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The Only Priest God Wants for Us

Today's Message (06 December 2020) / Hebrews 7

This is the meaning of our Communion – we commemorate with gratitude Jesus' sacrifice, and we celebrate with excitement His imminent return and leading us at His table again!

For Christians today, Jesus is the only Priest God wants for us because no one else qualifies. No other intercessor has done, or will ever do what He has done. So whether we talk about a High Priest or lesser priests; or priests ranked by any other system (bishop, archbishop, cardinal, etc.) none of them are required by God today. The passages at the heart of Hebrews, chapters 7 to 10:18 will explain why.

Our particular passage, chapter 7, shows that Jesus is the ultimate, final, and last priest ever needed because of the superior nature of His priesthood:

MELCHIZEDEK: THE PRIESTLY PROTOTYPE OF JESUS

 Jesus's priesthood is based on the "Order" of Melchizedek, not of Levi (7:1–10). This mysterious figure (probably human) is a prototype, a foreshadowing of the nature of the priesthood of Jesus. He is proof that the Levitical priesthood was temporary.

JESUS: THE POWERFUL AND PERFECT PRIEST OF GOD

- His priesthood is powerful and supersedes all other priesthoods (7:11–19) vv. 16, 19 "... a priest, not on the basis of a legal requirement concerning bodily descent, but by the power of an indestructible life... (for the law made nothing perfect); but on the other hand, a better hope is introduced, through which we draw near to God."
- His priesthood is pre-eminent because God affirmed it with an oath (7:20-22)
 v. 21 "The Lord has sworn and will not change his mind, 'You are a priest forever.'
- His priesthood is permanent because He lives forever (7:23-25)

v. 25 "Consequently, He is able to save to the uttermost those who draw near to God through him, since He always lives to make intercession for them." COMMUNION SERIES ON HEBREWS: THE SUPREMACY OF CHRIST AND CHRISTIANITY

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• His priesthood is perfect because it involved a once and for all time personal sacrifice (7:26–28)

v. 28 "He has no need, like those high priests, to offer sacrifices daily, first for his own sins and then for those of the people, since he did this once for all when he offered up himself."

What are the implications of these truths for us?

- There is only one priest God wants for us, the only One whom God will ever accept. "He ever lives to make intercession" for us.
- There is only one intercessor and mediator acceptable to God. No other member of the human race qualifies or will ever qualify. Not even the family members of Jesus.
- There is only one way to God by faith alone, in Christ alone therefore by grace alone. God "made Him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God." (2 Corinthians 5:21)

Final Thoughts

This is the meaning of our Communion – we commemorate with gratitude Jesus' sacrifice, and we celebrate with excitement His imminent return and leading us at His table again!

Is Jesus indeed the only mediator for you, the only object of your trust when it comes to being forgiven and accepted by God? Or is it Jesus plus... your good works? Another mediator? Your religion or religiosity? Any combination of these?

Before you partake of the elements, may the Word of God speak to your heart to affirm your continuing faith, or to revive your faltering heart, maybe even bring you for the first time to the Cross and the salvation of Christ. ■

Discussion Questions:

- 1. According to Hebrews 7, why is any other human system of priesthood now unnecessary?
- 2. What does Hebrews 7:25 reveal about the exclusivity and effectivity of Christ's mediation? What does this imply about any other mediator that men propose or believe in besides Christ?
- 3. Pray together, and ask God to reveal to your gathered hearts that our High Priest, the only One whom God will accept, continues to intercede for us in heaven and will be with us in the hardest and most difficult times of our lives now, then guarantees our entry into heaven.

I am grateful for this prospect of continuing to serve the church and for the generous support of GCF. I am praying for the Lord's hand on it.

Kindly, remember me and my family in your prayers as we seek God in the coming days. Pray for me too that the last few months in my current role would be purposeful and meaningful.
