Hope of the Holy

Today's Message (5/6 January 2019) / 1 Peter 1:1-25

WE HAVE THIS UNSHAKABLE HOPE BECAUSE OF THE TRUTH OF GOD'S WORD.

Holy does not mean perfect. Holy means set apart for God's purposes. As God's holy people, do we have the same hope as those who are not His children? As born-again Christians, what should we truly be hoping for that gives us optimism, not just for this coming year, but also for the rest of our lives? How should we live our challenging lives this New Year if we are truly confident in what we hope for? On what do we base these hopes? Do we have a solid foundation for that which we hope for?

Let Peter, the disciple of hope, teach us. In chapter 1 of his first epistle, Peter teaches us that believers rejoice in the hope of their salvation, can hope to live holy lives, and base their hopes in God's trustworthy Word.

1. VERSES 1-12: HOPE FROM OUR SOVEREIGN GOD WHO ELECTED US FOR SALVATION.

God is sovereign. God is in full control of His universe. He determines the outcome of all things according to His own wise plans and purposes. He governs history by His decrees including choosing those who will be saved by Him. Because God is sovereign, we can be secure in the hope He has promised.

- a. God is sovereign in election. He chose those whom He will save. By God's sovereign grace and mercy, He chose the elect to a new birth into a living hope and an eternal inheritance.
- b. God is sovereign in our protection. He shields those whom He is saving. As exiles and aliens in the world waiting for ultimate salvation, believers are shielded by God.
- c. God is sovereign in our salvation. He planned and purposed our salvation.

Principle: The believer's hope of salvation is sure and secure forever.

God is sovereignly accomplishing His plans and purposes. Nothing, no one, will thwart God. He will finish with flourish His wonderful work. Guaranteed. For sure we can be secure!! Forever!



Hope of the Holy

Today's Message (5/6 January 2019) / 1 Peter 1:1-25

2. VERSES 13-17: HOPE FROM OUR HOLY GOD WHO EXPECTS US TO BE HOLY.

The world is not the believer's home. It is often difficult to live as Christians in this world. Despite this, believers can hope to live holy lives. We can hope to be holy because

- a. God is gracious. Since we are already saved, with alert and sober minds, we can set our hope on the grace to be revealed when Christ returns.
- b. We are already holy. As we wait for Christ's return, we ought to live as obedient children of God. Believers are already holy and we need to work out that identity.
- c. God is holy. The holy "caller" is the holy enabler.

Principle: Believers can hope to be holy because God is holy.

Holy living on earth sometimes seem impossible. Even Peter failed. Having experienced the grace of our holy God, our brother who stood firm in the end, encourages us to be holy since God who called us is holy. He who calls is our example and He enables.

3. VERSES 18-24: HOPE FROM THE ETERNAL GOD WHO ENLIGHTENS US WITH HIS WORD.

Our hope is informed and enlightened by God's word. We know and believe because it is written in the Bible.

- a. The Bible gives us the knowledge we need. We know that we have been redeemed by Christ. We have faith and hope in God who we know raised Jesus from the dead.
- b. The Bible is true. God does not lie. Our faith is based on truth.
- c. The Bible is the living and enduring word of God. The knowledge and truth that save us, by which we are born again, are based on the what our living and eternal God said.
- d. The Bible needs to be preached. The gospel must be heard.

Our faith is based on the solid foundation of Scriptures. Everything we believe about God, our faith in the gospel, our unshakeable hope of our salvation and inheritance, our redemption in Christ, our being born again, of being holy—these we know and believe because we are informed by and trust in God's word.

Principle: The believer's hope is based on God's trustworthy Word.

CONCLUSION

For 2019, may our hopes be set higher than what most people wish for in a new year. Let us rejoice in the hope of our salvation, which our sovereign God chose to graciously give to you and me. Let us be certain with our identity as holy children and not waver in the hope that God will enable us to live holy lives. We have this unshakable hope because of the truth of God's word. This 2019, let us rejoice in the secure hope of our salvation. Let us live holy lives. Let us trust in God's word \blacksquare

For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. —Ephesians 2:10

The first pages of Scripture tell us the story of God's creation. Everything that He had made was good. And God decided that He will make humans in His own image. And it was so; both male and female was created in God's image.

But what does it mean to bear

God's image? When we read "God's image", we tend to form a mental picture of what we look like and then attribute this picture to God himself. But the Hebrew meaning of the word image concentrates

not on appearance but on function. This creation story emerged from a culture where a king was said to rule in the image of a particular god. The king was seen as the manifestation of a particular god on earth. If one wanted to see what a god looks like, you look at a king. In Scripture we find that there is something different about humans. Although not God, nor demi-gods, in some recognizable and deliberate way, God's image is placed in them. Human beings, from the beginning, reflect who God is.

Each one is called to rule and continue God's creative work. It was God's will on earth as it is in heaven.

But sin marred this image. Man wanted to rule in his own image. But it only brought discord, division, and death. But God, in His great love, for His creation, became flesh. Lived and restored humanity to its

Creator and created purpose. This is salvation. This is redemption.

God's Way to Heaven

THE GOSPEL

"Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures." (1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD

God is holy and righteous: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty, the whole earth is full of his glory" (*Isaiah 6:3*). **He requires holiness of us as well:** "Be holy, for I am holy" (*1 Peter 1:16*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT MAN

Man is sinful: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (*Romans 3:23*).Sin demands a penalty: "For the wages of sin is death" (*Romans 6:23*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT CHRIST Christ is the expression of God's love for us: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (*Romans 5:8*). Christ paid the penalty of our sins and died for sinners: "For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God" (*1 Peter 3:18*). Through Christ, God offers man reconciliation: "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins against them" (*2 Corinthians 5:18*).

WHAT SHOULD WE DO? Believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (*Romans 10:9*).

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. I believe that you died on the cross in my place, to save me from my sins, and I accept you as my Savior, and the Master of my life forever. Amen.
