The Essence of Faith **Has Never Changed**

HEBREWS 11:23-31

Did Moses and the Israelites believe differently than we do? Are we saved like they were, or are we getting something wrong? Let these short narratives in the era of Moses assure or instruct you about faith and how it all leads back to Christ:

1. THE FAITH OF MOSES' PARENTS (Hebrews 11:23)

• Faith in God made Moses' parents unafraid of a tyrant and made them discern their son was no ordinary child.

• Faith continues to trust long after fear has made others give up. And what matters most is the right object of faith – God Himself. But what do you do when your faith is small? Here's a valid prayer, "I do believe! Help me overcome my unbelief!" (Mark 9:24, NIV)

2. THE FAITH OF MOSES (Hebrews 11:24-28)

 How did Moses' faith show itself? Through radical choices: suffering with the oppressed people of God rather than sinning with the oppressors; choosing disgrace for the sake of the Messiah over the wealth of Egypt; leaving the king despite violent threats, and obeying a seemingly bizarre command.


How could Moses do this? Because he chose the eternal over the temporal (the Messiah and eternal rewards) and lived conscious of the reality of God (Hebrews 11:1, 6).

• Faith is demonstrated most of the time in our daily routines, living conscious of the unseen God. But sometimes, it is tested and shown in our radical choices: choosing to suffer than to sin, choosing insults for the Messiah over the influx of money, or deciding to go against the flow because God said so. May God enable us to have faith for those times!

3. THE FAITH OF GOD'S PEOPLE (Hebrews 11:29-30)

• Like leader, like people! We become like those who lead us. The people's faith was strengthened as Moses and Joshua showed faith in God; and God always came through.

"Remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God. Consider the outcome of their way of life, and imitate their faith." (Hebrews 13:7)

4. THE FAITH OF A PROSTITUTE (Hebrews 11:31)

- Rahab showed saving faith in a simple, heartfelt declaration: "...for the LORD your God, He is God in the heavens above and on the earth beneath" (Joshua 2:11b). This faith, verified later by actions, saved her. By this, she became the first recorded Gentile convert in the Bible!
- When we come to Christ, the slate is wiped clean. Rahab was no longer an unclean prostitute but worthy of becoming an ancestor of Jesus Himself. In her life, all of us sinners saved by grace, can see ourselves. In her story, we see the amazing grace of God that saves even the worst of sinners and brings them into an abundant life with Christ.


FINAL THOUGHTS

In Moses' time and ours, the essence of faith has never changed. Faith believes in God and His promises, which are all fulfilled in Jesus.

Faith is looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith (Hebrews 12:2), who gives both instructions about faith and enablement for faith through the Holy Spirit. All this was made possible through His finished work on the Cross, whose significance we celebrate with every Communion.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- Share about a time when fear almost made you give up on something you shouldn't, but faith in God made you go on. What can others possibly learn from your experience?
- 2. Read Psalm 84:11-12. What one thing qualifies what God gives (or withholds) to those who walk with Him and trust in Him? How does this connect with Romans 8:28?
- 3. The beautiful story of Rahab's redemption mirrors the same experience for many of us. Even for those born and raised in a Christian family, salvation gave us countless blessings we can be thankful for. What is one of the things you are most grateful to God about concerning your salvation from sin?
- 4. As you close in prayer, worship God together as you go around until everyone has said a short prayer just praising God for His saving grace through Jesus Christ. Close by praying for people in your Oikos who do not yet know Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

PRAISE GOD FOR THE RESUMPTION OF ON-SITE WORSHIP


It is a great blessing to resume on-site worship after the lockdown forced us to stop three times in the past. The government's announcement that we are now on Alert Level 2 opens even more possibilities for us. Here are the exact wordings from the IATF:

"The following establishments, or activities, shall be allowed to operate, or be undertaken at a **maximum of 50% indoor venue capacity for fully vaccinated individuals only and those below 18 years of age, even if unvaccinated, and 70% outdoor venue capacity.** Provided that all workers/ employees of these establishments are fully vaccinated against COVID-19, and MPHS shall be strictly maintained."

Given this, kindly allow us to remind you of these essential details:


- 1. The requirement for only fully vaccinated individuals to worship indoors is a government requirement. Please rest assured that GCF is not discriminating against unvaccinated individuals.
- 2. While I am fully vaccinated and was never infected, and though it's extremely difficult, I will wear a mask while preaching to allay concerns I will spread the virus. The feedback that "you inspire fear rather than faith by wearing a mask onstage" might return, but it's okay.


