The Life-giving Bread on the Lord's Table

Bread is considered one of life's staple foods. Throughout recorded history it has been a prominent food in large parts of the world, and is one of the oldest manmade foods. It is life's main source and nourishment. It comes in different shapes and types. As commonly seen in bakeshops, you have round, oblong, and flat. A variety of such includes white, wheat, multigrain, rye, pita, pumpernickel, tortilla, and many other Italian and French bread that are hard to pronounce. But nothing, of course, beats the Pinoy *pandesal*, the most known Filipino bread of all time. But there is one more kind of bread that shapes our story, and that is the unleavened bread served on the Lord's table.

Bread is mentioned many times in the Scripture having special meaning in various aspects of the spiritual heritage of Israel and provides a special role within the practice of Jewish worship like "the bread of the Presence" ("showbread" in KJV), which is so-called because it was placed before God's presence in the Holy Place of the tabernacle (*Exodus 25:30*). It is the consecrated bread made from the finest flour only to be eaten by the priests before the Lord. Then in the New Testament, an ordinary bread was used at the Last Supper. And yet both bread symbolize only the same thing. The Life-Giving Bread on the Lord's Table points to Christ. Our passage tells us its implication for God's people before and us today. How did God reveal Himself through the Life-Giving Bread?

1. THE BREAD ON THE TABERNACLE'S TABLE: POINTS FORWARD TO THE LIFE-GIVER (CHRIST WHO WILL GIVE LIFE)

• God gives Moses exact materials and measurements for the table of the bread (*Exodus 25:23-30*). It is to be made out of acacia wood overlaid with gold. It is to be three feet long, 1.5 feet wide, and 2.25 feet high. As Criswell notes: "The acacia wood

is a product of the earth. It is a picture of the humanity of our Lord. And the gold, of course, is a type of the deity of our Savior: the God-Man, Christ Jesus."

• Twelve loaves of the bread of Presence (representing the twelve tribes of Israel), baked fresh weekly, are to be placed on the table each Sabbath day (*Leviticus 24:5-9*). The old bread would be removed, and new hot bread put in its place continually. That is why it is also called "the continual bread." The Showbread was to be continually renewed, and so the Word of God must frequently be reintroduced in our lives (*John 5:39*). The priest lived upon the Showbread. He receives strength and stamina. We receive satisfaction and sustenance in Christ as we eat of the Bread of Life (*John 6:27,35,51*).

2. THE BREAD ON THE COMMUNION TABLE: POINTS BACKWARD AND FORWARD TO THE LIFE-GIVER (CHRIST WHO GAVE HIS LIFE AND WILL GIVE US LIFE)

• The name and story of Jesus being the Bread of Life, is often attached to the taking of communion (*1 Corinthians 11:23-26*). The bread on the communion table is just a symbol of the body of Christ which suffered and died on the cross because of our sins. When we partake it we commemorate or look back to His death and at the same time anticipate or look forward to His return. As we celebrate communion, may we be grateful to Him for what He has done for us and at the same time be excited to see the Life-Giver someday who promised us eternal life.

FINAL THOUGHTS

In his book entitled "God's Psychiatry," Charles Allen tells this story. As World War II was drawing to a close, the Allied armies gathered up many hungry orphans. They were placed in camps where they were well-fed. Despite excellent care, they slept poorly. They seemed nervous and afraid. Finally, a psychologist came up with the solution. Each child was given a piece of bread to hold after he was put to bed. This particular piece of bread was just to be held—not eaten. The piece of bread produced wonderful results. The children went to bed knowing instinctively they would have food to eat the next day. That guarantee gave the children a restful and contented sleep.

What can be notable about this bread is that it wasn't bread for the stomach, but bread for the soul. Their stomachs were already full. But a deeper hunger and need was at hand. A need to find security and satisfaction of soul. If you want peace and comfort for your soul no matter what tomorrow may bring, hold on to the Bread of Life. Always remember that the Life-Giving Bread on the Lord's Table points to Christ who gives you life by giving His own life for you!

A COMMUNION REFLECTION: "IT IS FINISHED!"

Jesus' greatest victory came when people thought he had his greatest defeat.

Jesus did not say, "It is finished" in a defeated voice. He said it as one who shouts for joy, as one who won a victory. "It is finished" is one word in Greek, tetelestai. It is in the perfect tense: "It is finished, it stands finished, and it always will be finished." When a bondslave was reporting to his master, tetelestai meant "I have completed the work you gave me to do" (John 17:4). When a priest examined a lamb for sacrifice, tetelestai meant it was perfectly worthy. But the most significant use of tetelestai was by businessmen to mean: "It has been paid in full." Since Jesus Christ paid in full, the work of salvation is now complete. Since Jesus Christ paid in full, all efforts to add anything to what Christ did on the cross are doomed to fail.

Jesus died because of us. And at the point where his enemies thought

He lost it all, he won it all. Jesus fully met the righteous demands of a Holy God and His law and paid our debt in full. The blood of animals could never take away sins; their blood only covered sin. But the Lamb of God shed His blood, and His blood can take away the sins of the world. Hebrews 9:26-28 says, "He has appeared once for all at the end of the ages to do away with sin by the sacrifice of himself. Just as man is destined to die once. and after that to face judgment, so Christ was sacrificed once to take away the sins of many people."

How should a Christian respond to this? How should we then live? 2 Corinthians 5:15 tells us that "He died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for Him who died for them and was raised again."

Remember what Jesus did for us. Never forget what it cost Him. Because it cost Him everything, following Him may also cost you everything. And only those willing to accept that are truly His •

THE GOSPEL

"Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."

(1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD

God is holy and righteous: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty, the whole earth is full of his glory" (*Isaiah 6:3*). **He requires holiness of us as well:** "Be holy, for I am holy" (*1 Peter 1:16*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT MAN

Man is sinful: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (*Romans 3:23*). Sin demands a penalty: "For the wages of sin is death" (*Romans 6:23*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT CHRIST

Christ is the expression of God's love for us: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). Christ paid the penalty of our sins and died for sinners: "For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God" (1 Peter 3:18). Through Christ, God offers man reconciliation: "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins against them" (2 Corinthians 5:18).

WHAT SHOULD WE DO?

Believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (*Romans 10:9*).

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. I believe that you died on the cross in my place, to save me from my sins, and I accept you as my Savior, and the Master of my life forever. Amen.
