>REBUKE</u> OF A <u>DECEIVER</u>: ABRAHAM IS SOUNDLY REPROVED BY ABIMELECH (VV. 8-13)

• The events here reveal that the consequences of a believer's sin often impacts even the innocent people around them (*Jonah 1:3-15*).

## **Abraham and Abimelech**

**Today's Message** (7/8 April 2018) / Genesis 20

• Some recurrent sins may be traced to poor decisions we made in the past, or because we got away with the same sin in the past. Rebuke, exposure, and even discipline are greater blessings than we admit. Like Hebrews 12:11 says, "No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later however, it produces a harvest of *righteousness and peace* for those who have been trained by it."

Pity those professing believers who "always seem to get away with it". They won't.

# 3. THE <u>RESTORATION</u> OF A <u>DISASTER</u>: GOD'S VINDICATION AND HEALING OF ABIMELECH (VV. 14-18)

- The doctrine of common grace teaches that God's goodness extends even to unbelievers. We see this in the way God restores the family of Abimelech from the disaster Abraham brought upon them. One purpose of common grace is revealed in Romans 2:4 when it asks: "do you show contempt for the riches of his kindness, tolerance and patience, not realizing that God's kindness leads you toward repentance?"
- The story closes with one of the clearest examples of the power of intercessory prayer in the Bible (*cf. Job 42:8-10*). As with Job and Abraham, your prayers for others are more valuable than you think.

#### FINAL THOUGHTS

Even believers today struggle with repeated sins, many of which are rooted in unresolved issues of the past. Sometimes we also walk in fear instead of faith, and we commit further mistakes, like Abraham. And more often than not, they hurt more people than we realize.

The Bible consistently teaches that the antidote to fear is faith. As you walk in faith, may it rid you of the fear that often leads you to failure. As you do, be assured that no matter what happens, God's sovereign grace is always greater than our failures ■

The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. - Mark 1:1 (ESV)

There are two kinds of stories, and two kinds of readers. One kind of story seek to entertain, even distract its audience. Such stories assume that their readers are mere onlookers, passive spectators. We experience this in movies, news, and political speeches. The performers keep a safe distance between the performance and the audience.

The other kind of story intends to change its audience. It appeals to readers to engage the story. In reading it, they also let the story read them, eventually being part of it. The gospel story of Jesus is like this. It invites us to reflect and process its witness to His truth and His person. As we do, we are ushered into the community of His kingdom, and into a journey of transformation.

During the time of the apostles, the word 'gospel' was associated with Roman propaganda. News of military victories or birth of a new emperor was heralded "good news" throughout the empire. It treated Caesar a god as it bannered Pax Romana, Roman Peace—a symbol of conquest, control and subjugation, a picture of world power.

Contrast that with how Mark used 'gospel'. It echoes the first words of the creation story, the beginning. It retells God's rule and creative work in the world, now in the truth and person of Jesus Christ. It banners peace, but in terms of restoration, communion, and reconciliation, the reality of God's sovereignty. Living in God's kingdom, joining God's story, let us carry with us the message of His gospel. May we be living stories of Jesus'

peace—restoring, communing, and reconciling the world to His

# God's Way to Heaven

### THE GOSPEL

"Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."

(1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

### THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD

God is holy and righteous: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty, the whole earth is full of his glory" (*Isaiah 6:3*). He requires holiness of us as well: "Be holy, for I am holy" (*1 Peter 1:16*).

#### THE TRUTH ABOUT MAN

Man is sinful: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (*Romans 3:23*). Sin demands a penalty: "For the wages of sin is death" (*Romans 6:23*).

### THE TRUTH ABOUT CHRIST

Christ is the expression of God's love for us: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (*Romans 5:8*). Christ paid the penalty of our sins and died for sinners: "For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God" (*1 Peter 3:18*). Through Christ, God offers man reconciliation: "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins

# against them" (2 Corinthians 5:18). WHAT SHOULD WE DO?

Believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (Romans 10:9).

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. I believe that you died on the cross in my place, to save me from my sins, and I accept you as my Savior, and the Master of my life forever. Amen.
