The Blessings of Suffering

Today's Message (21/22 September 2019) / Psalm 22

MAY WE NOT BE SO FOCUSED ON OUR SUFFERING THAT WE FORGET THE ONE WHO SUFFERED FIRST FOR US AND GAINED FOR US A SALVATION WE COULD NEVER WORK FOR.

Suffering is one of the painful realities of a believer's life. While it is true that all people, believers or not, are destined to suffer in a fallen and broken world, there is something unique in the believer's suffering: the expectation of divine help. If you suffer for righteousness' sake, God will eventually deliver and vindicate you for the glory of His Name.

Psalm 22 is often called "The Fifth Gospel" because of 15 Messianic quotations or allusions to it that were fulfilled by Christ on the cross. That is where the One who never sinned would become sin for us, that in Him we might become the righteousness of God (2 *Corinthians 5:21*). His suffering is illustrative of ours, and yet must also be considered uniquely in the way that it won for us something we could never earn.

1. THE PAIN OF UNDESERVED SUFFERING (vv. 1-21)

- a. In the midst of painful circumstances, it is acceptable to cry out and lament before God. God would rather hear your pained cry than see your back; listen to you weep than watch you walk away. He doesn't lose anything if we make that mistake. We do.
- b. In the midst of difficult circumstances, the hope of the believer is the unchanging character of God (*Isaiah 54:10*).

The Blessings of Suffering

Today's Message (21/22 September 2019) / Psalm 22

2. THE GLORY OF GOD'S DELIVERANCE (vv. 22-31)

- a. Those vindicated by God will proclaim his glory to future generations.
- b. Future hope in God gives us the strength to endure present suffering.

When God finally delivers and vindicates believers suffering for righteousness, this results to glorifying His Name to all people and to future generations.

As a believer, how do you survive undeserved suffering? Do just like David did:

- 1. Rely on the unchanging character of God.
- 2. Recall the faithfulness of God.
- 3. Request God's help in prayer.
- 4. Recover in the midst of God's people.
- 5. Rejoice with God's people when God ultimately vindicates and delivers you.

FINAL THOUGHTS

The life of a believer is not one of continuous exaltation but repeated vindication. God doesn't spare us because He is somehow preparing us for the life after this. And in a way that perhaps God alone can best explain, suffering is inevitable preparation for our eternal destiny.

In all of this, do not forget how all of this became true for Christ, and how it gained our salvation for us. May we not be so focused on our suffering that we forget the One who suffered first for us and gained for us a salvation we could never work for. Because He suffered, the Just for the unjust, His kingdom will know no end, His glory will know no bounds. Do you know Him? The better question is: Does Jesus know you?

The Shepherd's Voice

This month, my family is expecting our firstborn to arrive. We will be naming him Tobias Immanuel because through him, we have experienced the goodness of God. hen we started our business in 1989, and up to 1996, our trajectory has been a steady climb. That is, until July of 1997. We were one of the companies hit by the Asian Financial Crisis.

In that year, the core of our company was engaged in a severe test of patience, grit, and perseverance that I have never experienced before in my life. It took us 10 years to recover substantially from that. We were shocked, but we came out of it a lot wiser and stronger. People ask me how we made it. I have only one answer: God's faithfulness, tender mercies, and grace.

I am reminded of the truth that "God never promised us an easy life, but He promised us to be in the middle of the storm." All this time, my wife and I were busy taking care of our five children and our business, that we were in the truest sense "Christians for convenience," wearing the hat of a Christian if the situation called for it, most of the time living but not being truly "alive."

We started attending GCF in 2010, and since then, it has been our home church. Being with GCF has greatly enriched our spiritual lives and filled up a lot of empty voids. Early last year, we felt a need to share the good news with other people, and we realized, why not start in our

own company, our oikos, since we have a substantial number of employees?

Early 2018, we started a weekly Bible study in our company by showing videos of past Sunday sermons. Our employees were receptive to the idea and before we knew it, 30 to 40 people were attending.

Our current Bible study uses material that teaches workplace ethics and how to become effective God-centered employees. What's more, we even have our Bible studies shown on Facebook Live to our nationwide branches.

Our employees always look forward to our Bible studies. More importantly, we noticed significant changes in them. They are becoming tolerant of each other, as well as cheerful and courteous, to say the least. We are a family-led corporation, and my wife and I, and our children. also attend the weekly Bible study. I can proudly say that it is truly a gain on our

God's Way to Heaven

THE GOSPEL

"Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."

(1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD

God is holy and righteous: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty, the whole earth is full of his glory" (*Isaiah 6:3*). **He requires holiness of us as well:** "Be holy, for I am holy" (*1 Peter 1:16*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT MAN

Man is sinful: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (*Romans 3:23*).

Sin demands a penalty: "For the wages of sin is death" (*Romans 6:23*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT CHRIST

Christ is the expression of God's love for us: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (*Romans 5:8*). Christ paid the penalty of our sins and died for sinners: "For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God" (*1 Peter 3:18*). Through Christ, God offers man reconciliation: "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins

against them" (2 Corinthians 5:18). WHAT SHOULD WE DO?

Believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (*Romans 10:9*).

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. I believe that you died on the cross in my place, to save me from my sins, and I accept you as my Savior, and the Master of my life forever. Amen.
