The Joy of God's Restoration

Today's Message (9/10 November 2019) / Psalm 30

THE JOY
OF GOD'S
RESTORATION
IS ALWAYS

DISCIPLINE.

Believers go through hard times from one of three reasons —trials from God to make us grow, temptations from God's enemy (Satan) to make us fall, and training from God (discipline) to make us righteous (*Hebrews 12:9-11*). David refers to a time in his life that severe sickness nearly ended his life and he realized it was because of God's discipline. Nevertheless, the whole psalm is a psalm of joy and thanksgiving! This is because God is merciful and restorative to all His children who call upon Him, and for this deserves our praise:

1. THE C	OF A C	
TO WORSHIP	(vv. 1-5)	

David asks all believers to sing praises to the LORD and give thanks to His holy Name because of:

- a. God's actions: He healed David and thus kept his enemies from celebrating his downfall.
 - Do we live with an attitude of gratitude, or is your life a continuous tale of asking God, "What have you done for me lately?"
- b. God's character: Because of God's favor that lasts forever, every believer will find this true: Weeping may last for the night, but joy comes with the morning.
 - Lamentations 3:19-26 reminds us, "The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases; His mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is Your faithfulness!"

The Joy of God's Restoration

Today's Message (9/10 November 2019) / Psalm 30

• Few things can destroy the believer—saved by faith alone—than to start congratulating him/herself for the good things in life and begin to forget God (*Psalm 50:22-23*).

Self-sufficiency is a form of idolatry where we place a picture of ourselves on a throne and bow down to it and worship. And the problem with this kind of idolatry is that it is often unnoticed by us. Or worse, justified by us.

Beware of this attitude: "I said in my prosperity, 'I shall never be moved". It invites God to send tremors into your life.

- b. The r of God's discipline (vv. 8-10)
 - David requested mercy and help from God (vv. 8, 10)
 - David reasoned with God (v. 9). Deliver me because:
 - I plead to be your worshiper.
 - I plead to be your witness.

3. THE C	OF A C	LIFE (vv.	11-12)
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- a. God replaced mourning with dancing and sackcloth with gladness! Why? Because God wants us to worship and witness. When a request for deliverance is because of a sincere desire to worship and witness, God honors it!
- b. David's fitting response, and ours—"O LORD my God, I will give thanks to you forever!" If you mean this, you will indeed do this forever (*Revelation 22:3-5*). And that, is the essence of worship, and heaven.

FINAL THOUGHTS

In a time of prosperity, David had become overconfident (v. 6). When illness came, he was overwhelmed ($\nu\nu$. 1-5, 7-10). Then came the healing, and his mourning turned to joy. The joy of God's restoration is always greater than the sting of His discipline.

Hebrews 12:11-14 says, "For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it. Therefore lift your drooping hands and strengthen your weak knees... Strive for peace with everyone, and for the holiness without which no one will see the Lord"

IT'S ORPHAN SUNDAY TODAY

Orphan Sunday started in a small, rural church in Kalingalinga, Zambia. In 2002, a visitor witnessed the pastor's passionate call to care for orphans, in a community ravaged by AIDS and poverty. The church members had very little. But the pastor believed that all Christians are called to express God's love for the fatherless in action. During that first-ever "Orphan Sunday," one after another the people stepped forward giving out of their deep poverty, offering their own food, and some even taking off their own shoes and placing them in the offering basket for orphans.

That visitor, Gary Schneider, was so impacted by what he witnessed that he began to help Zambian leaders coordinate Orphan Sunday efforts across Zambia and shared the vision in the U.S. as well. And thus Orphan Sunday was born. Orphan Sunday is observed each year on the second Sunday in November. Today, churches and organizations in more than 80 nations observe Orphan Sunday annually. Through Orphan Sunday, we join in the promise of "One Day, One Voice, One Purpose." We pray the church all over the world may be as faithful as our Zambian brethren to reflect God's heart for the orphan, both near and far.

God is vested, deeply and personally, in the plight of the orphan (*Deuteronomy* 10:18). He calls His people to share this passion and bring to each child the love of Jesus Christ in both word and deed (*Isaiah 1:17; James 1:27; Matthew 25:40*). On Orphan Sunday, the church is reminded of this and invited to act upon it. Today we celebrate foremost God's deep love for the fatherless, and for each of us as well. From that wellspring, we must inspire and equip for action—from adoption, foster care and mentoring, to global orphan care.

As Christians respond to God's call to care for orphans, lives are transformed. Certainly, orphans and foster youth are changed forever. But it doesn't stop there. Individual Christians are drawn beyond a self-focused religion to a vibrant, sacrificial discipleship. Churches grow too, as the community sees God's heart and mirrors it. And, a watching world is changed as it sees the Gospel made visible in Christian adoption, foster care, and global orphan care.

Here's the clincher—adopted children should have a heart for orphans. And guess what? You and I are adopted children. Romans 8:15 says, "For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, 'Abba! Father!". And if, as a Christian you don't want your life to count for nothing, here is God's definition of true religion, James 1:27: "Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world" ■

The many blessings of foster care

came to the Philippines in 2005 to teach at a school for missionary kids, but it didn't take me long to start volunteering at a local orphanage, which led to respite care, and eventually foster care.



My first foster baby was a little girl named Aya (in the picture). She was originally given to me at six weeks of age for respite care. I had her for four weeks to help her grow before placing her back in the orphanage. After several months, with lots of tests and doctors, she was given the label 'failure to thrive'. The orphanage placed her back in my care and she started to grow. It was the difference between institutional care and a family.

My dream is to see all children find a family. Institutional care fills a need but for many

children it is not enough. For children like Aya, they need more, they needed the stability that comes from being in a family.

Many eventually become adoptable and get a family but for many others, the dream of a family never comes true, This is often true for children brought into care later in life or rescued from human/sex trafficking. As long as there is an active court case, a child is not adoptable. In many cases, these are the kids that need it most.

Foster care is the answer. Foster care is temporary care of a child in need, it is not adoption. It is stepping in and being a family for a child that may never legally be yours.

But we can't do it alone. These children can have so many medical and emotional needs. I have felt overwhelmed and exhausted at times trying to help.

Foster care is all of us working together. Families that feel called to open their home to a child but also families willing to offer care, support and love to that family. And if children like Aya could have a foster family that understood parenting doesn't end at a child's 18th birthday and willing chose to continue to invest in that person, it could have a huge ripple effect not only in that child's life but in generations after that.

God's Way to Heaven

THE GOSPEL

"Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."

(1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD

God is holy and righteous: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty, the whole earth is full of his glory" (*Isaiah 6:3*). He requires holiness of us as well: "Be holy, for I am holy" (*1 Peter 1:16*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT MAN

Man is sinful: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (*Romans 3:23*). Sin demands a penalty: "For the wages of sin is death" (*Romans 6:23*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT CHRIST

Christ is the expression of God's love for us: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (*Romans 5:8*). Christ paid the penalty of our sins and died for sinners: "For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God" (*1 Peter 3:18*). Through Christ, God offers man reconciliation: "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins

against them" (2 Corinthians 5:18). WHAT SHOULD WE DO?

Believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (*Romans 10:9*).

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. I believe that you died on the cross in my place, to save me from my sins, and I accept you as my Savior, and the Master of my life forever. Amen.
