Simplicity

TODAY'S MESSAGE 12 JULY 2020 | MARK 10:17-22

Do you want to follow the Lord?

Are you free to leave now?

"Many desire to follow Christ, few pack for the journey, fewer still leave their comforts." Christian Simplicity is living our lives in such a way that we'd be free to say yes to God anytime, anywhere, and at any cost.

1. Dis-ease

Think about these four words:

- 1. Rich: The man was both materially and morally rich.
- 2. Young: The man had the blessing of time and energy.
- 3. Male: His gender afforded him opportunities inaccessible to women.
- 4. Ruler: He was a man of great influence and reputation.

¹⁷And as he was setting out on his journey, a man <u>ran up</u> and <u>knelt before him</u> and asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" (MARK 10:17)

Despite of all that he had, there was a profound dis-ease in his heart. For a man like him to run up to Jesus and kneel before him, his concern must've been of great urgency and desperation.

The young man lacked the one thing that would make his life worth something—without that one thing, everything means nothing.

2. Decision

In order to receive the one thing he lacks, the young man had to do one thing, but that one thing would cost him everything.

¹⁸And Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good except God alone. ¹⁹You know the commandments: 'Do not murder, Do not commit adultery, Do not steal, Do not bear false witness, Do not defraud, Honor your father and mother.'" ²⁰And he said to him, "Teacher, all these I have kept from my youth." (MARK 10:18-20)

- The Rich Young Man was not living an (overtly) sinful life, his problem was that he was living a very encumbered life. "Disheartened by the saying, he went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions." (MARK 10:22)
- A lot of times, we say "no" to God for fear that His call for simplicity would lead us to a life of misery. What we don't understand is that, it is precisely our refusal to obey Him that is causing sorrow to enter our lives.

Do not walk away disheartened.

(Four questions to ask ourselves)

- 1. Is God good?
- 2. Does Jesus love you?
- 3. Are you good to go?
- 4. Will you walk away?
- 5. Is Jesus Lord? ■
