Manage Your Enemies, or They Will Manage You

Today's Message (16/17 November 2019) / Psalm 31

AS YOU
TRUST GOD
AND ACCEPT
REALITY

None of us are immune from enemies. They can range from the "not really bad people"-e.g. competitors in sports or business or love, all the way to the really wicked—people who mean bodily harm, who swindle, sue, willfully persecute or maliciously slander. And living a righteous life has nothing to do with not having enemies—remember the only Person who walked on earth and never sinned-He was condemned as a criminal and crucified. It is therefore crucial that you learn how to deal with those who willfully treat you unkindly-our very broad working definition of "enemies." David had a lot of them. And his struggles are captured in our passage and echoed in the martyrdom of Jesus and Stephen for our blessing today. How do you manage enemies?

1. MANAGING ENEMIES INVOLVES TRUSTING IN ONE HIGHER THAN BOTH OF YOU: GOD.

There may be times in your own life when the best thing you can only say in a given situation is, similarly, "Into your hand I commit my spirit" (ν . 5). It is not the words you say, but the object of your trust who sets you free. There is blessed release in faith.

| Throughout Scripture, you discover how much God wants us to use our memories, our recalling the past, in a positive way. He knows that even in a present where you may have nothing or no one left, you will always have good memories of God's dealings with you, and that is enough for you to rebuild your life upon again. |
| • You can celebrate as you r on the eternal character of God: His goodness, love (<i>hesed</i>), and justice. These unchanging attributes of God became the bedrock of David's trust. They should be ours, too. |

FINAL THOUGHTS

What a way to end what could have been a bleak passage: "Love the Lord, all you his saints...Be strong, and let your heart take courage, all you who wait for the Lord!" (vv. 23-24).

Life on a fallen earth, in fallen bodies battling our fallen human nature, will always net you enemies. None of us can escape this fact of life. Yet enemies don't have to rule your life or dictate how you live, or whether you have joy in life or none. If we take a cue from how David managed his own situation, we can make sure we manage the reality of having enemies, without becoming one to others. As you trust God and accept reality and its implications, may you find reason for celebrating!

The Shepherd's Voice

Be alert and of sober mind. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Resist him, standing firm in the faith, because you know that the family of believers throughout the world is undergoing the same kind of sufferings. And the God of all grace, who called you to his eternal glory in Christ, after you have suffered a little while, will himself restore you and make you strong, firm and steadfast. To him be the power for ever and ever. Amen.—1 Peter 5:8-11 (NIV)

BATTLING SIN: BE ALERT

In 1 Peter 5, Peter was calling fellow believers to be proactive and to not be so easily deceived by sin by being "selfcontrolled" and by being "alert" (v. 8a). The "devil", as a deceiver then and even until today, is described by Peter as a "roaring lion" ready to "devour" weak and frail prey. But the encouragement to this menacing thought is in verse 10, where we are reminded of God's promised salvation in Christ (1 Peter 1:3-9, 17-21, 23; 2:9-10). Peter is telling believers then and even today that though the enemy threatens to deceive and destroy, Christians are promised strength and fortitude to endure because of the One who enables us to be "strong, firm and steadfast" (v. 10).

Peter encourages us today in verses 10-11. Firstly, though there is suffering in the Christian life, Christians need not go through the battle alone since "brothers throughout the world" (ν . 9) share in the same struggle. Secondly, as co-sharers of Christ's suffering,

Christians are reminded of Jesus' restoration, strength, firmness and steadfastness, and ultimately "eternal glory" (*v. 10*) as promised by Christ.

ALERT FOR OTHERS

So, as we think about our sinfulness and the strength that we have in our Lord and Savior Jesus, may we be wary not just of our personal sins, but also be moved to bring about healing, restoration, and strength to a world that badly needs Jesus. As Peter himself writes in 1 Peter 4:7-11:

The end of all things is near. Therefore be alert and of sober mind so that you may pray. Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins. Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling. Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms. If anyone speaks, they should do so as one who speaks the very words of God. If anyone serves, they should do so with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ. To him be the glory and the power for ever and ever. Amen. (NIV)

So this command is not just for the individual. It is a message for the church and for the world. Therefore, we must "pray" and in love "serve others" in order that they may discover His offer of "strength" and in the end, love, thank, and also, live, to "praise Jesus"!

God's Way to Heaven

THE GOSPEL

"Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."

(1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD

God is holy and righteous: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty, the whole earth is full of his glory" (*Isaiah 6:3*). **He requires holiness of us as well:** "Be holy, for I am holy" (*1 Peter 1:16*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT MAN

Man is sinful: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (*Romans 3:23*). Sin demands a penalty: "For the wages of sin is death" (*Romans 6:23*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT CHRIST

Christ is the expression of God's love for us: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). Christ paid the penalty of our sins and died for sinners: "For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God" (1 Peter 3:18). Through Christ, God offers man reconciliation: "God was reconciling the world

reconciliation: "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins against them" (2 Corinthians 5:18).

WHAT SHOULD WE DO?

Believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (*Romans 10:9*).

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. I believe that you died on the cross in my place, to save me from my sins, and I accept you as my Savior, and the Master of my life forever. Amen.
