WELCOME

A Time for **Assembly** *Introduction* to gather together through an ice breaker (10 minutes)

To start: Share briefly an instance when your parents had to withhold something from you.

WORSHIP

A Time for Adoration

Inspiration to worship God through invocation, thanksgiving, and reading of Scripture (25 minutes)

Scripture Reading: Genesis 22:1-19

WORD

A Time for **Admonition**

Instruction to communicate one's investigation of the story (content), interpretation based on the setting (context), and integration of the two for the spiritual truth (concept) (50 minutes)

- 1. How could Abraham have gone ahead in sacrificing Isaac and still trust God to fulfill his covenant (22:1-5)? Read Hebrews 11:17-19.
- Did God tempt Abraham to commit something that violated His own command? Read Leviticus 18:21, Deuteronomy 12:31, and James 2:20-22. What did Abraham affirm by his willingness to sacrifice his son?
- 3. How did Abraham and Isaac illustrate the relationship between God the Father and God the Son? According to Jesus, what did Abraham see? Read John 8:56-58.
- 4. It is only here that the Bible recorded God swearing by His own name (22:16-18). What did God affirm? Read Hebrews 6:13-14.

5. Why would we sacrifice our own plans and desires for God's own plans and desires?

WALK

A Time for **Accountability**

Invitation to apply the implication of the Scripture (connect), implementation of a specific action (condúct), and intercession for the saints/seekers (concern) (about 35 minutes)

- 1. What is the hardest test of faith that you have ever been through? How has God been teaching you that you can trust him?
- 2. What is one thing that God wants you to surrender to him right now?
- 3. How is God proving himself to you as the God who provides?
- 4. How can the group pray for you? Share now your personal needs or concerns with your accountability and prayer partners. These may include attitudes that need to be changed and/or specific actions to be done in obedience to God's Word. As you intercede for each other, pray also for others outside the group who need to know Jesus.
