Today's Message (14/15 December 2019) / Luke 1:5-25; 68-79

"BLESSED BE
THE LORD GOD
OF ISRAEL, FOR
HE HAS VISITED
AND REDEEMED
HIS PEOPLE AND
HAS RAISED
UP A HORN OF
SALVATION FOR
US!"

The days of Herod, king of Judea (ν . 5) were not the best of days for the Jews, but Zechariah and his wife faithfully served God in spite of the discouragements. God has His faithful remnant even in the darkest days. In His plan of love to prepare people's hearts for the Messiah, and in fulfilment of prophecy, God would birth the greatest of all prophets through the unlikeliest of sources: two aging people.

THE SINGER: ZECHARIAH

He was d______ to God.
 Righteous but unfulfilled due to the absence of children.

The ways of God are mysterious. In the Bible, whenever he planned to bless a person and his family supernaturally, far beyond ordinary blessings, He always withheld for a time what seemed most desirable to that person and family. God takes His time when greatness is in His plan.

 He was d_____ for doubting God. He looked at his limitations instead of his miracles.

Sometimes we do the same. The miracle is right in front of us and we still ask—"Do you expect me to believe that?" For doubting the word that came from God, he lost the ability to speak.

"For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it," says Hebrews 12:11. There's no greater or more successful trainer than God.

He was d______ by God from an unfulfilled life.

While in the midst of God's discipline to purify his faith, Zechariah was always loved by God, and God

never forgot His promise of a son. Despite Zechariah's failure of faith, God fulfilled His promise in His perfect way and time.

THE SONG: THE BENEDICTUS

See how redemptive the Lord's hand can be: from 'poor performer" to "powerful prophet"! Faith opens our lips in praise to God, while unbelief silences us (*2 Corinthians 4:13*).

- His prophecy about the S______ (vv. 67-75).
 - 1. The birth of Jesus assures the fulfillment of the promises to David (*vv.* 67–72). God is worthy of praise because He fulfilled His promises to deliver His people through a descendant of David. Zechariah thus reveals the impending birth of the Messiah.
 - 2. The birth of Jesus assures the fulfillment of the promises to Abraham (vv. 73–75). The faithfulness of God is never limited by time. After thousands of years the promise to bless all nations through Abraham was soon to be fulfilled with the birth of Christ (*Genesis 22:16–18; 26:3*).
- His prophecy about his s_____ (vv. 76-79).
 - 1. He will prepare the way of the Lord (ν . 76). The presence of the forerunner indicates that the Messiah is coming soon.
 - 2. He will proclaim the word of the Lord (*vv. 77–79*). John will have a prophetic ministry to prepare the way for the Lord (*Isaiah 40:3, Malachi 3:1*) by assuring the people of forgiveness of sins (*v. 77*).

In this beautiful song, Zechariah gave several pictures symbolizing the salvation we have in Jesus Christ:

- 1. Purchase from slavery (ν. 68)
- 2. Deliverance from danger (v. 74)
- 3. Forgiveness of a debt (ν . 77)
- 4. The dawning of a new day (vv. 78–79; Isaiah 9:2).

FINAL THOUGHTS

A chastened and wiser Zechariah in confident faith fulfills the Lord's will by naming the child John. No more the skeptic, he blesses God with his freshly restored faculties with a prophecy honoring the coming Messiah.

What an honor for this elderly couple to be the parents of the last and greatest of the prophets (*Luke 7:25–28; Matthew 11:7–13*), the man who would introduce the Messiah to the nation! \blacksquare

God does not miss a beat

bout a month ago, our GG, Titus 2 Women, embarked on a missions exposure trip to Cambodia and ministered to the Khmer. The Khmer people are predominantly Buddhists and their society currently suffers from extreme poverty, corruption, political unrest, and the proliferation of casinos and illegal drugs. Families also suffer from the impact of disengaged fathers. Many children starve both from affection and physical hunger.

As we ministered, God broke our hearts and birthed in us a deep love and compassion for the Khmer people upon hearing their stories and witnessing their plight. Armed by God's love, the Lord empowered our witness for the cause of the gospel. His love transcends the barriers of culture and language through the various presentations of skits, crafts, songs, dance, and play.

Over the next four days, we facilitated six evangelistic programs. We also ran a Missionary Care program, ministering to 10 Filipino missionaries over lunch fellowship, feeding on the Word, playing games, and enjoying goodies from the Philippines. Our GG was also invited to share God's word during two Sunday worship services, and He also enabled us to materially bless two local churches with what they need.

God's lavish blessings, through the support of the leaders of our church, the Wetfoot Ministry, and other key ministries and people made all this possible. He blessed us abundantly through the generosity of donors, a loving team dynamic, and even the time to take off from work for many of us. We have experienced for ourselves how God takes care of His own, especially those in the mission field. He surely does not miss

The Khmer people are very ripe for harvest. Their most pressing need is a sustainable livelihood. It is an open door and a huge platform for us to proclaim Jesus and His saving love and grace. There is great need for intentional discipleship among the locals, too, and for more workers to help them. We are planning to return and we hope, Lord willing, many of you can join us.

Indeed, we have all been blessed with so great a salvation to be a blessing, not only to our oikos, but to the nations, too. I encourage your GG to answer the Lord's commission. Join the cause? If the Spirit is urging you, please tarry not, and if you are interested, please visit the ministry information booth at the lobby to inquire about the Wetfoot program, which is now receiving inquiries and applications for short-term missions next year

God's Way to Heaven

THE GOSPEL

"Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."

(1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD

God is holy and righteous: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty, the whole earth is full of his glory" (*Isaiah 6:3*). **He requires holiness of us as well:** "Be holy, for I am holy" (*1 Peter 1:16*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT MAN

Man is sinful: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (*Romans 3:23*). Sin demands a penalty: "For the wages of sin is death" (*Romans 6:23*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT CHRIST

Christ is the expression of God's love for us: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). Christ paid the penalty of our sins and died for sinners: "For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God" (1 Peter 3:18). Through Christ, God offers man

3:18). Through Christ, God offers man reconciliation: "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins against them" (2 Corinthians 5:18).

WHAT SHOULD WE DO?

Believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (*Romans 10:9*).

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. I believe that you died on the cross in my place, to save me from my sins, and I accept you as my Savior, and the Master of my life forever. Amen.
