A Time for **Assembly**

Scripture Reading: Genesis 25:1-11

WORD

A Time for Admonition

Instruction to communicate one's investigation of the story (content), interpretation based on the setting (context), and integration of the two for the spiritual truth (concept) (50 minutes)

- Why was Keturah's status as a "wife" of Abraham lower than that of Sarah's (25:1-4)? Read 1 Chronicles 1:32.
- 2. How did God fulfill his covenant with Abraham up to the last stage of his life (25:2-4)?
- 3. Abraham had many sons with Keturah and one with Hagar. What did he do to acknowledge Isaac as his blessed heir (25:5-6)?
- What is the significance of Abraham's remains being buried in the cave of Machpelah (25:9,10)? Read Matthew 22:31,32 and Matthew 8:11.

WALK

A Time for **Accountability**

Invitation to apply the implication of the Scripture (connect), implementation of a specific action (condúct), and intercession for the saints/seekers (concern) (about 35 minutes)

- 1. How can parents leave a godly legacy to their children?
- 2. How do you plan to live your retirement years to keep on giving glory to God?
- 3. How can the group pray for you? Share now your personal needs or concerns with your accountability and prayer partners. These may include attitudes that need to be changed and/or specific actions to be done in obedience to God's Word. As you intercede for each other, pray also for others outside the group who need to know Jesus.
