The Replacement of the Lost Ark

Today's Message (6/7 October 2018) / Exodus 25:10–22, 37:1–9

WHAT A GOD WE HAVE! HE CHOSE TO STOOP VERY LOW AND TO HUMBLE HIMSELE FOR THE SAKE OF HIS WANDERING PEOPLE IN THE WILDERNESS. EVEN MORE. HE CHOSE TO STOOP AND TO HUMBLE HIMSELF FOR US IN HIS SON. JESUS CHRIST, AND THEN TO STOOP AS LOW AS DEATH The Raiders of the Lost Ark portrayed the Ark of the Covenant as a special weapon, unrelated to the Biblical portrayal of God. But there is no great mystery as to why the Ark of the Covenant is truly special. Rather than relying on Hollywood for our theology, our understanding of the Ark should be shaped by Scripture. Our passage tells us why it has significance for Israel, and for us as the people of God today. How did God use the Ark of the Covenant to teach people about Himself?

1. THE ARK OF THE COVENANT R_____ THE P_____ OF GOD.

- The tabernacle was constructed so that the LORD would be among His people (*Exodus 25:8*). But in a more specific way, the Ark served to reveal the very presence of God: "...between the two cherubim that are over the Ark of the Testimony, I will meet with you" (*Exodus 25:22*). The Ark of the Covenant (*Exodus 25:10–22, 37:1–9*) was the only furniture within the Holy of Holies. It was a wooden chest, overlaid with pure gold that contained the Ten Commandments.
- The eternal God who is not constrained by time, the omnipresent God who is not bound by space, and the transcendent God who fills all time and space condescended to the weakness of His people and showed Himself for their benefit in one place. Everywhere, yet there! The fact that the Ark was the place of God's presence among His people brought them great assurance. This high, lofty, and majestic King dwelt among His grumbling, bickering, and sinful people (*Exodus* 15:24, 16:2,8,9,12, 17:2).
- The promise to the new-covenant believer is that the Lord is near to us by the power of the Holy Spirit, who dwells in us (*1 Corinthians 6:19*), as Jesus promised (*John 14:16*).

- How could a holy God dwell in the midst of a sinful people? How could a sinful people approach a holy God and not die (*Leviticus 10:1–3*)? That brings us to an important term: **propitiation**. Propitiation is the act by which God's wrath is turned away from us.
- God gave a distinct set of instructions for the Ark's lid, which was a slab of pure gold (*Exodus 25:17–22*). This lid was the place of propitiation, the place where the wrath of God was turned away from His people, by the blood of animal sacrifices offered once a year.
- As new-covenant believers, we know these yearly sacrifices were only pictures of the propitiation of God's wrath. We see the powerlessness of these in Hebrews 9:13–14. Just as Jesus alone can cleanse the soul and conscience, He alone can turn away the wrath of God, since He is our propitiation (*Romans 3:25; 1 John 2:2, 4:10*).

3. THE ARK OF THE COVENANT R_____ ABOUT P_____ TO GOD.

- Because of propitiation, because of the sacrifices offered on the Mercy Seat in their
 place, God's people then could plead with God in prayer, knowing that He would
 answer them.
- Today, perhaps one of the greatest teachings of the Ark is that the Mercy Seat is also the Throne of Grace: "Let us then approach the throne of grace with confidence, that we may receive mercy" (*Hebrews 4:16*).
- We fail to marvel at the idea that when we pray, Christ intercedes for us and we are before the throne of God itself—the Mercy Seat. How much time do we spend in prayer? I believe that the absence of prayer in our life is a failure to realize fully the significance of the truths presented to us in the Ark of the Covenant.

FINAL THOUGHTS

What a God we have! He chose to stoop very low and to humble Himself for the sake of His wandering people in the wilderness. Even more, He chose to stoop and to humble Himself for us in His Son, Jesus Christ, and then to stoop as low as death: "He humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross" (*Philippians 2:8*). Jesus has taken the place of the Ark and all it stands for. What a God we have; what a God has us!

May the reality of the Presence of God and the Propitiation of God drive us to fervent prayer to our God \blacksquare

GCF PRAYER GATHERINGS AT THE CHAPEL

The GCF Hour of Prayer Tuesdays, 6:00 to 7:00 a.m. Midweek Prayer Service Wednesdays, 7 to 8:30 p.m. We tend to equate holiness in terms of distance or proximity. We think that the divine God is far removed from our mundane lives. If we are ever to revere His holiness, we must keep our distance or go through purity rituals if we want to draw near. This mindset causes us to view life as either secular or spiritual. We draw lines that exclude those we deem unworthy of the divine.

This has been the case in Mark's time. With Israel's history of being in exile, they started to think that it was their disobedience to the purity laws that caused the loss of their independence as a nation. Longing for national revival, there arose a movement that imposed strict observance of the law and a temple-centered religiosity. They considered the temple as evidence of God's presence and national identity. So long as the temple stands, so does God's favor.

Such movements gave birth to a piety that became more concerned with religious piety over compassion. Forgetting God's promise to Abraham, "Through your offspring all the families of the earth will be blessed" (*Genesis 22:18*), it seemed that their business is to simply keep the blessings to themselves.

We now see Jesus, the Human One, breaking this mold of society. As the One given authority of God's presence, He announces God's rule, erasing the lines that separate the mundane from the spiritual. He pioneers a movement that goes from being a temple-centered religiosity to being a people-centered lifestyle. As opposed to having God's ministry directed towards the temple, He announced the good news that goes out to the outcast and the unworthy. With His authority, He brought the life-giving and forgiving presence of God alive to the people far removed from the temple-state society. Witnessing God's work, the people are left amazed and they glorified God \blacksquare

Sowing (in kids' hearts) now, reaping later

As a child, I also grew up attending the Sunday School in GCF, and God has used my teachers to help me have a good foundation in my spiritual life. I am grateful that the Lord has now given me the opportunity to be part of this ministry.

This past year, we've been teaching the children the Inductive Bible Study by Precepts. It has been a helpful tool for them to learn how to read, observe, understand and apply the Bible for themselves. God's Way to Heaven

THE GOSPEL

"Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."

(1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD

God is holy and righteous: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty, the whole earth is full of his glory" (*Isaiah 6:3*). **He requires holiness of us as well:** "Be holy, for I am holy" (*1 Peter 1:16*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT MAN

Man is sinful: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (*Romans 3:23*). Sin demands a penalty: "For the wages of sin is death" (*Romans 6:23*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT CHRIST

Christ is the expression of God's love for us: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). Christ paid the penalty of our sins and died for sinners: "For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God" (1 Peter 3:18). Through Christ, God offers man reconciliation: "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins

against them" (2 Corinthians 5:18). WHAT SHOULD WF DO?

Believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (*Romans 10:9*).

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. I believe that you died on the cross in my place, to save me from my sins, and I accept you as my Savior, and the Master of my life forever. Amen.
