This psalm is part of a larger hymn of praise that David sang on bringing the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem in 1 Chronicles 16:8-36 (especially vv. 23-33). As we open Missions Month, it serves as a great reminder that God's plan never changed from the Old Testament to the New: to declare His glory among the nations, and to establish His reign over all the earth, and we are His instruments for that. Whenever we pray "Your kingdom come, Your will be done" we are actually committing ourselves to that intention of God. What does God want from every church and believer alike?

- b. Proclaim His s_____ (vv. 3, 6): Tell everyone about his glory, majesty, strength and beauty.
 - Verse 3 is a reiteration of the promise made to Abraham (*Genesis 12:1-3*) and a call to world missions (*Matthew 28:16-20*). It is the Old Testament anticipation of the world mission of the New Testament people of God.
- c. Proclaim His s_____ (vv. 3, 6): Tell people of what He has done in the Bible, in your life and in others' lives.
- d. Proclaim His s_____ (vv. 4-5, 10): God alone is worthy of our praise and reverence, and judges all people fairly.

- a. Give g____to God ($\nu\nu$. 7-8): All nations should recognize God and give Him the glory He deserves.
- b. Give g_____to God (vv. 8-9): All nations should worship God in His splendor and tremble before Him.
- c. Give g_____to God (vv. 11-13): All nature shows the way for believers to worship God with praise and thanksgiving for His righteous reign to come.

Verse 13 is one of the clearest and most thrilling revelations that God will rule on the earth, not just from heaven. He will do so in the person of His Son when He returns to earth. He came the first time to save the world. He will come the second time to judge it. Therefore, all creation may rejoice.

FINAL THOUGHTS

Psalm 96 commands that all believers participate in global evangelism in one way or another, whether by going, praying, supporting, or training. It is incumbent upon the church to take this message of God's supremacy into all the earth and declare His glory among the nations.

Let "the Lord reigns" be declared far and wide to all nations and peoples. This theme of His universal reign should promote a missionary zeal throughout the earth. Let God's people say to the world, "Come bow down before God in repentance and faith in his Son!"

THE BLESSING OF HOSTING THE 2019 LAUSANNE GLOBAL WORKPLACE FORUM

The Lausanne Movement is a global movement that mobilizes evangelical leaders to collaborate for world evangelization, and the most recent gathering hosted by it was held here last June 25-29, the 2019 Lausanne Global Workplace Forum (GWF). GWF brought together a diverse range of influencers to mobilize the whole church—from every corner of the global workplace—as bearers of the gospel.

This gathering was the first of its kind in Lausanne's history, with 850 leaders from 109 countries chosen as participants, with majority as participants in Manila, and 200 joining online. At least 65% of the participants were from secular workplaces (they don't receive income from a church or ministry organization) at least 30% were women, and at least 30% were younger leaders (40 years old and below).

GWF represents Lausanne's most concerted effort to date to address the false sacred-secular divide that has permeated the church's thinking and action. GWF highlighted the biblical truth that all legitimate work is intrinsically valuable and integral to the missional work of God's kingdom. Participants developed new regional, local, and issue-specific initiatives for how all God's people might live, think, work, and speak from a biblical worldview and with missional effectiveness.

We take this opportunity to thank (besides our GCF staff) our hardworking GCF volunteers and participants who went out of their way to give service for God's kingdom.

MISSIONS MONTH OPENS TODAY

We start Missions Month this weekend with a message that highlights God's call for every believer to missions and missional living. These two are inseparable, and understandably some balk at separating these two. I only do so here for emphasis. Missions is often defined in layman's terms as cross-cultural evangelization, crossing barriers beyond geographical to reach other people for Christ. On the other hand missional living means to embrace the truth that every Christian in the church is sent into the world; rather than expect people to come into the church. Being missional means we engage the world the same way Jesus did—by going out rather than just reaching out.

We often say, "The church has a mission," but the correct statement is "God's mission has a church." Missional thinking is not content with missions being a church-based work. Rather, it applies to the whole life of every believer. Every Christian should strive to be a representative of the kingdom of God, and every follower should try to carry the mission of God into every sphere of his life. We are all missionaries sent into the world. That's missional living. In Matthew 5:13-16. Jesus told us that we are the salt of the earth, the light of the world...to let our light shine before men. We sum it up with Paul: "So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God...and whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him" (1 Corinthians 10:31; Colossians 3:17)

Then he said to them, "Is it lawful to do good or to do harm on the sabbath, to save life or to kill?" But they were silent.

—Mark 3:4 (NRSV)

eginning in Israel's exodus from Egypt, Sabbath stood as a challenge against the culture of fear and manipulation, of alienation and exploitation, which Pharaoh lorded over the Jewish people. Sabbath declares that all manner of work and enjoyment revolves around God's love. It is a visible declaration that God is the one true King and Provider. To take part in His Sabbath is to have fellowship with Him and take part in His rest-giving work, restoring wholeness to the tired and broken creation.

We now come to Jesus' last rebuke about Sabbath. In fear of compromising their moral integrity, Pharisaic tradition emphasizes the prohibition of work during the Sabbath, which includes healing. Jesus enters the synagogue, and saw a man with a shriveled hand. Driven with compassion and justice, unfazed by the prohibition, Jesus asked those who are gathered in the synagogue, "Is it lawful to do good or to do harm

on the sabbath?" Without hearing any response from the people, angered and grieved, he continued on to restore the man's hand.

Jesus put God's kingdom in display against the alienating piety of the religious leaders, challenging them to put love of neighbor above law and tradition. While the religious leaders busied themselves building fences with moral codes and traditions, Iesus announced the Good News by giving the real picture of God's Torah: "to do good...to save life." The Sabbath is meant to attend to human need, and true devotion to God means pursuing compassion and justice for the poor and powerless (James 1:27).

As we gather together to share at the Lord's table, we are declaring to take part in His life and mission. As we are invited into His fellowship, let us ask the Holy Spirit to open our eyes to see and hands to reach those around us who are in need. Let us be true disciples who follow Jesus' example, that instead of building fences out of fear, let us be filled with love in bridging the gap between the church and the world. Let us be a source of true Sabbath rest to others. as we anticipate His return

God's Way to Heaven

THE GOSPEL

"Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."

(1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD

God is holy and righteous: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty, the whole earth is full of his glory" (*Isaiah 6:3*). **He requires holiness of us as well:** "Be holy, for I am holy" (*1 Peter 1:16*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT MAN

Man is sinful: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (*Romans 3:23*).

Sin demands a penalty: "For the wages of sin is death" (*Romans 6:23*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT CHRIST

Christ is the expression of God's love for us: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). Christ paid the penalty of our sins and died for sinners: "For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God" (1 Peter 3:18). Through Christ, God offers man reconciliation: "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins against them" (2 Corinthians 5:18).

WHAT SHOULD WE DO?

Believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (Romans 10:9).

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. I believe that you died on the cross in my place, to save me from my sins, and I accept you as my Savior, and the Master of my life forever. Amen.
