



# The Ghost Who Removes All Fear

Ephesians 1:13-14

# The Ghost Who Removes All Fear

**EPHESIANS 1:13-14** 

If, like me, you were raised in the King James Version, the term "Holy Ghost" is familiar to you, because this translation uses the phrase 89 times. Providentially, all modern translations now use the modern word "Spirit" in lieu of the old English "ghost".

Best of all, instead of causing fear, the Holy Spirit's presence is the best antidote to fear, because "God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control" (2 Timothy 1:7). This is still part of the many spiritual blessings all believers have "in Christ". So, who is the Holy Spirit? What is His role in the life of a believer? How important is this truth for us?

# 1. Because you are sealed with the Holy Spirit, you are known to God and are protected by God.

Ephesians 1:13, "In Him you also... were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit."

- a) This sealing is dependent on genuine conversion, so the process is described: "...when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in Him". Have you heard the Word of truth, the Good News, and believed in Christ?
- b) This sealing bestows the following blessings:
  - You are identified forever as a child of God (Romans 8:9, 16)
    "Sealing" refers to an official mark of identification. To be sealed
    with the Spirit means that the very presence of the Holy Spirit in
    you is your identification as a child of God. This means
    God claims you as His own. When people panic about the "Mark
    of the Beast", they realize that the God who owns you will never let
    you walk around with two different IDs. It cannot happen. Not
    even in error. God takes care of His own and protects them from
    even ignorant mistakes.
  - You are protected and secured forever as a child of God Anyone who is against you would have to go through God Himself! John 14:16-17 proves that the Holy Spirit abides with the Christian forever. We can grieve the Spirit (*Ephesians 4:30*). But He will never abandon us.



## 2. Because the Holy Spirit is God's downpayment on His promised spiritual blessings (Ephesians 1:3), you will receive all of the inheritance that God promised His people.

Ephesians 1:14, "who is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it..."

- a) The word "guarantee" refers to earnest money, or the first installment of a larger amount that will be fully paid out. God literally guarantees to keep His promise to bless you with every spiritual blessing in Christ! In view of this:
  - Let's stop thinking that our enjoyment of God is only for the future. We can enjoy a preview of heaven right now through intimacy with God enabled by His Spirit.
  - Let's stop thinking that our present experience of God's favor is all there is. This is just the first installment, a foretaste of the best that is yet to be!
- b) Why does the Holy Spirit do all of this for us? All of this is being done "to the praise of [God's] glory".

### **FINAL THOUGHTS**

Ephesians 1:3-14 shows us the irreversible election of the Father, the irreversible redemption of the Son and now the irreversible indwelling of the Holy Spirit. And 2 Corinthians 1:22 affirms that God "has anointed us, and who has also put His seal on us and given us His Spirit in our hearts as a guarantee".

How then should we live? 2 Timothy 2:19 shows us the way: But God's firm foundation stands, bearing this seal: "The Lord knows those who are His," and, "Let everyone who names the Name of the Lord depart from iniquity."

### **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. With all the talk today about the mark of the beast, why is it not possible for a genuine Christian to receive it?
- 2. What Biblical truth ensures that will the Holy Spirit never leave even if we grieve him? (John 14:16-17)
- 3. What attitude found in Paul makes it easier to understand that a Christian's life on earth can really become a preview of heaven? (Philippians 3:7-10)
- 4. As you pray together, thank God for how He has sealed you forever with His Spirit, and pray that God enables you to live a life that proves you are His through a lifelong desire to be free from sin (2 Timothy 2:19).
