The Cost of Redemption

Today's Message (5/6 October 2019) /
Exodus 30:11-16

BELIEVERS, OF
ALL PEOPLE,
SHOULD BE THE
MOST HUMBLE—
WE ARE NOT
WORTHY OF OUR
REDEMPTION
BUT RECIPIENTS
OF GOD'S FAVOR
AND GRACE IN
CHRIST.

Our passage seems almost out of place in the Tabernacle construction narratives. Smack in the middle of discussions about necessary objects (incense, bronze basin for ceremonial washing, anointing oil) it talks about a requirement to give an offering for those counted mature enough. What did God want them to learn through this, and what is He telling us today about Jesus Christ?

1. THE P_____ OF A RANSOM:
THEY DID NOT EARN WHATEVER THEY
HAD—FREEDOM, SALVATION, PRESENT
JOY, FUTURE HOPE, GOD HIMSELF.
INSTEAD THEY WERE STILL IN DEBT.

- The message was clear—God was telling them “everything you have comes from Me. But whatever you do have, never forget what you owe Me.”
- God's generosity should lead us to humility (*James 1:17-18*).

2. THE P_____ OF THE RANSOM: THEY
COULD NEVER PAY WHAT THEY OWED.

- The fact that rich or poor alike, were charged the same ridiculously small amount reminded them that whatever they could come up with was never enough. It was a strong statement from God!
- Romans 10:11-13 says, “For the Scripture says, ‘Everyone who believes in Him will not be put to shame.’ For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing His riches on all who call on Him. For ‘everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.’”



Exodus 30:11-16

3. THE PRICE OF THE RANSOM: VERSE 16: "GIVE IT FOR THE SERVICE OF THE TENT OF MEETING, THAT IT MAY BRING THE PEOPLE... TO REMEMBRANCE BEFORE THE LORD... TO MAKE ATONEMENT FOR YOUR LIVES."

- To understand atonement, we must put verses 11 and 16 together: "a ransom for his life to the LORD...that there be no plague among them".
- God's grace demands a response from us all:
 - For the Israelites, it was a reminder to put their faith in God alone and look forward to every sacrifice and aspect of the Tabernacle to the coming Messiah (including this demand for a ransom payment).
 - For believers today, realize that Jesus Christ became the ransom payment for us (*1 Peter 1:18-19*). We could never have paid our debt. And we honor God today by gratefulness in worship, and show it concretely by supporting His work (*Psalms 50:14*).
 - For those unsure of their standing before God, God's kindness is meant to lead you to repentance (*Romans 2:4*).

FINAL THOUGHTS

Believers, of all people, should be the most humble—we are not worthy of our redemption but recipients of God's favor and grace in Christ. When we look at unbelievers and their gross sins, we should never think that we are better than they, but remember that we would be just as lost and under God's wrath if not for the grace of God in Christ. May this prepare our hearts to worship Christ at His table today ■

As I write this, I am taking a necessary leave, not really by choice, as I take care of our eldest son, Arrow, who was confined for dengue. His platelets have been steadily decreasing, but prayerfully, by the time you read this, his platelets should have increased and we should have been home. A good friend, Pastor Arnel Tan, keeps reminding me (like some of our elders) to take a break. My secretary, Grace, knows that I still come in despite diarrhea, fever, cough, etc. My wife realizes my days-off are more theoretical than actual. We will now distribute this to our GCF satellites and affiliates, and to CBAP and PCEC for their consideration and possible adoption.

The table is a place of welcome. It is a place where we can slow down, let down our guards, tell our stories. Just as we connect with God, we also connect with each other. This is our communion, not just declaring Christ's death, but also His work—reconciling us to Himself and to each other, teaching us to both receive and dispense forgiveness. At the table, we see how God shared with our humanity, and how He invites us into sharing with others.

We partake of the bread, and drink from His cup, we also bear witness to Him who alone satisfies the hunger and thirst of our souls and the whole human family. By the power of the Holy Spirit, God leads us to His table, where we may delight on the blessing of His presence.

We lift the bread and the cup declaring Christ's death for our ransom. We do just the same in union with Him in His resurrection

and triumph. We remember His triumph over death and the bondage of oppression, and reconciled us to Him and to each other.

Our redemption in Jesus calls us to follow the life He lived. A life that reflects the courage to show compassion. A life lived in holiness that brings wholeness to the broken. His divinity became fully expressed in His humanity. In His life, we learn that we become most divine when we are most human (*cf. Philippians 2*).

As we share at the Lord's table, let us reflect: As I partake of Christ's body and blood, can I confidently say that I partake of His life as well? In my communion with Him, do I show the same communion with my brothers and sisters? Can I share a table with my enemies, or even welcome strangers to my home?

As I partake of Christ's body and blood, can I confidently say that I partake of His life as well?

We open our hearts to Him who forgives our misgivings. Acknowledging our humanity and our need for grace and strength to love, may we be filled with the Holy Spirit to show God's love to others ■

God's Way to Heaven

THE GOSPEL

"Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."
(1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD

God is holy and righteous: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty, the whole earth is full of his glory" (*Isaiah 6:3*). **He requires holiness of us as well:** "Be holy, for I am holy" (*1 Peter 1:16*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT MAN

Man is sinful: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (*Romans 3:23*).
Sin demands a penalty: "For the wages of sin is death" (*Romans 6:23*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT CHRIST

Christ is the expression of God's love for us: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (*Romans 5:8*). **Christ paid the penalty of our sins and died for sinners:** "For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God" (*1 Peter 3:18*). **Through Christ, God offers man reconciliation:** "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins against them" (*2 Corinthians 5:18*).

WHAT SHOULD WE DO?

Believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (*Romans 10:9*).

PRAYER: *Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. I believe that you died on the cross in my place, to save me from my sins, and I accept you as my Savior, and the Master of my life forever. Amen.*
