# Your Worship is Holy and Heavenly

(The Account of the Tabernacle Construction)

**Today's Message** (2/3 February 2019) / Exodus 26

Where do you worship? In one sense, when as Christians we worship God as He commands in His Word, we are worshiping in the tabernacle. The book of Hebrews explains, "Therefore...since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that He opened for us through the curtain, that is, through His flesh, and since we have a great Priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience" (*Hebrews* 10:19–22).

As Christians, we move past beyond the great veil into the Holy of Holies. We do this because, on the cross, Jesus tore the veil in two (*Matthew 27:51*). As we look at the construction of the Tabernacle, we will learn in depth what it is to worship in the presence of God as we consider the tabernacle's holiness and heavenliness.

### 1. GOD'S TABERNACLE REMINDS US OF THE **HOLINESS** OF OUR WORSHIP.

- To worship in the tabernacle was to worship in a holy place and to experience the holy presence of God. This is seen in the materials used for its construction.
  - a. The Lord put the most unattractive curtains on the outside and the most attractive on the inside. This is typical of God, who often cloaks His glory in simplicity, His power in weakness, and His wisdom in foolishness to confound the unbeliever but to comfort the believer (*1 Corinthians 1:18–31*). Ultimately, He cloaked His majesty in flesh as His Son took on ordinary humanity (*Isaiah 53:2*). To come to the tabernacle was to come to the holy God Himself, hidden under the veils of the ordinary and earthly.
  - b. The fact that the camp was separated from the courtyard by a large screen all around, and that the tabernacle was itself set apart from the courtyard by its curtains, signifies the holiness of the tabernacle and its services. To come into the presence of God, then, is to come into the presence of His holiness.
- We learn from this that we must prepare our minds, our bodies, and our souls for worship. How should we go about preparing each?
  - a. We must prepare our minds. Look forward to the next Lord's Day. As the week draws near to its end, know that the "day" coming up is, in reality, "the Lord's Day" (*Revelation 1:10*).
  - b. We must prepare our bodies. Sunday morning must begin Saturday night. When the Israelites were about to meet God, they prepared their outward appearance by cleansing their garments (*Exodus 19:9–11*).
  - c. We must prepare our souls. All through the week we need to be meditating on what we heard on the Lord's Day and anticipating meeting again with the Lord the next Lord's Day.

As Christians, our heart's desire should be like David: "One thing have I asked of the

Lord...that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the Lord and to inquire in His temple" (*Psalms 27:4*). It is amazing that we live in the reality of what the Psalms anticipated. The Israelites lived in the time of anticipation, but we live in the time of participation!

### 2. GOD'S TABERNACLE REMINDS US OF THE <u>HEAVENLINESS</u> OF OUR WORSHIP.

To worship in the tabernacle was to worship in a heavenly place and to experience the heavenly presence of God. Worship in the presence of God is and should always be, otherworldly. There are three ways in which the tabernacle was heavenly.

- a. To enter the tabernacle was to enter a different world. The courtyard was screened off from the camp, and the tabernacle itself was screened off from laypeople. Likewise, when as new-covenant believers we worship, we are entering a preview of heaven.
- b. To build the tabernacle, Moses and those gifted by God with specific skills to make the Tabernacle had to follow God's instructions. Four times we hear similar words: "According to the plan for it that you were shown on the mountain" (*Exodus 25:9,40; 26:30; 27:4*). There was no place for creativity, variety, or to "keep it fresh" and "relevant."

Likewise, our worship is heavenly when it is done according to the Lord's Word. God in His Word teaches us to do three things when we come together on the Lord's Day. He wants us (*Acts 2:42*):

- To read and to preach His Word;
- To celebrate His ordinances (communion and baptism); and
- To pray

That's why we cannot evaluate worship by the standards of the world. God is not a commodity; He does not live to entertain us. He says the whole Lord's Day is His day, and when we step into worship, He says to us, "this day and all else: Mine."

c. The rear of the tabernacle was to the west (*Exodus 26:22,27*). Since the Israelites had their backs to the east and their faces to the west, they showed they were not worshipers of the sun, but of the Creator of the sun (*Psalm 74:16*).

#### FINAL THOUGHTS

God's holiness should frighten us. His heavenliness should cause reverence and awe in us. Who can stand before Him? Who can walk into God's presence on his own merits? But God is a God who helps the helpless, who finds the lost, who gives sight to the blind, who cleanses the filthy. He has given us access to His presence through Christ.

Do you desire to be clean so that you can enter the Holy of Holies? Do you long for heavenly life beyond the sin, frustration, and futility of this life? The way is Jesus Christ. "Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need" (Hebrews~4:16)

## GROWING PERSONALLY, REACHING OUTWARDLY

Our GCF anniversary theme for 2019 is "Growing Personally, Reaching Outwardly." This will be the focus of our anniversary next weekend, and is a summative statement of our Strategic Plan that Elder Ed Trono facilitated for the leadership during the last quarter of 2018.

But it is also a restatement of what you see overhead in our worship hall: Know Christ and Make Him Known.

"Loving God and loving others" last 2018 was simply a back-to-basics focus on what God commanded us to do, which, if followed, enables us to know Christ deeper and deeper.

And this year, "Growing personally" is "To Grow 'Till You Overflow." Your growth in loving God and loving others starts with loving God, then family, fellow believers, and reaching out to the lost. This can happen all at the same time!

The overflow results in reaching outwardly—making Him known! This overflow, reaching outwardly, is in two spheres: individually and corporately.

Individually means witnessing to your oikos, praying for them, befriending them, inviting them here. But this also means being always ready to witness during chance encounters, as 1 Peter 3:15 reminds

us: "Honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect."

Corporately means church planting primarily and foremost, but it also means becoming a more socially compassionate church, involving ourselves in the care of the oppressed and downtrodden. We are looking at partnering with missions organizations that minister to them, and they also need volunteers from us, not always financial support.

All of this jives with our GCF Mission—to make disciples of Jesus Christ in the Philippines and beyond and our Vision—to see lives and communities transformed for Christ.

I keep hearing some members say that they sense something stirring in the air, something exciting and positive to happen to GCF this 2019. Could it be because we are becoming a more prayerful church? Could God be driving personal revivals in our worshipers and leaders? Will it be a prelude to a church-wide revival? May God be glorified in whatever happens next. All I know is this: exciting times are ahead! ■

great hindrance to spiritual growth is self-determination and self-sufficiency. Faith becomes a subscription to an idea or belief, losing its relational and spiritual value. Defining rules and relying on one's own strength and capabilities, faith becomes something to serve the self's delight alone. Often, we make the mistake of seeing the journey of faith only within an individual and private level. Human nature always tends to stay within the comforts of what it can control. But all these at the cost of forgetting and losing sight of faith that is about a trusting and loving relationship—with

Fasting, along with prayer and acts of service, is a spiritual discipline where our focus from ourselves are transformed towards God and others. Prayer changes the focus of our minds, service shifts the focus of our heart, and fasting transforms the focus of our body. Fasting is about giving up, but the 'giving up' is sometimes reduced to mean giving up meals or

a favorite dessert, or even a favorite leisure as a sort of bargain with God. It also reduced to a practice as a show of external devotion or cosmetic piety, to appear to be holier than others. But the practice of fasting aims to get us out of our self-absorption.

In fasting we become aware of our bodies and the bodies of others, how God has provided and will provide for our and others' physical needs. It opens our hands to receive what is enough for the day, it opens our eyes to see the physical needs of others, and moves our feet to share as God also desires to provide for them.

In fasting we become aware of our bodies and how God will provide for our physical needs.

As followers of Jesus, we are always called out from our place of security and comfort to enter into a new and living way. Spiritual disciplines are but expressions of our willingness to answer that call. In our time of communion, and the start of our weeklong prayer and fasting, let us always remember that we belong to a bigger body, that is, of Christ. Let us express our devotion by looking after the needs of another. Just as Christ made His body available to serve others, let us become His body now that serves those who are in need

#### THE GOSPEL

"Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."

(1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

#### THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD

**God is holy and righteous:** "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty, the whole earth is full of his glory" (*Isaiah 6:3*). **He requires holiness of us as well:** "Be holy, for I am holy" (*1 Peter 1:16*).

#### THE TRUTH ABOUT MAN

Man is sinful: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (*Romans 3:23*). Sin demands a penalty: "For the wages of sin is death" (*Romans 6:23*).

#### THE TRUTH ABOUT CHRIST

Christ is the expression of God's love for us: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). Christ paid the penalty of our sins and died for sinners: "For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God" (1 Peter 3:18). Through Christ, God offers man reconciliation: "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins

# against them" (2 Corinthians 5:18). WHAT SHOULD WF DO?

Believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (*Romans 10:9*).

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. I believe that you died on the cross in my place, to save me from my sins, and I accept you as my Savior, and the Master of my life forever. Amen.
