

Your Worthy Mediator: The Compassionate Son of God

Today's Message (6 September 2020) / Hebrews 4:15-5:10

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TRIALS WE
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What is the function of a High Priest? To serve as mediator between God and man. Specifically, he is appointed by God "to act on behalf of men in relation to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins" (HEBREWS 5:1).

To prepare ourselves for Worship through Communion, we look at one of the key things the Lord Jesus accomplished as mediator on our behalf through His suffering and death, the very thing we commemorate and celebrate today:

1. JESUS CHRIST IS YOUR COMPASSIONATE MEDIATOR: GO TO HIM (4:15-16).

- "...tempted as we are, yet without sin". Who
 understands suffering better: the person who when
 tortured gives up and tells everything, or the person
 who resists despite continuing torture? We, who
 give in to temptation so easily, cannot even guess
 how strong temptation can be. Jesus, who never gave
 in. knows.
- "Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace". God calls you to come confidently before His throne to receive mercy and grace through Jesus Christ (Hebrews 10:22). Prayer is the best way by which we approach God. We reach out beyond ourselves, and look to Him in our time of need; and—mystery of mysteries—our seeking His presence is as much desired by God as it is needed by us.

2. JESUS CHRIST IS YOUR WORTHY MEDIATOR: GO THROUGH HIM (5:1-6).

• To "deal gently" means to manage your feelings to avoid the extremes of self-righteous anger and depressing sadness. For a human high priest, sympathy grew out of an awareness that he was prone to his own failures. If you've had struggles and setbacks, hurts and failures, once you turn those over to the Lord, you'll have compassion on people you wouldn't have otherwise (2 CORINTHIANS 1:3-7).

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• Jesus was "without sin" (4:15), and is "a priest forever" (5:6). His priestly task is to create an order of salvation that is valid forever, making human priests obsolete. It is foolish to return to the inferiority of human priests when we can enjoy the superiority of Jesus Christ. Jesus, the great High Priest is superior to all other mediators (ACTS 4:12, 1 TIMOTHY 2:5).

3. JESUS CHRIST IS LORD: GROW IN HIM (5:7-10).

- **He became compassionate through suffering** (vv. 7, 8). Though He was the Son of God (v. 8), Jesus was tempted to swerve from the will of His Father because of the suffering involved. But in His most intense moment of prayer, Jesus shows us that the purpose of prayer is not to get God to do what we want. It's to get us in harmony with what God wants. When we get in harmony with what God wants, you ultimately find it's what you needed all along.
- He became worthy by divine appointment (vv. 9, 10). To be "made perfect" means "made complete". By His suffering, Jesus Christ was equipped for His heavenly ministry as our compassionate High Priest. Jesus is now the "Source" of deliverance from the power and presence of sin for Christians who want to live obediently. All the resources made available through Christ's priestly activities make a Christian's life of obedience possible (Hebrews 7:25).

FINAL THOUGHTS

Jesus experienced the ultimate in suffering and is therefore able to sympathize with us when we are suffering. No matter what trials we meet, Jesus Christ is able to understand our needs and help us. We must never doubt His ability to sympathize and strengthen.

What then? "Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need" (HEBREWS 4:16) ■

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. Why can we confidently say that for true Christians, the throne of God is a throne of grace, not a throne of judgment?
- Among many reasons, give at least one reason why Jesus is superior to all other mediators and human priests, and therefore the only mediator God accepts. Explain your answer.
- 3. Pray together as a family/group, and if there is anyone among yourselves needing to be assured either of forgiveness (mercy) or God's care (grace) intercede for them before the Lord, or better, let them tell God in prayer what their need is, being assured they come before His throne of grace.
