Taming Our Digital Tongue: Using Social Media to Bless, Not Curse

Today's Message (11/12 January 2020) / *James 3*

The boon and bane of social media (e.g. Twitter, Facebook, blogs, etc.) is that everything you tweet or post has a tremendous multiplier effect. So when we misuse our digital tongue to malign fellow believers (which is the context of James) we have stooped to cursing, and multiplied its harmful effects a million-fold. But it doesn't have to be that way. As our passage indicates, a genuine believer is meant by God to bless, not curse. Note how James guides us to solve the problem of the tongue through the wisdom God lovingly provides for us:

1. THE D	D	OF OUR TONGUE (vv. 1-8)	١
I. INE D_		_ OF OUR TOINGUE (VV. 1-0)	,

- Our tongue (verbal and digital) is powerful but uncontrollable, and therefore dangerously destructive! How evil can our speech get? How low can we go? "The tongue is...a world of unrighteousness...set on fire by hell...It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison".
- · Two implications:
 - Because of more severe judgment, those who teach from right motives need your prayers, so that they speak nothing but the truth in love (*Ephesians 4:15*). Pray also for your protection from hirelings and false teachers.
 - Realize that the damage mentioned in our text comes from ordinary speech.
 When it comes to social media (the digital tongue) the damage is much greater because of these overlapping realities:
 - 1. Publicity: you just crucified someone in public and violated Matthew 18:15-17, 21-35. Even if you regret your posts and delete them, you can't contact each reader one by one to apologize or explain. They may also never see your apology or retraction.
 - 2. Irreversibility: even if you delete your posts, others may have already forwarded and/or screen captured them, or told countless others about them.
 - 3. Permanency: even if you delete your posts they are already permanently engraved in other people's visual memories.

2. THE D_____ P____ FOR OUR TONGUE (vv. 9-12)

- God gave us tongues, to bless Him and others. James calls out a hypocrisy: "With it we bless our Lord and Father, and with it we curse people who are made in the likeness of God"!
- Consistent with his argument from chapters 1–2, James implicitly questions the salvation of those who keep using their tongue (including the digital version) to curse people while using it to bless God: "Can a fig tree…bear olives, or a grapevine produce figs? Neither can a salt pond yield fresh water".



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3. THE D	P	FOR OUR TONGUE (vv.	13-18)

- The problem is not really the tongue. It is the heart. It is easy to have "jealousy and selfish ambition" causing "disorder and every vile practice" (v. 16). To control the tongue, a Christian should follow God's wisdom. This wisdom is already in every true believer through the Holy Spirit. But we can choose to use it or refuse it.
- How do we know we are talking/tweeting/posting with God's wisdom instead of demonic wisdom? How can we use our tongue (verbal and particularly, digital) to bless rather than curse? Screen your words, verbal or digital, through these evidences of God's wisdom before you release them:
 - 1. Pure. Has spiritual integrity and moral sincerity (*Psalm 24:3,4; 51:7, Matthew 5:8, Romans 7:22,23, Hebrews 12:14*).
 - 2. Peaceable. Peace loving, peace promoting (Matthew 5:9).
 - **3. Gentle.** Moderation without compromise, kindness without weakness. Does not deliberately cause fights, but neither does he compromise the truth in order to keep peace (*Matthew 5:10-11*).
 - 4. Open to reason. Agreeable and easy to live with (*Matthew 5:3–5*). Willing to hear all sides of a question, but does not compromise his own convictions. Can disagree without being disagreeable (*James 1:19*).
 - **5. Full of mercy**. Concern for those who suffer pain and hardship, and the ability to forgive quickly (*Matthew 5:7, Romans12:8*).
 - Impartial. Consistent and undivided in conviction, and does not make unfair distinctions.
 - 7. **Sincere**. Has openness and honesty. Religious politics is an abomination to God. Faith is living without scheming.
- The outcome of a tongue that blesses rather than curses, makes all the effort worth it: a harvest of righteousness! Whose? Both yours and of those that you chose to bless rather than curse (*James 1:20, Matthew 5:9*).

FINAL THOUGHTS

One of the sins God especially hates is to "sow discord among brothers" (*Proverbs 6:19*). Imagine how widespread, irreversible and permanent discord becomes when we misuse social media, instead of doing things God's way (*Matthew 18:15-17, 21-35*). God's righteous judgment will not be far behind.

Let's only use our tongue (verbal and digital) to bless, not curse, by using God's wisdom. As we do, He takes care of blessing us according to His perfect will and time ■

▼ he chaos of life so easily pulls us in all directions. A new year has begun, and usually we associate this time for a good start. It is a kingdom of love and justice that is stronger than any forces of evil that seems to rule the land.

As we are being transformed into Jesus' likeness, the Spirit leads us out from an isolated and private spirituality into the community of faith. We move from that simple gathering around the name of Jesus into living out His way.

Let us make every effort, then, to desire God's righteousness as we look for opportunities to stand by and stand with the weak and broken. Let us find our place in the heart of God, knowing that He rules above the chaos. As we do so, may we be quick to extend the same grace through the kind of strength and love Jesus showed: touching the untouchable lepers, forgiving the unforgivable adulteress, and sharing the table with sinners

THE GOSPEL

"Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."

(1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD

God is holy and righteous: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty, the whole earth is full of his glory" (*Isaiah 6:3*). **He requires holiness of us as well:** "Be holy, for I am holy" (*1 Peter 1:16*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT MAN

Man is sinful: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (*Romans 3:23*). Sin demands a penalty: "For the wages of sin is death" (*Romans 6:23*).

THE TRUTH ABOUT CHRIST

Christ is the expression of God's love for us: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). Christ paid the penalty of our sins and died for sinners: "For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God" (1 Peter 3:18). against them" (2 Corinthians 5:18). WHAT SHOULD WF DO?

Believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (*Romans 10:9*).

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. I believe that you died on the cross in my place, to save me from my sins, and I accept you as my Savior, and the Master of my life forever. Amen.
