What 'God With Us' Means

Today's Message (22/23 December 2018) / 1 *John 1:1-4*

CHRISTMAS
MEANS THAT
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PERSONALLY.

The other name of Jesus is Immanuel, "God with us" (*Matthew 1:23*). This passage may not seem like a Christmas text, because it is not about Jesus' birth. But in fact, the apostle John is giving us all the implications of what "God with us" means. This passage is a precise account of what Christmas really stands for:

1. CHRISTMAS MEANS YOU CAN HAVE LIFE FROM GOD (vv. 1-2).

¹That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched—this we proclaim concerning the Word of life. ²The life appeared; we have seen it and testify to it, and we proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and has appeared to us.

- In verse 1, Jesus is "the Word of life," then verse 2 says, "Eternal life...was with the Father and has appeared to us." Jesus Christ doesn't merely *have* eternal life or gives it. Jesus *Himself* is eternal life. To unite with Him by faith and to know Him in love, is to have life. There is nothing else for you to achieve or attain.
- In this passage we find three of the five *solas* on which the entire Reformation was based:
 - Sola Gratia: We are saved by the grace of God alone.
 - Sola Fide: We are saved through faith alone in Jesus Christ.
 - *Solus Christus:* Jesus Christ alone is our Lord, Savior, and King.
- You can believe in the truth of Christmas—that you are saved by grace alone through faith alone, in Christ alone. You can become someone humbled out of pride but affirmed and loved out of insecurity—then given eternal life.

What 'God With Us' Means

Today's Message (22/23 December 2018) / 1 *John 1:1-4*

• If Christmas is a nice myth, then you are on your own, in the worst sense possible. But if Christmas is true—as John vows that it is—then you are saved by Christ alone. Here is the sworn statement of John: "which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched—this we proclaim...we have seen it and testify to it, and we proclaim to you..."

2. CHRISTMAS MEANS THAT YOU CAN LIVE WITH GOD (vv. 3-4).

³We proclaim to you what we have seen and heard, so that you also may have fellowship with us. And our fellowship is with the Father and with His Son, Jesus Christ. ⁴We write this to make our joy complete.

John had insisted on the veracity of Jesus' existence, which means Jesus was born, lived, died, resurrected, and is returning. That's what he "proclaims." Then in verses 3-4 he describes the point of all his proclamation:

- The Heart of God: Christmas means you can have intimacy with God. When Moses pleaded to see God Himself, he was told he would die, yet in John 1:14, we are told that through Jesus, "We have seen His glory, the glory of the One and Only...full of grace and truth." Christmas means that God went to infinite lengths to make Himself one whom you can know personally. God is not content to be a "force" or someone you know from a distance.
- What's Fellowship with God For? For God's glory and your joy! Christmas means joy—"good news of great joy" (*Luke 2:10*). John is saying in verse 4, "My joy is incomplete 'til you have the same joy with God that we have." In John 16:22, Jesus promises that His followers' joy will be unending, because the "full measure" of Christ's own joy will be reproduced in us (*John 17:13*). God enjoys your joy.

FINAL THOUGHTS

The world fails to find Christian joy because the means to realizing it are so ordinary — that it begins with a humble plea like "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me a sinner". What an irony that Christmas is the one Christian event the world accepts, yet its meaning is the one it least understands.

Joy grows in believers over time through common, routine things—Bible meditation and prayer, obedience, worship attendance, serving Christians and neighbors, depending on Christ when suffering. And little by little faith will grow, and then our lives will come closer to God, our Source of joy \blacksquare

Merry Christmas! May you discover and delight in the eternal Source of joy!

Where you are now is your mission field

arlier this year, my sister Truthie took me to my very first short-term missions trip outside the country. This has been on my prayer list since 2013, back when my mom and sisters became involved with Wetfoot. Upon reaching Thailand, where my sister and I were tasked with teaching the kids of the missionaries, my heart beamed with so much joy at the sight of my prayers being answered.



I was assigned to the kids but I was also blessed to be able to talk to their parents about their ministry. I learned what brought them to missions, and what kind of work God is doing through them. These people were living my dream. I was raised in a family very invested and intentional in missions, and I grew up surrounded by people of different nationalities. And so far as I could remember, I dreamed of being a missionary, to be serving God in the field of missions outside the Philippines.

While still in Thailand, I prayed that God would allow me to come back. God answered. But this time, it was through the missionaries I met. I would often hear these missionaries encourage my sister and I to return and serve again. However, they would always look at me and speak of serving in the Philippines. It was interesting how I was in Thailand, and yet they encouraged me to minister to my fellow Filipinos. I prayed again that God would make things clearer for me to understand better. God answered. It happened again the next day, I shared to one of the parents of my class that I was thinking about being a full-time missionary after college. She responded, "You're in college? That's your mission field, right there."

God answers our prayers. It's just that, sometimes, we overlook it. I've been praying that God would allow me to go and serve Him in the "mission field." It turns out, He's already answered my prayers. Where I am now is my mission field. This is where God wants me to be, where He wants me to serve.

Sometimes, we pray and ask that God would send us out of the country to serve Him, and we get upset that He hasn't given us a 'yes'. That's probably because we're already in the mission field where He wants us to make Him known. Our *oikos*, our community, our school or workplace, those are our mission fields. May we heed God's call for us to be witnesses for Him right now and to follow how He leads us in our missionary journey, one step at a time
