One of the most paralyzing problems in life is fear. As fear gets a firm grip on us, we become its victim. How do you find freedom from fear? Take a cue from David. As David faced his fears and expressed them to God in Psalm 27, he began with worship, celebrating the power and faithfulness of God:

VERSES 1-3: DAVID'S P_____

- Verse 1 answers mankind's four greatest fears:
 - √ I don't have enough knowledge or wisdom—the Lord is my light.
 - \checkmark I fear the consequences of my sin—the Lord is my salvation.
 - √ I am too weak to face the challenges of life—the Lord is my stronghold.
 - \checkmark I fear illness and death—the Lord is my life.

Because the all-powerful God holds us in hands of love, we have no need to fear.

• Christians call God their light and salvation and stronghold of life because of the deliverance from sin and death given in Jesus Christ.

VERSES 4-12: DAVID'S P _____

a. To belong to the h_____ of God (vv. 4-6)

- David's supreme priority is "to gaze on the beauty of the Lord." David finds God beautiful, not just useful. To sense God's beauty in the heart is to have such pleasure in Him that you rest content.
- Trust is active and real precisely when one is aware of one's vulnerability, of one's ultimate helplessness before the threats of life, "in the day of trouble." Trust is nurtured and strengthened by the discipline of public worship.
- Then and now, to go to God's house to worship
 is to make your faith public. When faith is kept
 a private matter, unspoken and unshared, it
 becomes a personal project and may decay into
 no more than your own resolution and willpower.
 When faced with threats and trouble, believers

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should always seek the Lord, especially in the community of worship. It is in the house of the Lord that His presence is often realized, in the midst of the congregation where God's glory is revealed.

b. To experience the of God (vv. 7-10)

- "Hear, O Lord, when I cry aloud." The first six verses might make us think it was all easy for David, that when trouble came there was no struggle with self or God. Yet David showed us that even he—one who sought God with passion—sometimes felt that God did not hear him immediately.
- David begins by reminding the Lord of his invitation to people to seek him. David is not inquiring from God but earnestly pleading for the "face" of God Himself—His very presence. He is not seeking wisdom but the reassuring presence of God, who has not abandoned him even in the midst of suffering.
- Verse 10 may be translated "If my father and my mother forsake me." From a parent, we want acceptance, to be heard, guidance, and protection. God can fulfill each of these for all, including the life that never received them from a parent (*Isaiah 49:15-16*).

c. To live in the ______ of God (vv. 11-12)

- David asks the Lord to show him how to live so he will not fall into his enemies' hands.
- False accusation has been generalized as a metaphor for the opposition that believers as individuals and as the church experience. The psalm teaches us to trust God for a way of life that will again and again be misrepresented, misunderstood, and put in question in the cultures where it is lived out.

VERSES 13-14: DAVID'S P

- David's cry for help doesn't end with an account of God's sudden and miraculous provision. Instead, he commits to doing what comes least naturally to people in fear. He committed to doing **nothing**. He chose to wait on God (*Hebrews 4:9-11*). Strength and courage are developed during a trial, not after it is over.
- This is not a passive sitting around until the Lord does something. Yes, God gives us strength, but He brings it to us as we seek Him, and rely on Him, instead of our own strength.

FINAL THOUGHTS

Review Psalm 27 each time you are tempted to be afraid. Look upon each threatening circumstance as an opportunity to grow in your faith, rather than to retreat. How? Follow David's example.

First: Call to mind what you know to be true about God.

Second: Express what you need in prayer.

Third: Wait on God. Let the fearful circumstance become God's opportunity to strengthen you ■

CONNECT CAMP: SUFFICIENCY OF SCRIPTURE

Last August, the Connect ministry held a 3-day camp on the sufficiency of Scripture, with Pastor BJ Sebastian as keynote speaker. He led us to a wonderful study of Psalm 19:7-14 and 2 Timothy 3:16-17. The doctrine of the sufficiency of Scripture is important, but is easily one of the most neglected doctrines. It is important because the denial of the sufficiency of Scripture is at the core of almost every form of opposition to the Christian faith today. By that I mean that many churches are abandoning the truth claims of Scripture for the opposing truth claims of science, psychology, sociology, philosophy, and others. Of course, it is useful for the church to have some knowledge of secular disciplines such as those, as auxiliary disciplines. But we must always keep in mind that our primary responsibility is the study and application of Scripture for the edification of the church.

When the church becomes preoccupied with these auxiliary disciplines to the extent of neglecting its primary responsibility, it results in the weakening of the church. The late Reformed theologian R. C. Sproul once said, "I think the greatest weakness in the church today is that almost no one believes that God invests His power in the Bible. Everyone is looking for power in a program, in a technique, in anything and everything except where God has placed it: His Word."

The Reformers had a term for this: *sola Scriptura*, or Scripture Alone. It is the

doctrine that teaches us that Scripture alone contains every truth we need not only for our salvation, but also for our continued growth in grace and godliness. In other words, only Scripture has that absolute authority and sufficiency, and that all other truth claims are to be tested by bringing them to Scripture and comparing them with what Scripture says.

Sufficiency of Scripture is not a claim that the Bible exhaustively treats every truth it deals. It is not a claim that all truth of every kind is revealed in Scripture. But on those issues to which Scripture does speak, it speaks with absolute and supreme authority. It equips us with all the spiritual truth that we need. So, the Bible is not the exhaustive source of all true knowledge, but it is the foundation for all true knowledge. It stands above every other kind of truth. It is more authoritative and more certain than any other source, even more trustworthy than our own experiences (2 Peter 1:19). If we are to be an effective witness of our Lord Jesus to the world, and if we desire our people to grow, then it is imperative that we take this doctrine seriously.

[Jesus] climbed a mountain and invited those he wanted with him.... The plan was that they would be with him, and he would send them out to proclaim the Word and give them authority to banish demons.

—Mark 3:13-15 (The Message)

▼ athering a delegation in the privacy of the mountains was not new in the context of a Roman-colonized Palestine. Zealots who sought freedom from imperial rule gather like-minded people seeking to overthrow their oppressors. Much is the same with the political and religious leaders. The rulers of both imperial and religious state gather in their palaces and temples to deter any attempts of deposition. Here we see two seemingly opposing sides. But looking closer both are exploits of seizing power and control.

Jesus calls 12 of His disciples, a band of common folks, to stay loyal to Him and the vision of God's reign in the world. He commissions them as apostles called to be with Him and sent out to imitate His way of powerlessness in proclaiming the reign of God. And this proclamation does not just aim to provide a way into eternal life, but to expose and disarm the powers holding people hostage.

When Mark accounted Jesus ascent to the mountain, he is not a stranger to the image of brewing revolution. The ruling spirits of this world scheme to carry out plans to kill, steal, and destroy. These are the demons that take humanity captive. These are the same demons Jesus confronts and banishes all throughout his ministry, as we have seen in the previous passages in Mark's account. Jesus is bringing a revolution far different from seizing power and control. He is bringing in a grand reversal, restoring and renewing God's relationship with His people.

The reign of God calls people to lay down their lives, not to be subdued by an oppressive king, but to see the invitation for a new way of life. Those Jesus wanted with Him are called to relinquish any desire to seize power. Intimacy with Him means to understand that life is meant to be lived in the service of others.

This call seemed to be inefficient according to the economy of efficiency that this present world knows. But the call still stands, if we claim to be followers of Christ, we must live as He lived. As we are sent out to proclaim God's reign, we are sharing in His authority in banishing demons. In exposing and disarming the works of the evil one, our method should be marked by compassion, walking with the weak and extending grace to the needy

God's Way to Heaven

THE GOSPEL

"Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."

(1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD

God is holy and righteous: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty, the whole earth is full of his glory" (*Isaiah 6:3*). **He requires holiness of us as well:** "Be holy, for I am holy" (*1 Peter 1:16*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT MAN

Man is sinful: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (*Romans 3:23*). Sin demands a penalty: "For the wages of sin is death" (*Romans 6:23*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT CHRIST

Christ is the expression of God's love for us: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (*Romans 5:8*). Christ paid the penalty of our sins and died for sinners: "For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God" (*1 Peter 3:18*). Through Christ, God offers man reconciliation: "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins

against them" (2 Corinthians 5:18). WHAT SHOULD WE DO?

Believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (*Romans 10:9*).

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. I believe that you died on the cross in my place, to save me from my sins, and I accept you as my Savior, and the Master of my life forever. Amen.
